- 1) How many targets is the World Sporting main competition? 200 targets.
- 2) What is the format of the World Sporting? The competition is shot over two 100 target courses over two days with competitors shooting 100 targets each day i.e. Monday & Tuesday. There will be a 25-target Super Final on Saturday (8th) afternoon, where the top six shooters (shoot-offs in case of ties) will compete for the title. Prize giving and closing party to follow.
- 3) How many targets is the World Sportrap? 100 targets.
- 4) What is the format of the World Sportrap? This competition is shot over 4 layouts with the overall High Gun being the highest score (first past the post). Any ties will be determined by shoot-offs and then countback on the final day of this competition which is Friday 7th July.
- 5) How many targets is the Super Sporting? 100 targets.
- 6) What is the format of the Super Sporting? This competition is registered, and competitors will enter as Unclassified unless they have shot 3 x 100 registered scores in the discipline and achieved a classification. The course is set over 10 stands of 10 targets comprising a mix of singles (full use allowed), on report and simultaneous pairs. This competition concludes on Friday 7th July.
- 7) How many targets is the Prelim English Sporting? 100 targets.
- 8) What is the format of the Prelim English Sporting? This is an Open competition (not registered) and set over a course of 12 stands. This competition concludes on Thursday 6th July after which these stands will be available for practice using E J Churchill's claymate pay & play system.
- 9) Can I shoot plastic wad cartridges? Yes. Maximum shot size 6, 28gram load.
- 10) **Do I have to wear shooting glasses**? Yes. Ear & Eye protection is mandatory at CPSA Registered events, and a hat is highly recommended.
- 11) **Is there parking on-site**? Yes. There is ample parking on-site. Please follow the parking signage/attendants on arrival at E J Churchill. Transport will be provided to ferry shooters across to the main estate to shoot either the World Sporting or the Super Sporting events.
- 12) Is there catering available on-site? Yes. There will be food and drinks available all week.
- 13) Are there any practice stands available? No. There is no practice available until after the Prelim English Sporting competition concludes on Thursday 6th July, after which these stands will be available for pay & play using E J's claymate system. However, there are pool shoots available to test your skills and get your eye in!
- 14) What time will the Sportrap presentations be on Friday 7th July? The final STR squad is at 4pm so the presentations will be at approx. 6pm.
- 15) What time will the Super Final be on Saturday 8th July? The Super Final will be at approx. 4pm on Saturday afternoon.
