LETTER OF THE MONTH

s a long time shooter who's come back to the sport with much enthusiasm, I decided as I was having a very special birthday during lockdown, I would treat myself with the assistance of my wife to a new Beretta 694.

I put the order in and sooner than expected my new sporter had arrived. At point of purchase I noticed my license had less than 12 months to run. I investigated the times and process for renewal, not wanting to be separated from my new acquisition for any reason in the future. Unfortunately, my licensing authority had one of the worst processing times, 16 weeks were reported through an internet search and also some new requirements had been added to the process:

- 1. I would need to obtain a medical record via a printable GP report, which could involve a charge.
- I would need to print off a record form of all occupants at my property, and finally,
- 3. I would have to renew my reference by printing off a form for my referee to complete.

My license was due to expire on 17 June 2021, a letter arrived in the post from Greater Manchester Police 27 January 2021. It stated all these new requirements and also emphasised the importance of submitting the application at least 8 weeks prior to the renewal date. Failure to do so may result in the need to lodge the guns until the certificate was renewed as no extensions or temporary permits were to be granted.

I recalled five years ago the authority issued temporary licenses due to a backlog in processing licenses.

Not wanting to be caught by this process I set about completing my renewal the following day. I asked myself was I being over cautious, perhaps? However filling forms in can be a pain and easily forgotten.

Luckily the process could be completed via the internet or by post. I chose internet, I forwarded the GP form to my doctors and the reference form directly to my referee. Occupants list I could complete online. The doctor agreed to complete the form for a £20 donation and filled in the form that same day he received it. It was made apparent that some surgeries may charge and some wouldn't complete the form at all due to workloads.

I discovered that specialist surgeries would complete this form remotely for an extra charge and advertise their services in the magazines and online.

The hard work was done, I went online and completed the renewal application form, the final page being the £49 renewal payment which was done by credit card. All completed within a couple of days and registered 2 Feb 2021.

All I had to do now was make sure I'd completed it correctly and wait.

April arrived and we were eight weeks from renewal date, curiosity got the better of me and I rang the office to see if all was on track. Having submitted just my D.O.B. to the person who answered I was informed all was well and online for 17/6/21 renewal.

A week later I received a letter from the Firearms Licensing Unit, unfortunately it would not be possible to decide my application before my certificate expires. Fortunately as I had submitted my application eight weeks or more before expiry I could continue to use my existing license for another eight weeks, as provided by Section 28B of the Firearms Act 1968 until 12 August 2021. This in turn, if accepted for renewal would add to the next five years of my license. One action in the renewal process which has been removed temporarily is the home inspection due to staff and Covid 19.

Other authorities are probably suffering from staff shortages and similar admin problems.

Hopefully this helps emphasise the need to complete renewals ASAP, and some of the new hurdles to jump to complete

the form. – Howard T Kershaw

THE CONFIDENCE TO WIN

BYWELL DTLVEEKEND

Richard Faulks reports from the events at the DTL weekend at Bywell Shooting Ground 11-13 June 2021.

> ywell Shooting Ground once again hosted the DTL Sponsored Day, Dougall Memorial Championship, and CPSA English Open DTL Championship, between the 11-13 June, thanks to generous sponsorship from Eley Hawk and Swatcom. Bywell is renowned for its DTL layouts - the targets are consistently presented and the uncluttered distant horizon to the north provides the perfect background and lighting conditions for easy target acquisition. The

ground is just a couple of miles off the A1 between Morpeth and Alnwick in Northumberland's beautiful countryside - it's certainly not Englands most central shooting ground, but it's a testament to the quality of the ground and events that three hundred plus entrants made the journey to shoot these prestigious events each day on the weekend, and two hundred and forty entered the Sponsored shoot on the Friday.

The weather for all three days was sunny and warm, but a strong and gusty wind did have a part to play in making the shooting challenging! Friday's Sponsored Day saw Tom Robinson take high gun with a 99/297, which was a

fine effort in the conditions. There was a shoot-off to decide second and third, between Nick McKeown and Emma Holden, which Nick managed to take to hold the runner-up spot. The Dougall Memorial Cup was contested on the Saturday, and is clay shooting's oldest trophy - first awarded in 1896. So it's a cup that any trap shooter would be honoured to have their name on! There was some fine shooting on the day, but Paul Turner was 'on fire' and his 100/300 would not be matched and took the prize, with Philip Morgan taking second and Dan Price taking third place. Many said of Paul Turner's round that it was the finest show of trap shooting they'd ever seen, with every target convincingly broken.

Robert Clarke posted a 100/299 on Sunday morning to take the top spot on the leader board for the English Open, and with the gusty wind looked to be a score that would be hard to beat. Seventeen Doble was next on the board with 100/298 at lunchtime. He'd shot in the first squad on each of the days and had won the Junior prize in the Dougall Memorial and also first place on Sponsored Day for A Class and the Juniors, so he's clearly a name to watch over the coming years. Cory thought that the wind on the Sunday morning was lighter than the previous days and blowing from left to right, so it was affecting the targets less than on the previous days. The previous days had the wind either straight into

the shooters' faces or on their backs - causing the targets to lift or drop. After lunch the wind turned ninety degrees and started to blow directly down-range and affected the targets for the later squads. The targets were far less predictable and either flew straight or were buffeted by the unpredictable gusts and pushed down. Robert Clarke's 100/299 was looking even harder to beat! I followed a few of the squads along the four courses and even the big names were finding

the going tough. I caught up with Paul Chaplow BEM after his round and he told me, "I dropped a target very early

than I have to be honest with you. The target quality has been very, very good. I'll just have to lick my wounds and come back next year." As the day progressed, Philip Morgan managed to match Cory Doble's score to force a shoot-off. But the biggest shock of the tournament was about to be sprung by Daniel Hudson. Daniel was shooting in one of the last squads and only took up shooting seriously three months previously. He'd shot a few pigeons when he was a lot younger and then

hadn't shot for quite a few years. Believe it or not, he managed to shoot a perfect 100/300 for his very first time.

2021 CPSA WORLD ENGLISH SPORTING AND SPORTRAP CHAMPIONSHIPS

MUSTO SWATCOM SRIZZINI GAMEBORE WELEY FSA TEAGUE PROMATIC

Hosted at E.J. Churchill Shooting Ground from 5-11 July. Never mind the football, there was real drama on the lawn at West Wycombe as the week-long festival of shooting reached its climax. **James Marchington** reports.



ark Winser was crowned 2021 CPSA English Sporting World Champion after winning a nailbiting Super Final in front of a hushed crowd against the backdrop of the stunning stately home and grounds of West

Park, home of Sir Edward Dashwood.

It was the culmination of the CPSA World English Sporting Championships, a full week's festival of shooting at the E.J. Churchill Shooting Ground in Buckinghamshire. The victory was extra sweet for Mark, who lost out to Richard Bunning in a suddendeath shoot-off for the World Champion title on the same turf in 2018. Mark has a long history of championship wins, but has never before lifted the CPSA World English Sporting trophy.

His achievement was even more notable as he has not long recovered from a potentially career-ending shoulder injury sustained on 1st April 2019. "It was a rocky road going through that, so what a nice reward to be able to come back and win the World Championships a little more than a year later," he said. "That's in the past now. I'm rebuilt, screwed back

together, so it's all good!" To qualify for his place in

the six-man Super Final, Mark shot a score of 190ex200 over the two courses earlier in the week. That put him in fourth place, behind James Bradley-Day on 192, and Martin Myers and Mark Webster tied in second place on 191.

A shoot-off was needed to decide the last two places in the Super Final. Nathan Skinner, John Lee, and Steve Brightwell had tied on 188ex200. Nathan and Steve won through, and the stage was set for a gripping battle for the title.

After some glorious weather through the week, it was perhaps inevitable that the skies would open as the final six took the stand, but that didn't deter the crowd of spectators who had gathered despite the impending England v Italy Euro 2020 final.

The six carried their scores with them into the final, so Mark had some catching up to do, but he started strongly, dropping just one target on the first stand, while James Bradley-Day saw his lead slip away as he missed three of his first eight targets.

It was far from over, though, as Mark Webster straighted his first stand and Martin Myers dropped just two. The next stand saw James drop out of the running, and despite a strong finish he couldn't recover, ending with 207, while Steve Brightwell and Nathan Skinner never really looked like catching the leaders.

At the finish it came down to the two Marks, Winser and Webster, with just one target separating the two. Webster was still in the game to the bitter end, but missed his final pair to hand Winser the title as the crowd erupted with applause and shouts of congratulation.

One of the first to congratulate Mark was James Bradley-Day, who had shot the top score on the two 100-target courses, Rizzini and Gamebore, with targets set by E.J. Churchill's Jamie Peckham and Sean Bramley. "I'm really pleased with how I performed over the two days: 97/100 on the red course followed by a 95/100 on the blue," he commented. "Unfortunately this time the

Super Final didn't go my way. Things finished very close but again it ended with 1st in AAA. Congratulations to Mark Winser on a exceptional performance and a well deserved 2021 World ESP championship title!" He added: "It's been a big learning curve but sometimes it just comes down to

experience and that's something I've gained this week." Mark agreed that he had felt the pressure in the Super Final. "You always do. If you didn't feel pressure you wouldn't perform," he said. "Some people fold under it, I don't. I feel like it just pushes me that little bit more.

As Mark was presented with the trophy that had eluded him last time, the light was failing and rain teeming down – but that didn't dampen anyone's spirits. It was a

fitting end to a terrific week of shooting, and everyone was thrilled to be back at a proper international championship after a year of cancellations and postponements due to the Covid pandemic of 2020. The pandemic is still

far from over, of course, and as a consequence the usual contingent of Americans and other shooters from around the world were missing from this year's Championship. "It's sad that the Americans aren't here," agreed Mark. "I've been chatting with some of them on the phone over the past week. We always like seeing them

and it's good to do battle with them. We were fortunate in 2018 for those guys to come over and shoot alongside us. We'll just have to look

forward to next

year when hopefully we can join them over there, and I'm sure we will." Despite international travel restrictions, the home countries were able to field the usual teams, and it was good to see the Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland and England teams take part in the traditional parade through the vibrant trade village on the lawn beside the imposing E.J. Churchill clubhouse at the heart of the shooting ground. 🕨



The trade village and patio area buzzed throughout the seven days of the event, with food stalls, a huge TV screen showing the tennis action at Wimbledon, the splendid E.J. Churchill pavilion, and trade stands including the sponsors who made the Championships possible: Musto, SWATCOM, Rizzini, Gamebore, Eley, Teague Precision Chokes, Fine Shooting Accessories, and supported by Promatic.

Shooters booked in at the CPSA desk in the clubhouse, and were called by squad to catch the minibus service that ferried them to the start of each course. On completing their course, the same minibuses whisked them back to the clubhouse, where they could relax, chat with friends and try the variety of tempting food on offer. The CPSA's new Shoot system was in operation, with scores going live on the CPSA website as they were entered at the clubhouse.

The organisation ran smoothly throughout the week, with squads starting their shooting on time or even a little ahead, and moving through the course with no delays. It was a tribute to everyone working behind the scenes, not least the E.J. Churchill team, the CPSA back-office staff, and the team from Promatic traps who provided technical support throughout to keep the clays flying.

A big competition like this creates much more than one champion of course, and for those in the various categories the places and trophies are just as valued. George Digweed, for instance, was delighted to claim his 27th World Championship title, as Veterans World Champion. Steve Brightwell took the title in Super Veterans, Amy Easeman in Lady Juniors, Cheryl Hall in Ladies, Will Fenner in Juniors, Alasdair Turnbull in Colts, Mark Delf in Disabled Standing and Adrian Last Disabled Sitting -World Champions all!


England dominated the team events, taking the Senior, Ladies, Juniors, and Super-Veterans categories, only being beaten into second place by Wales in the Veterans category.

Nathan Hales and Steve Scott were also very much in touch on 74ex75 for equal second place, but the odd target dropped on day two put them just out of the running. However, the team made the bronze medal match, losing out to Croatia who put in a strong performance.

BRITISH OPEN ENGLISH SPORTING PREVIEW

The CPSA British Open English Sporting and Sportrap is returning to the North of England from 1-5 September, at a new venue: E.J. Churchill at the Swinton Estate.

he newest E.J. Churchill ground is set in the picturesque Yorkshire Dales, an area worth visiting even if there wasn't a worldclass shooting event taking place. Situated on the site of the previous Warren Gill Shooting Ground, it has recently undergone a huge

investment program from E.J. Churchill, with developments to the clubhouse, shooting grounds, and facilities.

Jamie Peckham from E.J. Churchill and Tom Jones from West Midlands Shooting Ground will be setting the targets at the ground, and with the Dales' terrain featuring on the course it is sure to be a unique experience in the recent history of the British Open English Sporting.

The English Sporting course will consist of 120 targets and will be shot from Wednesday to Saturday, with the top five shooters from each class (AAA, AA, A, B, and C) and the top three from each category (Ladies, Veterans, Juniors, and Colts) from each day being invited to compete in the final on Sunday. The scores will be reset to zero for the Final, and a new 75-target course will be shot.

James Atwood is the defending Sportrap hampion, taking the tle at Garlands after a noot-off with Richard Faulds MBE and John Lee Last year's British Open at Garlands Shooting Ground (hosted by The Clay Shooting Company) saw David Ferriman from Sporting Targets take the title, following a rainy Super Final shoot-off (pictured) where he beat renowned shooter George Digweed <u>MBE</u>

by one clay. David nearly didn't shoot the championship last year, but was encouraged to come along by his boss, Andrew Clifton of Sporting Targets shooting ground. David's not planning to miss it this year, and is already booked to shoot on the Friday.

Musto, Rizzini, SWATCOM, Gamebore, Teague Precision Chokes, and Fine Shooting Accessories will be sponsoring the event, which is also supported by Promatic

ON THE MARCH

In this series **Rhys Plum** speaks to some of Britain's finest Junior shooters to find out what it is like being a high performing young shot. In this second instalment, we hear from two top Sporting shots, **Darcy McBride** and **Dan King**.

fter winning Colts at the CPSA English Open English Sporting in 2019, Dan has gone from strength to strength, and with his new Rizzini in hand, he believes he can go all the way. Having started shooting at 11 years old, he soon found his way in the sport under the careful guidance of Kevin Howland and the support of his family and sponsors.

"I shot my first round of clays at Greenfields in Kent, where I also met my mentor, Kevin, who I have been shooting with ever since. In the beginning, I would try to get out as much as possible to learn my craft, shooting about 300 clays in a weekend – split between practice and competition. I now shoot about 100 Registered targets a week to build up my experience in competition and

to see as many different target presentations as possible; this includes both Sporting and Sportrap disciplines. You have to be mentally strong and dedicated to the sport in order to see real

improvements in your scores." Clearly that hard work and dedication does pay off, as that 2019 English Open English Sporting Colts victory demonstrated. "After a tricky shoot around West Midlands Shooting Ground, there were three Colts all tied on 96/120. This led

to a gruelling three-way shoot-off in front of the clubhouse against Darcy and Tristan Hockey. At this point in my career, I hadn't experienced pressure and excitement like this. Walking to the stand my nerves were jangling, but I knew if I could put into practice everything I had already done to get here, I would be happy. As I was first to shoot I was shown the two targets – a rising teal at

40 yards and on-report a looping battue from the right. After breaking my gun after the last pair, I was happy to walk out of the stand with 5/10, which wasn't matched. Winning an event like the English was a brilliant experience and has spurred me on to aim higher, as I one day hope to shoot for my country."

DARCY MCBRIDE

Hailing from Hertfordshire, Darcy explained how he came into the sport: "I first started shotgun shooting at the age of 12 with my coach, Phillip Thorrold. I come from a family of passionate shooters and before picking

up a shotgun I would shoot air rifles around the garden and go 'plinking' in the nearby farmyards. There's no doubt I inherited my father's love of the outdoors and competitive nature, and we regularly compete with each other, whether that be in the pigeon hide or in a game of snooker.

"I've shot with Phillip ever since I began and have always appreciated his dedication to the sport and his students.

The first few competitions I shot were in The Schools Challenge (TSC) at the Oxford Gun Company in 2017. Having completed a year of these competitions, I realised shooting was something I wanted to get good

at. Back then, my training routine was much more relaxed and would often be focused on game, but after a taste of success at the TSC, my desire to train and improve grew. And so, with the goal to get to the top of the game, and eventually win a World Championship, my training routine has evolved. I now shoot about 500 cartridges with Phillip each month, as well as at least 100 Registered targets a week. My volume of shooting increases during the holidays,

> as throughout the rest of the year I have to balance schoolwork, Saturday school and shooting, which can sometimes be tricky.

On that note, I am incredibly grateful to my mum for always supporting me, driving me around the country, and to my father for everything he has done for me. It can be a frustrating sport. With competition amongst young shots rising across the country, efforts can sometimes seem

unrewarded, as it takes a lot to get a little back in this sport. I would argue that about 70 percent of shooting is all to do with the mental game, as once you've learnt how to hit every target, your success is then a result of your ability to be consistent and to focus your mind to hit every single target and not miss the silly ones. Becoming a good shooter not only takes a lot of training, but also a good mental attitude, as it's not an easy journey. Nonetheless, I was over the moon when all of my hard work and dedication paid off last year and I won Juniors at the British Open.

I am also proud to say I am a member of the first CPSA Colts Development Initiative and as part of that I am fortunate enough to get to shoot with a number of top-class coaches and enjoy support from the CPSA, Musto, Rizzini, Solware,



as well as several premier shooting grounds. Most recently I shot with a few of the other members of the programme at High Lodge Shooting Ground, with shooting legend John Bidwell providing a day's coaching. I learnt a lot from this day and look forward to future coaching days.

"I place total faith in all of my gear and having picked up a sponsorship from Lyalvale Express earlier this year, I am proud to represent them and shoot their Super Comp in a 28g 7 1/2. They immediately stood out to me, not only because they are a good-looking shell, but because they also pack a hell of a punch and produce the best breaks I could find. And who doesn't like turning clays into balls of soot? I recently changed the model of gun I shoot and am now competing with a Beretta 690 Sporting with 30" barrels and a perfectly fitting stock thanks to the hard work of Charlie, the gunsmith at my local ground, Atkin Grant and Lang. Along with my gun and cartridges, I carry around a few snacks - protein bars are a favourite of mine – and a drink to keep me hydrated throughout the round. Hydration is something that I think can be neglected at times but is essential, especially when shooting in the summer heat."

YOUNG SHOTS By Archy Stannard

HOW I GOT STARTED IN SHOOTING

've always shot since I was a little kid. I started with a .410 shooting cardboard boxes in my grandad's garden. I really enjoyed it, so about five years ago he decided to take me clay shooting at my local ground, Eriswell Lodge. We would go up there more and more and I fell in love with the sport.

When I started, I used to shoot all disciplines - ranging from Skeet to FITASC, but about three years ago we

decided I should focus on English skeet as my scores were strong and gradually climbing. This is when I stopped all other disciplines and really started to take shooting seriously.

FAVOURITE SHOOTING MOMENT

This is a tough one! My most memorable moment shooting would have to be in 2019 when I travelled to Ireland to shoot for England. It was the first time I tried to qualify and was not expecting to get in. I shot 198/200 and a 195/200 which left me second Overall in Juniors. Putting that red jacket on really gives you a sense of pride that I had never felt before.



I am lucky to have the support of my family, and to have a great British FITASC Team Captain as my coach and my grandad all in one! If that isn't luck then I don't know what is! Without these people in my life I wouldn't be where I am today. They come and support me at every single shoot I do, weather it's in this country or not. These people know who they are so thank you from the bottom of my heart!

SHOOTING 100-STRAIGHT AT THE 2020 BRITISH OPEN SKEET AND COMING THIRD OVERALL



When I went to the British Open in 2020 I was hoping to win, but what happened was just amazing. I started on 25/25 so I knew it was going to be a good day. The feeling I had when I hit that option on my last round for 100-straight was indescribable. Although it was my 12th 100-straight I was just as nervous as if it was my first. I knew on the way there I had to perform at my best as the standard of Juniors now is just as high as the Seniors. Then I had to shoot-off with Natalie Bales, and World FITASC Champion Sam Green. Although I missed my first target I still put up a fight and finished on a 24/25, leaving me in third place. This was probably the most nervous I have ever been with my shooting.

SPONSORSHIPS & SUPPORT

At the moment I don't have any sponsors but I am always open to discussing sponsorship as every little helps! It goes without saying that I wouldn't be where I am today without the support from my grandad and nan, John and Rose Dyson, and of course my mum and dad.

ARCHY'S TOP TIPS

TIP1 The most important thing to me is **attitude**. If your attitude is bad it not only affects your shooting but also your presentation to others, like throwing cartridges, swearing, and I've even witnessed someone throw their gun!

It can take a long time TIP 2 to reach the top, so if you want to get far you must be committed and dedicate the spare time you have to practicing and competing.

Go compete. Competing is so different to practice as you learn to deal with the nerves and shooting with a range of different people.

TIP4 Get a coach to help improve your technique and know where you are going wrong, therefore enhancing your performance and becoming a better shooter.



TIP 5 At first, trying to get sponsors can be hard, but as you start winning, people start to recognise you and want to support your progress. Sponsors not only help with the financial side of the sport but also give you a team of people that will support you all the way. Masters



Targets are thrown within 30° (+/- 2.5°) of the centre line, and also vary in height, from 1.5 to 3.5 metres above the level of the trap house roof at ten metres forward of the trap.



ello and welcome to the third article in our fifth CPSA How to Hit series, sponsored by Browning, and with video episodes filmed at the National Clay Shooting Centre at Bisley. In this article, we're going to be looking at Automatic Ball Trap, or ABT as it is commonly known. This is a progression from Down-the-Line that we covered in the last two articles and episodes. We'll look at the differences between DTL and ABT here, and in the next article we'll cover how to shoot ABT targets. In future articles we'll progress on to Olympic Trap (OT).

The first difference you might notice when comparing an ABT layout to a DTL Layout is that the ABT shooting positions, or pegs, are in a straight line, as compared to the curved peg layout in DTL. The shooting positions in ABT are 3-3.3 metres apart, and each is one metre square.

Another difference between DTL and ABT is the squad size. ABT can have a maximum squad of six, whilst DTL has only five. The first five shooters will

start out on the five pegs, whilst the sixth shooter starts out stood behind the

shooter on peg one. The ABT sequence of shooting is also different. As opposed to the DTL format, where each person shoots five shots from their peg before all moving at once, in ABT the shooter moves immediately to the right

after each shot, or around to the start if they are at peg five. This continues until each shooter has had 25 shots total, five from each peg. With the moving, you can't move until the shooter next to you has taken their shot. The idea is that you shoot, unload, then wait for the person next to you to





Once the shooter to your left has taken the shot, you have ten seconds to load, mount, and take the shot.

take their shot. You then move off the shooting position to a point halfway between positions. This allows the person to your left to take the position you have just vacated. You then wait for the person to your right to do the same, and you then take that position, load, and wait for your turn to shoot.

Once the shooter to your left has taken the shot, you have ten seconds to load, mount, and take the shot. If the squad is incomplete, or if it is a shoot-off situation, then you have 15 seconds. It is very important that you don't disturb the shooter next to you, only move after they have shot. Be sure that they have taken their shot, or shots, before moving to that position halfway between pegs.

As with DTL, the maximum cartridge load is 28 grams, and you get two shots per target. However, a difference from DTL is that in ABT you get one point no matter whether it is a first or second barrel hit. Like DTL, competitions normally consist of 100 or 200 targets, shot in rounds of 25.

Usually there will be two assistant referees in addition to the main referee. One of them is there to raise a hand or flag if they see a target lost, to back up the decision of the main ref. The other assistant ref will run the abacus



that gives a visual representation of the scores. Some grounds, such as the National Clay Shooting Centre, have an electronic scoreboard. Others use an abacus, where a metal plate is turned for each shot to indicate a hit or a loss. The referees are normally selected from the squad that has just shot. They will stay behind and referee the following squad.

Another major DTL/ABT difference is the target trajectory. The ABT trap is set in the ground, instead of in a trap house above ground like DTL. The clay is thrown to 70 metres, inside an angle of 30 degrees either side of the centre line, and at a height of 1.5 to 3.5 metres above the trap house roof. The trap is moving completely randomly up and down, as well as side to side within these parameters, meaning the target is unpredictable in both height and angle. This contrasts with DTL where the height doesn't vary.

ABT traps are often located in the very centre of the same trench used for Olympic Trap and Universal Trench. As you can see in the photo to the below I have placed a clay on the trench where the ABT trap is located. This is also my hold point when I shoot the targets from each position.

That's a brief introduction to the rules of ABT, in the next article and episode, I'll go over how to shoot the targets.





Senior CPSA L3 Coach, Tutor and Assessor, **Mike Williams**, discusses his introduction to shooting and his many roles within the CPSA.

QHow did you first get into shooting?

My introduction to shooting was as an Air Cadet on a military range, the gun was a Lee Enfield .303 and I was given some cotton wool as my only defence against the noise generated. There was a ringing in my ears for days afterwards!

I then progressed to 'rough' shooting, purchasing an unnamed Spanish side-by-side hammer gun, which I paid £15 for after acquiring my first shotgun certificate for seven shillings and six pence, which would be roughly 38p nowadays. There was no visit from a Firearms Enquiry Officer – you just walked up to the Post Office counter,

Promotion, pressure of work, getting married, and moving location all helped to put the shooting on a back burner until about 1985 when I was introduced to clay shooting on a corporate event. I won and got bitten by the bug. Most of the grounds in those days existed on the 28-day rule so you only got to shoot every other weekend, so I joined three clubs and my wife became the shooting equivalent of a golf widow.

QYou have done a lot of work with the CPSA, could you explain some of the positions you hold/have held?

Probably the first time I was able to observe the workings of the CPSA was in the late 80's when I was elected to the CPSA Cambridge County Committee, and then as that county's delegate to the East Midlands Regional Committee. Already a qualified referee in all of the disciplines, the regional committee appointed me as their representative to the

National Rules and Referees Committee, which had just been formed and I became a founding member and a Referee Tutor. I served on the county committee as a member, secretary, and chairman, and the regional committee as county delegate and secretary.

At the same time I was going through the CPSA instructor and coaching training courses, which I completed as a L3 Senior Coach in 1994 and to my delight, the Coaching Committee asked me to join them as a Course Tutor. As part of my continual professional development (CPD) and the wish to have an external award from the CPSA Instructor and Coaching courses, we went through a course accreditation with City and Guilds and NVQ L3 Coach, Tutor and Internal Verifier (Courses) qualification which I achieved.

Back in 2011, the management committee wanted to ensure that the CPSA instructional courses were the best they possibly could be and the Education and Training Steering Group (ETSG) was born. It was supported by the Technical Advisory Group (TAG), the latter consisting of the senior regional tutors of our five regions who could input to the ETSG what

changes or amendments were required to keep our courses relevant utilising upto-date techniques. I served on both groups and am currently chair of the ETSG.

I was also CPSA Clayline manager at Game Fairs for several years until a second total knee replacement precluded my attendance.

QWhat would be your greatest achievement? Probably my greatest achievement whilst working with the CPSA, was my appointment as Life Vice President in 2015, which came totally out of the blue.

What are the best parts of your coaching role?

There are so many that cover all aspects of the coaching spectrum – from the novice who has never shot before to an England team member who is suffering from a loss in form and all levels in-between.

The buzz that I get out of it is the same that I used to get when I was competing, but it's not from my shooting now, it's the pleasure that I get from getting my clients to achieve the best results that they possibly can, whatever their chosen discipline.

I also derive a great deal of pleasure taking a shooter and showing them how they can become an Instructor or Coach by imparting what I have learned over the years – and I am still learning.
