WELCOME





SAFETY OFFICER REQUALIFICATION

The process of requalifying Safety Officers for a further 5 years continues and we have emailed or written to all those who qualified in 2016 notifying of the need to requalify now. This involves taking a short 30 question multi-choice online exam and on successful completion a new Safety Officer certificate will be emailed.

The current version of the Safety Officer manual is available to download to qualified members free of charge or if you prefer a hard copy then there is a charge of £20 incl P&P.

The shooter can therefore keep both eyes open and still see through the dark lens – but the non-dominant eye, looking through the clear or yellow lens, should take over.

The Strike frame is made from lightweight, yet super strong TR90, with adjustable nose pads and non-slip arms. All lenses are made from optical grade polycarbonate with full impact protection and are all UV400 rated.



The Kit comes complete with the dark grey Category 4 lens, a clear and yellow lens, plus a soft carry pouch, cleaning cloth, and hard case. A pair of Category 4 dark grey lenses is provided in the kit so that the user has the option of wearing as dark tinted sunglasses (useful when shooting directly into the sun). Kits are available for both left and right eye dominant shooters.

OLYMPIC DREAMS

The greatest show on earth beckons for three highly experienced and talented shooters representing Team GB at their first Olympics.

The 21st Century has seen some magic moments for British shooters at the Olympics. Back in 2000, a 24-year-old Richard Faulds demonstrated his appetite for the big occasion when he took Double Trap Gold in Sydney, beating his great rival, Australian Russell Mark, in the process. At the same event, Ian Peel won Silver in Mens' Trap, and his resultant beaming grin was true testament to the sheer joy of the Olympics.

Then at London in 2012, Peter Wilson stood tall and ice cool to surge to another Double Trap Gold for Great Britain. At a time when it was raining gold for the host nation this achievement could

have easily been overlooked, but live TV coverage enabled Wilson's success to be enjoyed by households across the land. With the Royal Artillery Barracks venue in Woolwich looking dazzling, clay shooting has rarely reached a bigger audience or looked more seductive, and the young man from Dorset made the very most of it.

Rio 2016 saw further Bronze medals for Steve Scott in Double Trap, and Ed Ling in Mens' Trap, so Team GB has been enjoying a rich seam of success in the clay-shooting arena this century.

TOKYO BOUND

Double Trap is no longer an Olympic event, but the opportunities are there to be grabbed by our newest Olympians in Olympic Trap. Despite doubts over Tokyo 2021, British Shooting has named three athletes who will have the honour of representing their country on the biggest stage this summer. Matt Coward-Holley, Men's Trap, Aaron Heading, Men's Trap, and Kirsty Hegarty, Women's Trap, will be making their debut on the biggest stage in world sport.

British Shooting Performance Director Steven Seligmann informed me that all involved are determined the show will go on: "This year's Olympics are going to be different – but at the moment authorities in Japan are making it clear they will do everything possible to ensure they go ahead. If that means behind closed doors which it may do, given everything we are going through, it's still a brilliant opportunity to unify the world in the common enjoyment of the Olympics. Of course it needs to be as safe and secure as possible but none of that takes away from what people are aspiring to achieve."

"As we look forward to Tokyo for each of our three shooters it's incredibly special. They have all earned it off their own back and have all already achieved great things in shooting. They have a strong pedigree behind them and they are now in a very special place. Each of them was absolutely delighted to have their selection confirmed and they are on a real high. Having that clarity enables them to focus on just being ready for this summer, which is why we made the selection in January. And we still have the opportunity to achieve more quota places because the qualifying period doesn't finish until the end of June. In the meantime Aaron, Kirsty, and Matt should be extremely proud of what they have achieved so far."

AN AMBITIOUS WORLD CHAMPION

Matt Coward-Holley won Gold in Olympic Trap at the ISSF World Championships in July 2019, at the famous Lonato venue in northern Italy. After a very tight qualifying session he took the title by a comprehensive six targets, becoming Britain's first World Champion in the discipline, so it's no surprise to see his name on the team sheet for the Olympics, and he told me: "This will be my first games and it's an absolute honour to be part of Team GB. It's the pinnacle for anybody across all sports and I'm looking forward to the completely different buzz in the village, surrounded by athletes in all the other sports from all over the world. In normal competitions it's just the people from our sport so in that sense it's a unique opportunity. And ever since I started to take shooting seriously I have always thought how far can I go?"

With so much British Olympic success in recent years, and the challenge coming from the very best in the world, how does Matt cope with the pressure? "There are plenty of other athletes I respect but ultimately you need to forge your own path. This is the crème de la crème of world shooters all gathering in one place, but I will just focus on what I can do." Inevitably, preparations have been hampered by Coronavirus but this has not been a total disaster for Matt as he explained "All being well our competition season will be



up and running this spring. I have had 12 months without international competitive shooting, but it's the same for everybody and this has given me the chance to work on the things that needed to be worked on. We have all been in the same boat so I don't think that will be too detrimental for anyone."

And what about Olympic ambitions? "I have worked hard for a long time and I am going out to the Olympics aiming to win the Gold medal. That is my objective and ultimately that's the most important thing to me."

THE WORK HAS PAID OFF

Kirsty Hegarty told me what selection means to her and her family: "It means that the work over the years has paid off, not only for me but everyone that has supported me along the way. My mum, dad and husband have been fantastic, encouraging me when things were going wrong and bringing me back down to earth when things were going well."

Like anybody who starts a sport for the first time, the Olympics were not on the radar for Kirsty when she first pulled the trigger: "I took up the sport to spend more time with my family initially, and then because I am a competitive person I wanted to win and be the best. And I guess my Olympic selection just shows that shooting sports can take you in all sorts of directions and I am absolutely thrilled to be able to represent Team GB at the Olympics. It's a long way from where it all began – standing in a wet and wild Mid-Wales

There are two clay-target shooting disciplines in the Olympics: Olympic Trap, and Olympic Skeet. Currently all of the Team GB clay-shooters participate in Olympic Trap.

Kirsty pays special tribute to two men who have been instrumental in her journey:

"Hendy Hume and David Beattie really inspired me. Hendy won the World DTL with a record breaking perfect 300/900 and it was great to see that someone I knew was an actual World Champion. This was the same year I started shooting DTL.

Then David introduced me to Olympic Trap with stories of his Commonwealth success in Australia, his GB caps and the enjoyment of competing at the top level."

A FORMIDABLE TRIO

Aaron Heading is a three-time World Championship medallist, Commonwealth champion and former world number one, so these three shooters have a formidable amount of experience for a trio making their Olympic debut. And as the main event draws closer for the Team GB shooters we will leave the last word to Kirsty: "More than anything I am looking forward to stepping on that stand and taking the first shot. Then I will be able to call myself an Olympian."



BUYING A LEFT- HANDED GUN



Richard Faulks speaks to Marcus Simpson of Simpson Brothers and Jason Harris of Trulock & Harris, about what to look out for when buying a left-handed gun.

If you happen to be one of the ten percent of the population that is left-handed like me, purchasing a gun that will fit correctly can be a little more difficult than for a right-handed person – there's just less choice available straight off the shelf. You only have to scan the pages of gun dealers' websites to see that, unsurprisingly, only ten percent of the guns seem to be cast left! You'll be able to find some gun dealers that will cater better for left-handers like Premier Guns, where Matt Morgan tells me "he has 60-70 lefties at any time, plus demo guns". But sometimes you'll just have to be a little patient until you find the perfect gun.

Here are a few options from the gun trade when looking for a new or second-hand, left-handed gun.

SPEAK TO A PROFESSIONAL

Firstly, I asked Marcus Simpson of Simpson Brothers, for his advice and thoughts. His thinking is pretty straight forward – "take your measurements, take your time, order one, and be prepared to wait" he told me, if you're in the market for a new gun.

He suggests that it will always be best to buy a gun that was made with a left-handed stock in the first place, rather than having a right-handed gun adjusted by a gunsmith. Beretta have been the leader in the market for left-handed guns over the years, as most of their models are readily available with a left-cast stock. But Marcus tells me that pretty much all of the manufacturers are catering for us lefties far better now. After all, why would you want to turn your back on ten percent of the market!

Jason Harris of Trulock & Harris agrees with Marcus' assessment, and explains that adjusting the cast on a gun from right to left cast is possible, but it does throw up some problems. He explains that not only is the stock

bent outwards to give the cast, but it is also effectively twisted too. The heel (top part of the butt plate) should have slightly less cast than the toe (the bottom part of the butt plate), when looking at the gun from the stock end towards the barrels. This twist will be carved into the stock when it is manufactured out of the blank, so the wood will be under no pressure or tension.

If you then move the stock to cast it to the opposite hand and twist it so that the toe of the stock sits well in your shoulder, you're obviously putting the wood under tension. Sometimes it will creep back to its relaxed position over time. Being a natural material, it means that not every piece of wood is the same. Jason has just had a pair of guns in for adjustment – one took the adjustment perfectly, but the other just wouldn't hold in place. Having a gun adjusted is a bit of a lottery as to how the wood will take to being re-cast.

tweaks and success is far more likely.

If you're buying your first gun or haven't been shooting too long, it's quite possible that your gun mount will vary slightly each time you shoot. A consistent mount will come in time with practice, but until you have a consistent mount, fine-tuning a gun's dimensions for fit will be difficult for a coach or a gunsmith.

The advice from Marcus and Jason here seems to be to have a good coach take a look at you and buy a gun that fits as well as possible for your build and the shoulder you shoot off. It may be that when you become a more accomplished shot, some fine adjustment may

be needed. But the nearer the gun is to fitting you in the first place, the smaller the adjustments will need to be. So live with the gun for a little while before having adjustments made if ultimately needed.

If you're a seasoned shot, a gun fitting session will be time and money well spent. Knowing what measurements to look for will be a huge advantage when asking dealers what they have in stock. It will also allow them to order in a gun that should fit you if nothing is readily available. Many of the manufacturers or importers will be happy to send you photos of available guns, if you're particularly interested in the figuring and aesthetics of the wood – I know I certainly am! If you're really serious about gun fit and are lucky enough to have a sizeable budget, then there are plenty of stock makers that will carve a bespoke stock for you, or you have the option with some manufacturers of having a factory visit for a fitting. You will be able to choose a stock blank, handle your gun when the stock has been roughly carved, and alter the measurements until you're confident that you have everything exactly where you want it. Then you can pattern plate it. Theoretically, you should then have a perfect fit, but you won't be able to use gun fit to explain away any misses on the clay ground ever again!

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN A GUN

So when buying a second-hand gun, look for one that was made left-handed if at all possible. You'll need a keen eye to spot the difference between a gun that was made left-handed and one that was originally made right-handed and cast left, but things to look out for are if the heel and toe are sloping the correct way for the cast, as just described.

Another thing to check is if the gun has a palm swell. Is the swell on the correct side of the grip? If not, it is probably a right-hander that has been cast left. Some guns will have triggers that are slightly canted to make them more comfortable for your trigger finger. Obviously, a right-handed gun will have the trigger canted to favour a right hand rather than left. It may well take you longer to find your perfect gun – but you will be saving yourself possible problems in the future if you hold on to find a true left-hander. Even if you end up having to make changes to the cast, they will only be minor

SHOOTING IN 2020

I had great plans for 2020 and I was excited to be sponsored by Lyalvale Express Cartridges, but then Coronavirus hit and shooting all became very challenging.

When we were allowed to shoot later on in the year, I was able to win the Colts ABT English Open and Junior Gold at the Universal Trench UK Championships. I was also fortunate to win the British Olympic Trap Junior title at Fauxdegla Shooting Ground, who have kindly sponsored me for 2021.

To top it off, I won the English Open Olympic Trap Colts title, and as my

last year as a Colt I was very pleased with this outcome. It was great to also come Fourth Overall, combined with my Dad winning the Senior title it was a really special day.

For years to come I will also remember the 2020 Steve Linley Memorial Shoot at East Yorkshire, as I was given the chance to try a Beretta gun and went on to win the Juniors champion title after a great shoot-off. I was lucky to keep the gun after the event, so I am looking forward to shooting with it when we can.

HOW I STARTED IN SHOOTING

I've been shooting since I was about nine years old. All of my family shoot, so it was natural to follow my dad and grandad's footsteps into competitive shooting.

My local ground is Griffin-Lloyd Shooting Ground, I would go with my dad when I was younger and was lucky enough to watch my heroes shoot here. In this sport there is always the chance to compete alongside them which is really inspiring – I was totally hooked!

I mainly shoot Olympic Trap, but I have been introduced to Universal Trench to gain experience of shooting abroad, first shooting for the GB Junior team when I was 12 years old.

MY BIGGEST ACHIEVEMENTS

In 2019 I qualified for the Junior Men's GB Olympic Trap team, and shot 120/125 at the Junior World Cup in Suhl to make my first final and won team Silver at the European Championships.

I came fourth in the Juniors category at the Universal Trench World Championships and was part of the Junior Men's GB team that became World Team Champions.

TOM'S TOP TIPS

TIP 1 Make sure you've got the right gun fit – monitor it closely when you're young and constantly growing.

TIP 2 The right guidance and coaching is important to progress and become a safe shot.

TIP 3 Train with a purpose and keep motivated by setting yourself goals and targets.

TIP 4 Be patient, which isn't easy if you're enthusiastic like me, but once you put the time and commitment in the scores will come.

TIP 5 Enjoy your shooting! When things don't go to plan, turn a negative to a positive and never give up.





A PLACE FULL OF PASSION //

We spoke to Managing Director of Eriswell Lodge Ltd, **Stuart Smith**, about the award-winning ground.



Q When did the ground open and what makes it special?

A: The site dates back to the 1970's when it was linked to RAF Lakenheath, a US Air Force base, and was known at that time as the Rod & Gun Club. It then became the Lakenheath Clay Target Centre, and in January 2015 my Dad and I took over the site and rebranded it as Eriswell Lodge.

We started the ground with the intention of providing high-quality facilities and experiences for everyone, and we had extensive development works and investments in mind to help us achieve this.

We started work on our new clubhouse facility in May of 2018, and were originally due to finish and open it in late 2019. However, due to a number of factors this was delayed to spring of 2020, and then again due to COVID-19. We finally opened the new building in September 2020 and couldn't be happier with the finished result – and the response from our customers.

We are a family-run

business, and have been since the beginning, which makes a huge difference to the atmosphere at the ground. We're all connected to shooting through the ground, but a large number of us are also connected personally through hobbies and family too. When Dad and I started the ground we were adamant that we wanted the friendly and welcoming feel of a small club, but with the added facility and amenities of a large commercial ground and clubhouse – something that we're very proud to have maintained to this day.

Q What disciplines/facilities do you offer?

A: We offer English Sporting, FITASC Sporting, Sportrap/Compak Sporting, English Skeet/Skeet Doubles, NSSA Skeet (American) and Olympic Skeet, Down the Line/Single Barrel, Automatic Ball Trap, and by default All Round as well.

For shooting areas we have 22 English Sporting stands, four of which are specifically designed for beginners, used

for lessons and experience sessions. We also have one covered Sportrap layout, which is also used for Compak Sporting, as well as a Rabbit Skeet layout. This is a full-sized, properly scaled Skeet layout which uses rabbit traps and targets rather than traditional skeet targets. This idea was put in place for the Easter weekend in 2018, and has proved immensely popular as it helps people to work on all possible angles of rabbit targets.

As well as this, we have a simulated game shooting area, four Skeet layouts, two of which with ABT layouts and one with DTL, and a separate covered DTL layout.

Facility wise, we are open seven days a week, and have our new 13,000 square foot clubhouse, which contains the reception, retail shop and gun room, a large café/restaurant and licensed bar, four conference/meeting rooms, and an outside terraced seating area.

We hold regular CPSA Registered competitions in most of our available disciplines, including County



Championships for Suffolk, Norfolk, Cambridgeshire, Essex, and regional fixtures for the East Midlands.

We have held National Championships for the British Skeet Shooting Association (NSSA Skeet in the UK) every year since we opened, and several non-registered ground competitions, including the World Skeet Masters event, hosted by Eriswell Lodge and John Dyson. We also hold events for local and national charities, and regularly host shoots with the local Masonic Clay Shooting Association.

Every Wednesday evening we run a non-registered floodlit English Skeet event, and through winter we run a floodlit Sportrap and DTL on alternate Wednesdays.

Q What awards and accreditations have you won over the years?

A: The ground has won a few awards over the last six years, all of which we are very proud of! We were voted Runner-up as the CPSA Ground of the Year in 2016, and have several awards with the Nation's Favourite

Shooting Ground (Clay Shooting Magazine).

These include second in East Region in 2017, first in East Region, second in National Skeet Ground, and third National Best Breakfast in 2018. In 2019 we came second in the East Region, third in the National Skeet Ground, and third in the National Trap Ground.

Q How has the ground developed over the years?

A: Massively! As mentioned previously we built the new clubhouse, which we believe may be the largest in the country for a shooting ground, but we cannot be 100% certain about that, and have been adding to our shooting offerings as routinely as we can. We have a huge development plan for the ground as a whole, which has sadly been put on hold due to COVID-19, but it will be back on track as soon as we can restart.

Q Could you tell us a little about your shooters/ sponsors programme?

A: We have three shooters that we work with on a

regular basis, and have been very pleased with their development since they joined our team.

We don't base our sponsorship on results, but on positive, professional, and polite conduct, and our collective game plan is always to improve ourselves first and foremost.

Our sponsored team includes Charlotte Patten, who worked exceptionally hard and placed second in the Ladies category for the Suffolk CPSA Supreme Championship in 2019, and has also done exceptionally well in the 2020 event – results for that have not been published as yet, so we can't say any more! We also sponsor Henry Lungley, who won the Colts category in the Suffolk CPSA Supreme Championship in 2019, and has also done exceptionally well in the 2020 event. Henry has also achieved AA classification in English Skeet, a fantastic achievement!

Our other sponsored shooter, Josh Nunn, has moved himself into AA classes for English Sporting, All Round, and Sportrap. Josh has also been exceptionally close to winning the Suffolk CPSA Supreme Championship, and was our County Sportrap Champion in 2020.

Q Are you planning any events for 2021?

A: We have a very full calendar this year, with county championship shoots booked for Suffolk and Cambridgeshire so far, as well as The East Midlands Skeet Championship, two NSSA championships and monthly target only shoots, regular

monthly CPSA fixtures, and for 2021 we are expecting to host the first England Skeet Team Selection shoot in March, the UK Compak Sporting Championships and GB Team Selection Shoot in April, the English Open Skeet Championships in May and the English Open Skeet Doubles in June, added to our own World Skeet Masters and the Chapmans All Round in December.

Q Is there anything you we have missed that you would like to add?

A: We are genuinely passionate about what we do, and our customers really matter to us.

This gives us a huge incentive to keep striving to improve our offerings and facilities, and we really enjoy working to develop Eriswell Lodge towards its true potential.

Dad and I are immensely proud of what Eriswell Lodge has achieved so far, and we are fortunate enough to have a great team of staff that share our vision and keep raising the bar, so finally a thank you from both of us to all of our customers, staff, referees, and suppliers for all of their support and efforts in developing Eriswell Lodge so far – we are very grateful! At the time of writing we are amongst the third lockdown, so we hope to see you all again soon! 🌟

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

for Year Ended
30 November 2020



COMPETITIONS

British Open Sporting

The British Open Sporting was run over five days at Garlands Shooting Ground and was pretty well sold out for each day. The super final took place on the Sunday and was slightly dampened by a strong downpour, which ended briefly and then rewarded us with a stunning rainbow over the competitors whilst they finished. David Ferriman took the title after a shoot-off with George Digweed. Tanya Faulds took the Ladies Open title with Amy Easeman taking second place. Darcy McBride won the Junior High Gun after a shoot-off with Henry Bevan. The British Open Sporttrap was also held at Garlands and concluded on the Saturday with James Attwood, Richard Faulds, and John Lee all required to shoot-off for the title. In the event James Attwood won the championship with Richard Faulds coming second, and John Lee third. Hannah Gibson won the Ladies title, with Stephanie Meacham taking second place, and Sarah White third. Junior High Gun went to Ronnie Green, with Josh Bennion scoring one less clay to take second place.

English Open DTL

Although the World DTL had to be cancelled due to restrictions on international travel, we did manage to stage the English Open, later than intended, as part of the Bywell Weekend in late August. Chris Moule took the title on 298. Sean Gardner and Junior competitor Leah Southall tied on 297, and after a shot-off for second and third place with Sean, ultimately finished in second place and Leah in third. Unsurprisingly, Ladies High Gun and title went to Leah Southall, as did the Junior title. David Toomer took the Veterans trophy, and William Taylor the Colts.

British Open Skeet

The British Open Skeet was hosted by NCSC and was almost as normal, due to relaxations in government guidance,

except for the prize-giving, Natalie Bales took the Overall High Gun trophy after a shoot-off with Sam Green. Sam of course, being better known for his sporting prowess and in fact came along to the shoot-off after a Sporting competition that morning. You may remember that Natalie won the English open Skeet High Gun trophy in 2016. Natalie of course also took the Ladies title at the British Open, with the Junior trophy going to Archie Stannard, the Colts to Alex Banning, and the Veterans to Douglas Moore. Disabled Standing was won by Sean Emmett, and Disabled Sitting by Adrian Last. Victor Annand took the Side-by-Side trophy for the second year running.

English Open Skeet Doubles

This championship was also held at NCSC in July and was won by Martin Brister, after a shoot-off with Peter Chester. Ladies High Gun went to this year's Skeet champion Natalie Bales, with Hannah Gibson coming a close second and Emma Parkinson a close third – only one point separating each place. The Junior High Gun was taken by Harrison Willis and the Veterans by Martin Brister. Sonny Bowman took the Colts High Gun, with Alex Banning coming second and Phoebe Bodley-Scott third.

English Open Olympic Trap

The English Open Olympic Trap was hosted at NCSC in late September. Government guidance was eased just a few days before, which allowed us to run the competition under normal rules, with waves of competitors rather than straight through as originally planned. Lee Betts took the Senior High Gun, with Matthew Coward-Holly taking Runner-up. Ladies High Gun went to Ellie Seaward, Junior High Gun to Ben Killian, and Veteran's High Gun to Howard Beaumont.

British Open Single Barrel

The Open took place at North of England on the Bank Holiday Monday

immediately following the postponed Bywell weekend. It was a close-fought contest with four shooters scoring 99, resulting in a shoot-off for the first three places. Jan Powell and Paul Turner ultimately progressed to a sudden-death shoot-off – which lasted in the region of an hour and a half – neither shooter looking like they were going to miss. But eventually Paul did miss and Jan took the British Open title with Paul coming second, and Iain Biggins taking third. Lucy Hall was Ladies High Gun, with Leanne Powell coming second, and Caroline Whitehead third. Junior High Gun went to Cory Doble, Veterans High Gun to Iain Biggins, and Colts High Gun to William Taylor.

British Open All-Round

The Open was shot at Brook Bank in Cheddar in August in quite sunny conditions, given that the English Open held the day before was plagued with almost torrential rain. Tony Coulstock, cheered on by Chester the Spaniel, took the British title on a score of 96, ahead of Tom Claydon and Darren Watkinson, who both scored 95 and shot a tie break round to decide their respective places. The Ladies High Gun went to Emma Stacey, with Linda Grayson coming second and Joanna Thomas third. Junior High Gun went to Daniel Carpenter. Colts High Gun was Denzil Grose, and Veteran High Gun was Richard Chapple.

FINANCIAL

Inevitably, with the shutdown of shooting for a prolonged period, membership, and therefore revenue, has fallen significantly over the year. However by strict reduction in spending and reorganisation of some of our financial commitments (including a freeze on staff salaries), the company has managed to end the year with a surplus. This will help to ensure we can roll out a full calendar next year, even though we will have reduced income, effectively allowing us to offset savings

made this year against forecast losses next year. This will also enable us to freeze the cost of membership at last year's rate, so no increase for 2021.

HEAD OFFICE

During 2020 Stuart Oldman, who many of you will know as our Operations Manager, decided it was time for him to retire. No amount of persuasion could change his mind so he will be leaving HQ at the end of March. Clare Alger, who you will know from the front desk at our major Championships, will be taking over his role and did in fact take up that position on 1 February. In turn, Clare Heney has moved to take over as championship Coordinator and therefore her role as England Team Coordinator is now vacant. We are currently interviewing for a replacement. I mentioned in my last report that our membership officer Mark Smith would be celebrating 20 years with the CPSA in 2020, and we marked the occasion in December during our last face-to-face board meeting. Only six more years Mark and you will have served the equivalent of a life sentence!

Last year, I concluded my Chairman's

Report by thanking you all for the help and support I received during my first year as Chairman. I concluded by saying how much I was looking forward to getting out on the road and meeting everyone for 2020. Well, sadly, as we all now know, things didn't quite go to plan. At the end of March shooting effectively ceased throughout the country and we had to cancel the World DTL and the World Sporting. Sadly, but with the agreement of each of the Home Nations, we also had to cancel all of the Home International competitions. We cancelled other major championships or rescheduled them in the hope that something could be salvaged later in the year. In the event, as each level of restriction was relaxed, we developed strategies for optimising everyone's opportunity to shoot and take part in competitions. In the end, we somehow managed to ensure that almost every discipline had at least one major championship, culminating in a successful, and almost normal, British Open Sporting at Garlands in September. I must express my gratitude to Iain Parker, our CEO, and all of the HQ staff, for the work they have put in to achieve

this unexpectedly good shooting year against a background of rules, regulations, and restrictions which were rarely easy to work with.

THE COMING YEAR

Our intentions, for 2021, are to plan and host a full calendar for the year, including the Home International competitions and the World Sporting. These dates are currently being finalised and we plan to ensure that they go ahead in as normal a manner as possible, subject to government guidance. There may have to be slight tweaks along the way and dates may have to be rescheduled at short notice as guidance changes. However, we proved last year, or rather you the members, proved last year how adaptable and supportive you could be when circumstances meant we had to make changes at the last minute. - Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The Directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Company's transactions and disclose, with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the Company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

RESULTS AND REVIEW OF BUSINESS

2019/2020 has obviously been a year of unprecedented events, heartache, and turmoil in our work and personal lives, as we have all had to battle the COVID-19 pandemic. As we entered the new year in 2020, which was to be one of our busiest ever years, we had the task of rescheduling the competition calendar, reforecasting our budgets, and protecting the association to weather these most difficult times. Through working with government and fellow sports associations, we were able to get clay shooting grounds and our sport open at the earliest possible moment. We then also established guidance for CPSA registered shoots and Championships to be held. We were able to hold four CPSA Championships across our home disciplines in 2020.

Our income was affected considerably, dropping year-on-year from £2,005,266 in 2019, to £1,608,590 in 2020. This reduction in income was primarily due to the cancellations of major competitions planned for the year, lower membership numbers, both new and renewals, and CPSA course income due to cancellations. The lower membership numbers were marginally offset by the release of deferred membership income from the prior year of £612,964, compared to £581,718 recognised in the current year, a net change £31,246.

In turn, our expenditure decreased in line with less competitions to manage and fund. While we took advantage of the governments furlough scheme, we

continued to deliver member benefits. We also worked on our IT development of the SHOOT program, which is now operational and in final test phase.

Other projects included reviewing environmental and legal legislation that potentially impact our sport, and we continue to develop our marketing programme across print and digital formats. While delivering what competitions we were able to in 2020, and coordinating with fellow associations to reschedule Championships, we are currently expecting to have a full calendar in 2021.

The last year was full of disruption and a challenge for the association, resulting in reduced income and expenditure. Due to it being an exceptional year and fewer events taking place, this has led to cost savings, meaning the association generated a surplus for the year, after taxation of £80,583 (2019: £29,356). These cost savings will be re-invested in future years.

RESERVES POLICY

The Clay Pigeon Shooting Association aims to keep free cash reserves for four to six months of core activity expenditure, therefore giving a target range of £500,000 to £750,000 of free cash reserves.

Free cash reserves at 30 November 2020 were £612,388 (2019: £560,975). Free cash reserves are made up of general reserves, cash received from deferred membership less fixed assets. We continue to be mindful of the need to improve the free reserves whilst making appropriate investments in the organisation.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 NOVEMBER 2020

1 GENERAL INFORMATION

Clay Pigeon Shooting Association is the national governing body for clay pigeon shooting in England. The company remains committed to promoting excellence in the sport.

The company is a private company limited (registered number: 3146770) limited by guarantee and was incorporated in England and Wales.

The company's registered office is Edmonton House, Bisley Camp, Brookwood, Surrey, GU24 0NP.

2 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

2.2 INCOME

Income is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the income can be reliably measured. Income is measured as the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Membership fees are recognised for the period to which they relate.

Championships, events and courses income are recognised in respect of goods and services supplied during the year.

2.3 GOING CONCERN

The Directors have reviewed their forecasts and cash flow requirements for the foreseeable future, these include considerations of the impact of Covid-19 on the Company. The Directors consider that the company will have adequate working capital available to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. They believe the going concern basis of accounting is appropriate for these annual financial statements.

2.4 OPERATING LEASES: THE COMPANY AS LESSEE

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the lease term.

2.5 GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Grants are accounted under the accruals model as permitted by FRS 102. Grants relating to expenditure on tangible fixed assets are credited to profit or loss at the same rate as the depreciation on the assets to which the grant relates. The deferred element of grants is included in creditors as deferred income.

Government grant income relates to the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme (CJRS) and is recognised as receivable in line with the period that the expense has been incurred.

2.6 INTEREST INCOME

Interest income is recognised in profit or loss using the effective interest method.

2.7 PENSIONS

Defined contribution pension plan

The Company operates a defined contribution plan for its employees. A defined contribution plan is a pension plan under which the Company pays fixed contributions into a separate entity. Once the contributions have been paid the Company has no further payment obligations.

The contributions are recognised as an expense in profit or loss when they fall due. Amounts not paid are shown in accruals as a liability in the Statement of Financial Position. The assets of the plan are held separately from the Company in independently administered funds.

2.8 TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

Tangible fixed assets under the cost model are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management.

Depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of assets less their residual value over their estimated useful lives, using the straight-line method.

Depreciation is provided on the following basis:

Freehold land - 0% straight line

Property improvements - 10% straight line

Motor vehicles - 25% straight line

Furniture, fittings and equipment - 25 - 33% straight line

IT Development - 20% straight line

The assets' residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted prospectively if appropriate, or if there is an indication of a significant change since the last reporting date.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing the proceeds with the carrying amount and are recognised in profit or loss.

2.9 STOCKS

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, being the estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost is based on the cost of purchase on a first in, first out basis. Work in progress and finished goods include labour and attributable overheads.

At each reporting date, stocks are assessed for impairment. If stock is impaired, the carrying amount is reduced to its selling price less costs to complete and sell. The impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss.

2.10 DEBTORS

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

2.11 CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

2.12 CREDITORS

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.13 FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Company only enters into basic financial instruments transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors.

10 COMPANY STATUS

Every qualifying member of the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association undertakes to contribute to the assets of the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association, in the event of the same being wound up while they are a member or within one year after they cease to be a member, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Clay Pigeon Shooting Association contracted before they cease to be a member, and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up, and for the adjustment of the right of the contributors among themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding £1. The number of these members of 30 November 2020 was 21,977 (2019: 23,192).

11 PENSION COMMITMENTS

The company operates a defined contributions pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. The pension cost charge represents contributions payable by the company to the fund and amounted to £33,484 (2019: £32,972). Contributions totalling £nil (2019: £nil) were payable to the fund at the balance sheet date.

17 POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

Following the emergence and spread of the coronavirus (Covid-19), the Directors have been monitoring the situation very closely to assess the potential impact on its operations.

Since the year end the government has put in place a full lockdown which has resulted in all Clay Pigeon Shooting activities to cease including all events and championships. Activities will not start again until the Governments advice makes it possible. The Company has introduced robust Governance protocol in light of Covid-19 and risks identified have been factored into long term financial projections.

The Directors have prepared cash flow forecasts to plan for the above, including any reasonably foreseeable mitigating factors and the Directors are comfortable that the Company can continue as a going concern for the foreseeable future.

With the COVID-19 lockdown impacting heavily on clay shooting, when this article is published details could be widely out of date. Planning for this year's championship is underway, but dates may change before the events so please check on their status, and any booking and squadding arrangements closer to the time.

The Avon English Sporting over 100-targets will be held at Meadowcroft Shooting Ground again this year, with a provisional date of Sunday 18 April. The Sportrap will also be held at Meadowcroft and will revert back to a 100-target competition. 



It is with regret that we report the passing of Chris Darvell on 21 December 2020.

Chris was a dedicated and passionate trap shooter who had been part of the International Trap shooting scene for nearly 50 years.

Chris first appeared in the CPSA averages in 1970, shooting just 50 registered DTL targets. For the next couple of years he persevered with DTL, shooting an increasing number of targets and even having a go at English Skeet and English Sporting.

In 1973 he dipped his toe into the waters of Olympic and Universal Trap. From then on these became his principal disciplines and for many years he attended most of the Grand Prix and GB selection shoots in both disciplines. In 1980 he made the Great Britain Universal Trap Team for the Grand Mondial (forerunner of the World Championships) in Montecatini.

He continued to compete strongly in GB selection shoots in both international trapshooting disciplines and this dedication culminated in a team Bronze medal in the Veterans event at the 2010 World UT Championships in Rome. Shooting was a very important part of Chris's life and his interest and excitement for the sport never wavered despite recent health problems.

Sadly, illness restricted the amount of shooting Chris was able to do over the last few years but he never lost his enthusiasm for the sport. He bore a serious illness bravely, supported throughout by his wife Olivia. Chris was a gentleman in the true meaning of the word and will be sorely missed by his many shooting friends. Our thoughts are with Olivia at this sad time.

Lee Betts stated: "At the moment we not only miss our shooting but also the people, the faces and the characters too. Chris was one of these. He obviously loved the sport he'd practiced for many years, yet he always took the time to stop and check on the progress of youngsters, like my son Tom, and always with enthusiasm and encouragement. It's very sad to think we won't see him around when we return"

ON TARGET FOR RETIREMENT

We spoke to CPSA Operations Manager **Stuart Oldman** ahead of his upcoming retirement.

Q How long have you worked at the CPSA and how has your role changed over that time?

A: I joined the CPSA in 2008 after my previous employer ceased trading, but with a background in small company facilities management and a keen field archery shooter, rather than a clay shooter, the CPSA was a great choice and proved to be a good decision for me.

I have remained as the Operations Manager throughout the 12.5 years but this role is far more than facilities management – that's the easy part. It has always included looking after the Operations Team for Championships, England Teams, Fixtures, Scores, and Visitor Permits. A really professional group throughout the years.

Big changes during this time have

been made in our IT and systems developments (thanks Pete) helping us all internally to support our members.

Q What's been the highlight of your time at the CPSA?

A: I can honestly say everyone I have worked with at the CPSA over the years have been a pleasure, and I will miss every one of them. It really has been a great team as we all work closely together, support each other when needed.

Q What has been the biggest challenge?

A: This would have been the time between two Chief Executives, where I was asked by the directors to act as Interim Chief Exec.

It was rather challenging and stressful on top of the Operations Manager role, but I had full support from the board, and particularly Terry Bobbott, the chairman at the time. Obviously, Coronavirus has been and remains a big challenge for everyone and for all sports – there can only be better times to look forward to.

Q You are very active in Field Archery – can you tell us a little about that and some of your achievements?

A: I took up field archery in 1992 after being persuaded to by my brother-in-law, a many times world champion, so I couldn't have wished for a better coach to get me started, then I was hooked.

My crowning glory was in 2015, taking part in the European Field Archery Championships in Sweden. I won the Bronze medal as an individual and Silver as part of the England Team. These events are held over five days, with all competitors shooting 112 targets each time on a different field course each day. Sometimes these were over quite severe and difficult terrain, with approximately 600 archers all starting at 8am, finishing anything up to 6pm. It was all challenging but great fun and every day ended in the beer tent. 100 ESP clay targets in three hours must be easy!

Q Do you plan to practice more during retirement?

A: That is definitely the plan, hopefully I will be practising two or three times a week, when we are not in lockdown, which may just help to get me back to somewhere near my previous shooting ability, but I will also enjoy being out with other pensioners. Last of The Summer Wine comes to mind somehow.

Q How would you sum up your time at the CPSA?

A: Challenging, difficult at times, but without doubt great fun. How quick those years have flown by! ☺




