The 58th Home Countries International took place on September 13th in the hills of Wales, at the Dovey Valley Shooting Ground.

42 competitors from six home countries tackled well-set targets in some of the most variable weather of any competition in recent memory. Heavy rain followed minutes later by bright sunshine and again moments later, heavy rain, had shooters performing more costume changes than Taylor Swift. The wind picked up after lunch and made for a challenging stand or two but target setter Andy White and his team had worked hard to mitigate the variables.
