Even more amazing is that Dan has only been shooting DTL since March and this is his first ever perfect score. We will report fully on that in next month's issue. GOLD FOR MATTHEW COWARD-HOLLEY AND KIRSTY HEGARTY AT LONATO WORLD CUP



MATT COWARD-HOLLEY IS OLYMPIC TRAP EUROPEAN CHAMPION

The medals kept coming for Matt Coward-Holley, with his third medal in two months being a gold at the European Championships in Osijek.

It was a tightly fought final but Matt held his nerve, finishing with a score of 4ex50. Czech Republic's Jiri Liptak won silver and Italy's Mauro De Filippis had to settle for bronze.

The result in Osijek means Matt has secured the title of World Champion and European Champion in the last year, and this European result came hot off the back of a Green Cup gold and a mixed pairs gold (with Kirsty Hegarty) at Lonato.

Speaking after the result, the Chelmsford shooter said: "It feels so surreal. It's been a phenomenal end to a fantastic trip. It took me a little while to get going but once I was up and running it was all good. I've been lucky enough to be training abroad since April. It's been really great preparation and it's clearly paying off."

It's gold for Matthew Coward-Holley and Kirsty Hegarty at the ISSF Lonato World Cup in Mixed Trap Pairs. A score of 39ex50 was enough for GB to beat finalists San Marino and secure top place on the podium.

The duo also went into the final having qualified in top place in the earlier qualification rounds with a score of 145ex150, with Matt, from Chelmsford, shooting a 75-straight and Kirsty, from Belfast, shooting 70ex75.

The light conditions certainly played a part in the final scores, with both GB and San Marino missing more targets than they would expect to, but it was the British pair who managed to clinch it.

Speaking after the final, Coward-

Holley said: "It was an interesting and difficult final. Bad light had an impact on the scores, but overall we're very happy.

"This has been the icing on the cake for the trip. Everyone has shot really well and it's a fantastic end."

Kirsty added: "Today's been great, the final was really hard but to come away with the medal is fantastic."

"We now just have a couple more internationals in the Green Cup and the European Championships as we build towards the Olympics."

MORE TEAM GB SUCCESS AT THE EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Matthew Coward-Holley and Charlotte Hollands have won silver at the European Championships in Olympic Trap Mixed Team. Both had strong performances in the qualification round with a combined score of 144, earning them a spot in the gold medal match against Jessica Rossi and Valerio Grazini of Italy. It was Italy who eventually won the gold with a score of 41ex50, beating GB's 39ex50.

The Senior final was followed quickly by another GB bronze in Junior Olympic Trap Mixed Team from Tom Betts and Lucy Hall. In what was a fantastic way to round off a very successful competition for the GB Trap team, the pair were up against their fellow compatriots Michael Bovingdon and Madeleine Purser.

Fresh from her Individual Junior gold medal win just a few days ago, Lucy performed with such confidence and a strong score of 43ex50 from her and Betts was enough to win the bronze against Bovingdon and Purser's score of 38ex50.

TEAM GB BRING HOME MEDALS FROM THE ITALIAN OPEN GREEN CUP

Matthew Coward-Holley has won gold at the Italian Open Green Cup. The shooter was full of confidence going into the event, and after scoring 121 in qualification, a score in the final of 47 was enough to leave him top of the podium, with Italy's Simone Prosperi taking silver and Luca Miotto in third. GB's Nathan Hales also made the final but had to settle for fourth spot.

There was also a Team Silver medal for Matt, Nathan, and Rio 2016 bronze medallist Steve Scott.

Speaking after the competition, Matt said: "It's definitely a good end to a good trip. I've shot very well. Once I managed to reach the final it was a clean slate from there, so I'm really happy to have shot so well and win the gold."



LUCY HALL TAKES GOLD AT THE EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Lucy Hall has taken gold in Junior Women's Olympic Trap at the European Championships. The 17-year old Olympic Trap shooter shot a 41ex50 to secure the top spot on the podium. Speaking afterwards she stated "It's just amazing, all the hard work through the winter is really now paying off. So yeah, I'm speechless!" Michael Bovingdon also shot well in the Junior Men, securing fifth place in Junior Men's Olympic Trap.

The current champion, Tristan Hockey, has now moved into Juniors, so it is wide open to see who the next Colts Challenge Champion will be. We hope to see many of our members in attendance at these exhibitions of clay-shooting skill.



LETTER OF THE MONTH

I would like to share my experience of 'it is never too late' to return to shooting and the feeling of being back in the saddle!

I last shot 15 years ago, and due to personal health issues, I needed to take a break from the sport. Having been diagnosed with Aspergers Syndrome and Autism in 2018 and following some supportive therapy I decided to follow my heart, at age 49, the long held ambition to shoot again.

With the support of the team at JF Neville and Sons I was fitted with a new Browning 525 32" Trap. I then visited, and

shot at the equally supportive and excellent facility at Nottingham & District GC.

The feeling when that first clay shattered was very emotional, and even more so after I posted my best DTL score ever of 93x100!

The moral of the story – if you need to take a break – set up and go again when you can, the difference shooting makes to your wellbeing is really positive, and you might even post a personal best!

This four-day course teaches you how to check eye dominance and gun fit. It shows you how to teach the CPSA Method, how to recognise shooting errors and how to correct them. It consists of classroom time, off-and on-range workshops and a final day of assessments. It covers crossing, rising, and dropping targets and equips instructors with the knowledge to tackle a huge variety of targets. For this course, the criteria for qualification is that the candidate can get a novice to hit a moving target safely using the CPSA Method. ENGLISH OPEN ENGLISH SPORTING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Barbury Shooting School | 19-23 May 2021



Olympic Gold medallist Richard Faulds MBE regained the English Open English Sporting title in dramatic fashion, at Barbury Shooting School in Wiltshire, after a gap of 13 years. It was the sixth time Faulds has won the championship, the first in 1996, having won the Juniors category three years earlier at the age of 16.

Faulds made his intentions clear from the start. He was the first shooter out when the championship opened on Wednesday 19 May, setting the pace with an impressive 112ex120, but the story begins long before, of course. This was Barbury's first major championship and they have been working towards it for over two years.

The ground's Shoot Manager Josh Brown explained that the brand new clubhouse was completed towards the

end of 2020 and saw little use before the English Open due to COVID restrictions, so Huw Stephens and the team were thrilled to see it busy with shooters registering, checking scores, or simply enjoying a cup of tea and a slice of cake out of the rain.

Barbury has also built several new stands on the hill above the clubhouse, and others beyond the Deer Park area which will be familiar to regulars at the ground. With a profusion of CPSA and sponsors' flags around the ground, smart new signage, and a small trade village beyond the clubhouse, the event looked every inch a Major Championship – and ran like one too – with

minimal delays as squads moved round the course.

The CPSA trialed the new Shoot scoring system for the first time at a Championship, adding another level

minimal delays as squads moved round the course.

The CPSA trialed the new Shoot scoring system for the first time at a Championship, adding another level

of interest as anyone with an internet connection could visit the website and see the latest scores and updates as quickly as they could be entered by the CPSA team in the clubhouse.

CPSA CEO Iain Parker explained "We're at the first stages of rolling it out, so as the scores come in off stand 15, as soon as the staff put them in they are live on the website. Wherever you are – at home, another shooting ground, or out on the course – you can look at your phone and see what's happening."

It's a big step forward from waiting for the day's scores to be uploaded later in the evening, but this is only phase one. "The next step will be that the referees themselves will upload scores electronically from each stand, so it will be live scoring as you shoot." Iain says. "That's a little way off yet, but we're going to trial it at some of our championships this year."

Anyone watching the scores would have seen some big names shooting the course, but none could match Faulds' 112. Julian Freeman came closest on the first day with 110, followed by Mickey Rouse on 106, then George Digweed, Paul Cooper, and Peter Goldsmith on 103. George Digweed heaped praise on the ground and the targets. "The venue is absolutely first class," he said. "Huw and the gang here have put on a first rate English Championship. It's a very technical shoot. Some of it is tough,

some is gettable, but as I've always said any championship has got to be testing, and I think they've done a fantastic job."

Stands 10 and 15 caused much comment on social media as well as in the clubhouse. Stand 10 saw a long, fast, right-to-left crosser off a tower, followed by a closer left-to-right crosser on report. There was much debate about how many double decker buses of lead the first target required, and straights on that stand were rare enough to merit a round of applause.

Stand 15 was shot from a Laporte trailer which provided a raised platform, and a welcome shelter from the worst of the weather for shooters and referee alike. The targets consisted of a left-to-

right orange standard clay quartering away, with a right-to-left rabbit on report. At first glance they didn't look exceptionally difficult, but that stand left a hole in many a shooter's scorecard.

Shooting didn't become any easier as the week went on. The weather took a turn for the worst, with the wind strengthening on Thursday and heavy rain during the afternoon. By Friday, conditions were really challenging. The targets held up well and were little affected by the wind, but inevitably

it's hard to shoot your best in those circumstances. That's shooting, however, and spirits remained high at what was, after all, the first CPSA Major Championship of 2021, and a welcome return to competition after months of COVID restrictions and lockdowns.

Tony Bromwich from Eley Cartridges, one of the event's sponsors, summed it up when he said "It's a delight to be back out shooting and to see everyone after such a long time, although the conditions are a little challenging. It's great to see people out here enjoying themselves and I wish everyone the best of luck." The other sponsors of the Championship were Rizzini/ASI, Swatcom, and Musto. The event was also supported by Promatic traps.

Unsurprisingly in the conditions, despite some good scores no-one could match Faulds' first-day 112. Top scorer on Thursday was Jake Moore with 106, with James Attwood just one target behind. Defending champion Mark Winser shot on the Friday, his 104 making him the top scorer of the day.

Things improved on Saturday, with lighter winds and the rain holding off for most of the day. With a good many AAA Class shooters competing, there were several three-figure scores posted, changing the look of the leaderboard, which would determine who went through

into Sunday afternoon's super-final.

Jamie Pearce and Martin Myers equalled Julian Freeman's 110 from earlier in the week, putting them in equal second place. Chris Daniels was now in fifth place on 109, with Sam Upton and Chris Childerhouse tied on 107 for sixth. Childerhouse's achievement was notable as he was making his way round the course on crutches, having suffered a broken leg a few weeks earlier. He commented "You don't realise how much movement comes from your feet and legs until something like this happens."

The stage was set for the big

showdown on Sunday – and the weather was determined to play its part in the drama. Faulds' lead still held, but with some big names still to shoot the course on Sunday morning anything could happen – and sure enough Richard Bunning shot in one of the last squads and equalled Faulds' score.

After a shoot-off between Matt Hance, Phil Gray, and Chris Daniels for the sixth place in the final, the six finalists were Richard Faulds, Richard Bunning, Julian Freeman, Martin Myers, Jamie Pearce, and Chris Daniels. They took up positions in the driving rain as the spectators sheltered as best they could under gazebos and umbrellas.

The four stands had been set up specially for the super-final, with targets set to challenge the best of the best. The shooters carried their scores with them into the final, and over the first three stands the two Richards, Faulds and Bunning, extended their lead as they matched each other almost target for target.

Faulds shot first on the last stand and dropped four to finish on 129, leaving the door open for Bunning to step in and claim the trophy – but he couldn't quite pull it off, missing first a single, then a pair, and then one each of his final two pairs, to finish just one target behind Faulds on 128.

"I gave it to him on that last stand really, but that's shooting for you," said Bunning. "You win some, you lose some."

To go into the final joint High Gun, I can't complain, it could have gone either way. It's been a good week. Congratulations to Richard, and we carry on and try again, that's all we can do!"

Faulds was delighted to win the English Open title again. "It was a great event, and hats off to Huw, Josh, and everyone at Barbury. They've had a week of horrendous weather to deal with but the course held up really well. They've done a great job," he said.

"Fair play to Richard [Bunning] to shoot 112 today in this weather. I had a sneak peek at the scores on the TV screen just before we shot the last stand and to be honest I think Richard gave it away on the last stand rather than me winning it. It just shows you never know what's going to happen until the last shot is fired."

BICTSF ENGLISH OPEN COMPACT CHAMPIONSHIP



Hosted at Orston Shooting Ground on 6 June 2021, **Richard Faulks** reports back.

Orston Shooting Ground hosted the Compak Sporting English Open and as ever, they put on a fine show which was attended by many of the big names in the clay-shooting world. The shooting ground is set in Nottinghamshire's rolling countryside between Nottingham and Grantham and the ground was as immaculate as ever. The weather was mostly kind – mild with a light breeze and overcast – except for a heavy shower that made life difficult for the last few squads. The Red Arrows even put in a brief appearance as they flew by mid-afternoon in formation.

The four layouts were set by Daniel Martin, co-owner with Emily Martin, and all seemed to agree that it was a fair, but technically challenging course. There was one target that sorted out the 'wheat from the chaff.' Daniel

explained what he'd done with the orange target on layout two that was launched from the right of the line and travelled straight downrange, climbing and curling. "It's a lot slower than many of the other targets on that layout – it looks like it's still going, but it spends a lot of time in the air. Angle and speed is all it was." He went on to explain about the course, "you have to think more about the combinations rather than the individual targets. I'd say that the individual targets are fairly standard Sporting style, but when you add the combinations into the sim pairs, it makes people

shoot targets where they wouldn't naturally want to shoot them so they have to take a target on, or shoot it late, which adds a completely different element to the course."

fantastic display of shooting from many of the entrants, but fairly early in the day, Billy Baughan posted an exceptional 99 and it was clear that was going to be hard to beat or even match! But with the likes of James Bradley-Day, Sam Green, Chris Childerhouse, and George Digweed MBE

to come for the Seniors' title, it was anybody's guess what the outcome would be. For the Ladies, Cheryl Hall posted a fine 93 which was a great score, and enough to take first place ahead of Amy Easeman's 90.

Will Fenner and Charlie Monahan tied on 93 for the Juniors and took part in the only shoot-off of the day. The shoot-off was on layout two, which featured the problematic orange target, and it was indeed that target

that swayed the result! Will Fenner took the title by one point, with a 23 to Charlie's 22, and it was great to see such a high level of shooting from both those under the age of 21. The future for British shooting looks bright!

I caught up with George Digweed for his thoughts after he'd shot the course and posted a 94. He told me, "It was a good round of Compak, quite stiff.

The doubles were quite tricky, but all in all it was a good shoot. They were all there to be shot and they were all there to be missed. The shoot is all there if you work at it and work your angles out." This seemed to be the consensus from all the shooters I spoke to. James Bradley-Day told me that "everything I missed was plenty missable." In the end, Billy's 99 proved to be just too good and Sam Green's 97 gave him second place, which was an exceptional effort considering one of his layouts was shot during the rain shower. The layouts were exceptional and well thought out, as Daniel Martin told me: "It's a course that you can't shoot one technique at, you have to use a lot of different tools out of your tool box." Daniel expected 94-96 to be the winning score, so the 99 by Billy was 'out there' and an exceptional score. When I asked Billy how his day had gone, he modestly replied, "I had a good day!" Which is something of an understatement! When asked "why?" he said "I haven't got a clue – I started on one of the nicer layouts which helped me get going." A very modest man and some very fine shooting!

Finally, the staff at Orston and judges deserve a great deal of praise for putting on such a professional event which ran seamlessly throughout the day and it's always a pleasure to visit the shooting ground. Thank you!

NEW DELHI WORLD CUP

The first World Cup (WC) of 2021 season was held in New Delhi in March.

The Skeet Women's competition consisted of 11 competitors, but that doesn't negate the impressive performance from Amber Hill. Amber posted 124ex125 followed by 51ex60 in the final, taking gold after a shoot-off against Zoya



Kravchenko (KAZ). This result sees Amber ranked as world number one.

From 23 starters, Freddy Killander put in a very creditable performance, making the finals from 122ex125 to finish fourth.

LONATO WORLD CUP

The second World Cup of the season was hosted at Trap Concaverde, Italy, in May, which saw GBR come away with a gold and silver medal.

Amber kicked off proceedings with a top score of 123ex125 in the Skeet Women, she then went on to post 52ex60 in the finals for silver, beaten by

Austin Smith (USA).

Kirsty Hegarty and Matt Coward-Holley won gold in the Trap mixed team event after an eventful final match against San Marino.

It is worth mentioning some very encouraging performances from Ellie Seward and Lucy Hall in Trap Women. Ellie finished the qualifying rounds in fifth place with a score of 116ex125, and Lucy Hall in tenth on 115. Neither could pitch for the finals as they were shooting Ranking Points Only (RPO).

QUOTA PLACES.

Quota places were up for grabs at the European Championships, but there were no Olympic quota places to be won at World Cups (WC) this year, however, results may affect the world rankings to give the highest placed athlete an opportunity for nations who have yet to achieve a quota place within an event. The ISSF will confirm these places after 6 June.

EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The European Championships were held in Croatia, with Olympic quota places available in both Skeet and Trap events.

The GBR athletes brought home an Olympic quota place, a bundle of medals, and were involved in some exciting finals and again, there was young talent showing real promise.

Amber Hill won a quota place and GBR's first medal in the Skeet event. Amber went into the final ranked three – at the top of the leader board for some time – but just slipped down to finish in bronze. This was just enough to win our quota place. Amber is certainly showing some great form this year, and what better year to do so!

Amber said "It seemed for such a long time that I had been missing out on a quota; I felt really prepared for India last year, but it was postponed, so I made the most of the preparation time for this year and it just came together – it's an incredible feeling to actually win

a quota and to be ranked number one in the world."

Once again, Ben Llewellyn was agonisingly close to making a final as he shot 122ex125, but lost out in a six-way shoot-off for the last four places, a real shame.

The Skeet Men Juniors showed a good presence in the individual event, with Mitchell Brook-Smith just one target away from the finals. Aaron Ecclestone was only one target behind him and Oliver Harrison was the third score.

This total was enough to put them in the bronze medal match against a strong Czech Republic team. All three team members stood up well, with Oliver Harrison's final clean sweep on the last four targets to secure bronze for GBR.

What a final the Trap Men produced for Matt Coward-Holley, ranked world number three. Matt lost his shoot-off

for the final ranking places for the finals to start with bib number four, which can be a serious disadvantage as the lowest ranked shooter is eliminated in the event of a tied lowest score.

But Matt was the only finalist to rise up through the rankings to take gold in a truly nail-biting final. The last ten targets decide the gold and silver medals, with Matt finally finishing on 47ex50, putting Jiri Liptak (CZE) at a three target deficit for silver. The whole final was neck and neck with no room for error, well worth a watch on YouTube.

And, to top off Matt's fine performance, he and Charlotte Hollands won silver in the Trap mixed team event, after some toing and froing of scores with the

Italian team.

Another final which should be watched is the Trap Women Junior match where 17-year-old Lucy Hall, showed real strength and control during an extended match with several long delays, but put in a brilliant performance to take gold. This young lady looks like a force to be reckoned with.

And what fun to see the two GBR Trap Mixed Team Junior teams battling it out for the bronze medal. Maddy Purser and Michael Bovingdon seemed to have the edge over Lucy Hall and Tom Betts, but then the roles were reversed to give Lucy and Tom bronze to round off the European Championships.

It has been mentioned before, but the final videos are well worth watching.

JUNIORS ON THE MARCH



In this series, we speak to some of Britain's finest Junior shooters to find out what it is like being a high-performing young shot. In this first instalment, **Rhys Plum** reflects on his experiences as a competitor and talks to GB Olympic Trap Shooter **Lucy Hall**.

Shooting is a massive part of my life. Not only does it fill the bulk of my weekends but it also occupies my mind during the school week. From the moment I broke my first target I have had the bug. The opportunity to get better and to compete bounces me out of bed every weekend without fail. I began shooting at my local ground, Atkin Grant & Lang in Hertfordshire at the age of 12 with a Yildiz .410, and have been shooting ever since. Both my parents are amazing and are always there to support me in whatever I do. Dad would often take me out beating or for a day out in the pigeon hide and instilled in me a great passion for nature.

I was constantly bugging my parents to go out shooting. In the beginning, the sheer joy of making a clay target explode was more than enough for me, and then in September 2017 I shot my first Registered competition at Highwayman's SG, and scored 22/100.

Since then, things have steadily improved with just over 5,000 Registered Sporting targets since my first competition.

The following year was a complicated one, with majors cancelled or postponed as COVID hit hard across the country. I resorted to a few thousand gun mounts every week, and I also took to utilising my skills as a writer to interview top coaches, competitors, nutritionists, and sportsmen, to see what I could glean from their stories. From these interviews, I learnt the importance

I have made great friends from shooting, including Darcy McBride, who will be featuring in next month's magazine. In 2019 we competed against each other at The Schools Challenge (TSC) events at the Oxford Gun Company, where there is the opportunity to win a brand-new car. Unfortunately, 49/50 in the qualifiers wasn't enough for me, and I narrowly missed out on winning the car in the shoot-off, which was won by Ron Chipman of Pinewood Shooting Ground. I could not compete in the TSC after that as I had moved into A Class. The TSC is open to anyone under 21 who is in full-time education and below A class.

of nutrition, the mental game, and many other aspects of the sport. I am always looking for the next thing to help me to improve and add that extra few clays to the scorecard. Faith in your gear is just one part of the puzzle that will allow you to perform to the best of your ability and I know I can always count on my equipment. I am very grateful to those who support me, especially my parents, in letting me compete using the best. I shoot a 32" Krieghoff Parcours, topped with a pair of Teague Chokes in a 3/8 constriction. Through much testing, I found these to be perfect for all sporting targets – and fuel the K-Gun with Hull's finest Pro Ones in a no.8 shot. I also own a selection of Pilla lenses, which I really would consider to be an unfair advantage; most of the time I will use a PN3 – to neutralise green backgrounds and really make those clays stand out – and if not I'll wear a 22CN which is perfect for the sunshine. My bag is also filled to the brim with snacks and drinks to keep me energised and hydrated throughout the shoot which is something I feel is essential all year round.

One person who I could not be without is my coach, Matt Hance.

His adaptability and wealth of knowledge makes him an excellent coach, who I have learnt so much from. Matt's lessons are methodical, logical and sometimes challenging, but always highly beneficial. I have only worked with Matt for a little over a year, but his help has been increasingly valuable. ▶

LUCY HALL

Age 17, GB Olympic Trap

"My journey in the sport began in 2015 when I was just 12 years old. My dad, Rob Hall, and my grandad had both shot for England, and so it seemed only natural for me to get into shooting, and I absolutely loved it from the very first shot – it must be in my blood. I shot DTL for around two years, winning some major titles, before moving to Olympic Trap, Automatic Ball Trap, and Universal Trench."

Lucy was very quickly included in the British Shooting Olympic Pathway and in January 2018 took a Ladies Junior Gold at the Malaga Grand Prix, competing at the world-renowned Jarapalo Shooting Range. Just a month later, Lucy won Young Shot of the Year at the CPSA awards.

Most recently, Lucy won gold in the European Championships, Junior Women's Trap Event, shooting an amazing 116/120 in the qualifiers, to take bib three in the final, where she shot 41/50, matching the Junior European record and taking gold. Lucy said: "To top off an amazing trip, Tom Betts and I then went on to win a bronze



If I can keep up with this, hitting one clay at a time, I'll be on track to hit my long-term Olympic goals.



"My training is very different from when I first started. I feel like I have only recently found a training regime that suits me. I train on Promatic Traps with Corvisia Clays at East Yorkshire Clay Shooting Ground. Although my training plan can change, dependent on what

in the Junior Mixed Pairs Event, in an all GB medal match, against teammates Michael Bovingdon and Maddie Purser. The whole competition was an excellent experience, and my gold is hands down my all-time favourite win.

"I'm very fortunate to be sponsored and supported by some of the best in the industry; GMK/Beretta, Eley Hawk, Promatic, Pilla, Manuel Ricardo, and Corsivia. We're on this journey together, and I wouldn't be able to achieve what I have without their invaluable support and belief in me."

Lucy also explains how her training routine has evolved as she has developed as an athlete:

the competition calendar looks like, I always try and shoot one competition a week just to keep the competitive instinct there and my performance well-tuned. If I can keep up with this, hitting one clay at a time, I'll be on track to hit my long-term Olympic goals."

Lucy reflects: "Shooting is an amazing sport as a youngster, both in terms of the people that you meet and the opportunities that are waiting for you. Success in shooting is there for everyone, you just need to keep on going, no matter what obstacles you face. Ignore the distractions around you, and focus on the task at hand. The main thing is that when you step off the peg, you have a smile on your face."

HOW TO HIT

DOWN-THE-LINE PROCEDURES & SETUP

CPSA Level 3 Senior Coach **Simon Arbuckle** discusses the procedures and setup for shooting Down-the-Line (DTL).



Hello, and welcome to the second article in the fifth CPSA How to Hit series focusing on Trap disciplines, sponsored by Browning, and with accompanying videos filmed at the National Clay Shooting Centre at Bisley.

This month, I'm going to go through the procedures and setup for shooting Down-the-Line (DTL). For those of you who followed our past videos and articles covering Sporting disciplines, the same principles apply to DTL: for every shot, you must pay attention to your foot position, gun-hold position, and visual pick-up point. In other words, where your feet go, where your gun goes, and where your eyes go.

We'll look at how to approach the targets on each peg, starting at one. Remember, you may find yourself starting at any position when you are shooting with a squad.

PEG 1 Starting at peg one, I stand on the right-hand side of the box to keep myself as centred as

possible. I position my front foot pointing towards the centre of the trap house (see the diagrams on the opposite page for right and left-handed shooter foot positions). This is because, for a right-hander, any target going to the right is the harder shot because the gun is getting pushed off of my face. With any target going to the left, the gun is always getting pushed against my face. Positioning myself


this way means that anything going away to the extreme right will be more of a going-away target, and I can turn my body to get anything going to the left with no fear of the gun coming off my face. As we move around the pegs, I'll talk about the change of foot position for each peg.

My gun hold position for this peg is going to be the front left-hand corner of the trap house. As we move around

to pegs, two, three, four, and five this will change, as I'll explain. My eyes are always going to have a soft focus over the barrel, out in the distance. These are all starting positions, so everyone will change and adapt as they progress, but these are the basic foot and gun hold positions to get you started on DTL.

When I'm taking the shot, as I said earlier, any target going extreme right is a going-away target, and anything going left becomes more of a crossing target. When the target is thrown, I focus on the clay and then move the gun, waiting until I can see the clay clearly before I move.

On the extreme right, going-away target, I am merely taking the gun to the target and shooting. As I said in the last article, the Browning Protrap that I am using puts 70% of the shot above the bead, so that the target rises into the shot pattern.

For the shot going to the left, I wait until I can see the clay clearly before accelerating the gun to it and through it, but the impression that I'm getting is that I'm shooting at it, but with the speed of the gun I'm actually taking it in front and taking the shot.

PEG 2 Now to peg two. Again, I stand to the right side of the box and put my leading foot towards the centre of the trap house, with my gun-hold point roughly at the top of the trap house, one-quarter of the way across from the left. Again, my eyes look out into the distance, with a soft focus before I call 'pull!'

PEG 3 My feet are again positioned with my leading foot towards the centre of the trap house, and this time I'm standing in the centre of the box. Being on the centre peg, I can now evenly swing from left to right, not favouring either side. Gun-hold point on this peg is centre of the front lip of the trap house, eyes soft-focused on the distance and focusing on the clay before I move the gun to the target.

PEG 4 Now moving to peg four. Here, I adjust my position so that I'm standing on the left-hand side of the box, to try to keep myself in as close as I can to the centre of the layout and therefore keeping the angles down. Gun-hold position is roughly half-way between the centre and the right-hand edge of the trap, along the top. Again, eyes over the barrel with a soft focus in the distance before calling 'pull!'

PEG 5 On peg five I again put my feet on the left-hand side of the box, leading foot towards the centre of the trap house, eyes over the barrel with a soft focus in the distance. My hold point is the right-hand corner of the trap house.

TO SUM IT UP


And that's how you shoot targets in DTL from each peg. It is key to change your foot position at each peg, to allow a nice swing to both sides to get to the targets. The gun hold point changes at each peg, and eyes should always be over the barrel, focusing on the clay before moving the gun. In terms of stance, keep your weight forward in order to turn the body from the hips nice and smoothly, but not leaning so far forward that you are almost relying on the gun to keep you up when it goes off.

It is important to understand that

these are the basic starting positions. Light conditions, backgrounds, and the shooter's visual acuity can change the ideal visual pick-up point. As people progress, they may find that they prefer a higher gun hold position, above the trap house.


In the upcoming articles we'll look at Automatic Ball Trap (ABT) and Olympic Trap (OT), and see how each one progresses on with movement and stance along with angles, height, and speed of the targets. 

DTL FOOT POSITIONS FOR A RIGHT HANDED SHOOTER



Foot position for a right handed shooter. Toe of front foot pointing towards the centre front edge of the trap house.

SUMMIT ALLSPORT

- GUN REVIEW -

Mark Brown reviews the Caesar Guerini Summit Allsport.

CAESAR GUERINI SUMMIT ALLSPORT

It's been a while since I last reviewed a gun from Caesar Guerini in the pages of Pull! so I was rather excited when this new model arrived for me to try. The Summit Allsport was launched in Q4 of 2020 but the pandemic put pay to any significant launch, so only now is the gun getting the publicity that it rightly deserves.

I really like Guerini guns, they are always a joy to shoot and I find that my scores are always good with them and I have to say that the Summit was no exception to this rule. As you would expect from a quality gun manufacturer, the first impressions were not disappointing. The bright red branded ABS case opens to show a nicely figured stock with

a gloss oil finish, branded velvet stock and barrel sleeves, and a collection of tools for adjustment and branded multi-choke box. The action is a very classy looking black colour with light scroll engraving and the Caesar Guerini name in gold on the sides. Underneath is the model name embossed in gold again.

Handling the gun and things get better still, the fore-end is really sturdy with crisp chequering and it fills the hand nicely. The palm swell on the stock is exceedingly comfortable and the 32" barrels

effortless to move. It balanced and came up to the shoulder very well. The rib is both tapered and ventilated, and also has a flat channel or tramline running through the middle – this feature really focuses the eye down the rib. I liked it and I found it really helped with target acquisition. The longest of crossing targets on the ground at Coley's were easy to deal with and with a choice of eight (yes eight!) chokes there wasn't a single target that the Summit did not excel at. I found the Monte-Carlo

adjustable stock really easy to shoot, with minimal adjustment required to get the perfect fit for me.

The Allsport spec is a combination of some of the best elements of the Guerini Sporting models – resulting in the ultimate performance gun for all disciplines. Essentially, it's the adjustable comb Monte-Carlo style stock from the Ascent Sporting put on to a standard Sporter model. Not surprisingly, DTL shooters may well be drawn towards this but it's equally impressive on a Sporting layout.

The Summit Allsport weighs around 8lbs, is proofed for steel shot, and comes with 70mm chambers as standard and 14 3/4" stock. It's a fantastic gun and with a retail price of just under £3,500 it's really well priced and offers a feature-laden quality gun at a really competitive price. Guerini also offer a ten year warranty

as standard. A 30" barrel version is also available too. It's very hard to pick out anything that I didn't like about this gun, the rubber heel pad did snag a little when mounting the gun and I'm not a massive fan of the fore-end release button, but they are tiny issues really in the grand scheme of things.

The Summit Allsport is bound to become a strong player in the mid-market Sporting gun sector. The Allsport spec is also available in the Invictus range too if your budget is a little larger. It's always a pleasure to shoot a Guerini and the Summit Allsport is a gun definitely worthy of your attention.

We spoke to **Dawn Queen** about Harboro Rocks Clay Shoot, and what goes on at this beautiful, rocky setting.



Q When did Harboro Rocks Clay Shoot open and what makes it special?

A: The ground first opened in the early 80s as a local club shoot known as Bakewell & Wirksworth Clay Pigeon Club. In the early 2000's it was taken on by Rolls Royce as a private clay shoot.

We took on the lease around 2012 with plans to resurrect this beautiful shoot set amongst stunning topography, and turn it into one of the best loved grounds in the Derbyshire Dales.

It is set on a rocky magnesium limestone outcrop with a top altitude of 1,300ft above sea level, with stunning scenery overlooking Carsington

Water. Harboro Rocks throws up its own challenges, sometimes presenting four seasons in one day with winds which can quite possibly make our simulated pheasant drives some of the most challenging targets you can find in the UK. Our ground is set in a natural amphitheatre simply designed for shooting.

Harboro Rocks is all about a community spirit with a friendly and welcoming atmosphere for all, making it a 'Shooters' Shoot'.

Q What disciplines/facilities/events do you offer around the ground?

A: We offer Sporting, Sportrap, simulated

training – some of our shooters take advantage of this when coming to shoot.

We also pride ourselves on our hospitality – full English breakfast on arrival, elevenses, a four course lunch, afternoon tea, and cakes.

Q **How has the ground developed over the years?**

A: We have had the ground coming up to ten years now and the last two years have seen massive changes, from a straw bale shoot to a top simulated game shoot (as featured in a recent *Guns On Pegs* article).

We have invested in new bases for stands, seating, and event shelters for our Simulated Game Day hospitality.

We are in the process of building a large terrace area at the front of the clubhouse which will provide a lovely sun deck on which to relax and take refreshments, while gazing out over some of Derbyshire's finest countryside.

Q **Are you planning any events for 2021?**

A: Our Summer Series began on 2 May and will run until October. Webley & Scott have kindly donated a 900B Black action 12g gun package as a prize. Rather than this being the prize for High Gun, we are giving everyone the chance of winning this. All they need do is enter four out of the six shoots for their names to be entered into the prize draw.

On 1 August we are holding a memorial shoot for one of our members who sadly lost his fight with cancer last year. The Sean Smith Memorial Shoot will be a Charity Clay Shoot for

the *Hope Against Cancer Clinic* in Leicester where Sean was treated.

We will have a number of have-a-go stands which will be purely for raising funds for Sean's charity and for introducing new shooters to the sport. For the 75-target Sporting competition, the High Gun will be the holder of the Sean Smith Memorial Trophy for one year and there will also be a gundog competition and various charity raffle prizes. This will be an annual event.

Q **Is there anything else you would like to add about Harboro Rock Clay Shoot?**

A: We have a further Demo

day with Webley & Scott on the last day of our summer series on 3 October 2021 where the winner of the gun package will receive their prize. We have also recently become authorised resellers of Ridgeline Clothing, Vario Hearables, and Gumleaf boots.

Additionally we offer gift vouchers via our website which can be used against all shooting disciplines and gifts.

9 May: English Sporting Championship




19-23 May: CPSA English Open English Sporting Championships





He set one Trap shooting beginner on her journey to Commonwealth Games medals and supported many others on their journeys to county and international careers. I know that we were all touched by his care for an elderly Tony Manning, enabling Tony to keep shooting well into his 90s.

In later years he took to a different sort of shooting – taking wonderful photographs of aeroplanes as well as other subjects.

A multi-talented man. Rod was a true gentleman in every sense of the word. He was gentle and quiet of manner and would help anyone he could. He will be missed by so many; Lesley will miss her soul mate and we will all miss a valued friend.

Rod's wife Lesley would like to express her gratitude to Philip Barnard for all his help and support, he has been a real rock for her. He has given unstintingly of his time, spoke to her every day, looked after all the arrangements that had to be made, and he took her to make her final visit to the hospital when Rod died. She could not have coped without him.



FIFTY YEARS OF FUN

We spoke to **Tony Heeks** who has retired as CPSA North Region Director after 26 years.

Q **Can you tell us about your shooting career?**

I started shooting 50 odd years ago at Leek Gun Club in Staffordshire, just once a month to begin with, then twice a month, and before long I was going all the time.

After a while I started to shoot for Staffordshire, which was a great honour, then I went on to shoot for England in 1979 and for ten years afterwards until I had a heart attack and couldn't carry on.

Once I recovered enough to get out and about again, I managed the England team for 19 years at the same time as I joined the CPSA Board of Directors as the North Region Director. I have been doing that for the last 26 years.

This was my way of giving something back to the sport because it had been good to me and I never won enough money to cover my shooting costs either! I stopped shooting as much when I took the Director's job but I was still out every weekend doing what Directors do – covering a lot of miles and presenting a lot of awards.

Since then I have been shooting Sporttrap at North of England Clay Target Club, run by Phil Thompson. I only

do practice now so that I can take my time and have a sit down between rounds. Shooting is addictive and I can't see anyone not liking it – I used to shoot game, rabbits, ducks, etc, but I stopped shooting live about 12 years ago because I couldn't bring myself to shoot anything live anymore.

Q **How have you seen the sport change over time?**

Shooting didn't change a lot up until the year 2000, as we had only won one medal from the Mexico 1968 Olympics. Since then we have had Ian Peel win Trap silver in Sydney 2000, Richard Faulds win Double Trap gold in Sydney 2000, Peter Wilson won Double Trap gold at the London 2012 Olympics, and then in 2016 Ed Ling won Bronze in Trap and Steve Scott won bronze in Double Trap.'

All of these are great achievements and it is such a shame so much of our sport has been postponed in the last 18 months.

Q **What has been the biggest challenge?**

The biggest challenge for me – there hasn't really been any. I've changed a lot in myself and I have had the backing from a lot of people so I guess really my biggest challenge was having the heart attack and getting right again afterwards.

I have also been to three CPSA member's funerals which is never enjoyable – particularly that of John Hall. We were very good friends and we would get together five or six times a year for barbecues with the family.

Q **Do you have any plans for after you retire?**

I don't have any plans for after retirement really, I'll just carry on shooting I guess. I've never been into coaching – I don't believe in teaching without the proper qualifications as qualified coaches are all singing from the same hymn sheet, so when you don't know what

you're doing, you could do more damage than good.

Q **Is there anything you would like to add, that we haven't mentioned?**

I have met a lot of nice people along the way – I know George Digweed and Richard Faulds well and I have a lot of respect for them. They have worked very hard and deserve everything they have got for their dedication. I have had some good times with the CPSA and have travelled all over the country, and I would like to thank everybody for their support.

The CPSA are a great group of people and I must give credit to all the staff as a lot of people see shoots as a weekend break but the staff are up first thing in the morning until last thing at night and often don't even have time to eat!

Q **How would you sum up your time working with the CPSA?**

It's been a good crack – I have had a very good career and I have really enjoyed it. Really, really enjoyed it.
