SUPER SPORTING – NOW A REGISTERED DISCIPLINE

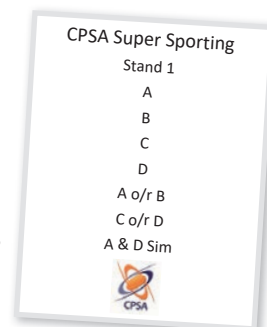
As part of our ongoing development of the sport, we are delighted to confirm that Super Sporting (SSP) is now a CPSA Registered discipline, effective from 1 December 2021. The difference between English Sporting and Super Sporting is that there can be up to four traps on each stand, giving the course setter freedom to put on a variety of targets on each stand. These can include single targets, on report pairs, following pairs, and sim pairs, as per our sample menu board pictured right. Essentially you could shoot a round of 100 targets with no two shots being the same!

As a newly-registered discipline, we have decided

to use the ESP cut-off points from

issue 64 initially until such time as sufficient scores have been received for its own cut-off points to be determined. During this period all shooters will be unclassified and will be classified on the day using the CPSA's Shoot program. Once a shooter has registered three 100 scores, a temporary classification will be immediately issued and this will be formalised at the next classification issue.

The CPSA were delighted to award John Nightingale from Rugby & District

Trap Club with his CPSA Life Vice Presidency on Saturday 30 October at the CPSA AGM. John is a worthy recipient of the award, having spent over 30 years running Rugby & District and we send our warmest congratulations for his achievement.

Many thanks to Paul Fallon for his tribute to John's achievement and contribution to our sport: "Many of us have known John over the years as an ever present part of our shooting community. His participation and contribution to our sport has been multi-faceted, with the more public face being his role as a very capable and accomplished competitor – both domestically and internationally. At the same time as enjoying our sport himself, many know John in his role as a ground owner. His best-known venture, Rugby & District Trap Club, has been a much loved and enjoyed facility in the midlands for the past 33 years. Throughout that time John has developed a first-class facility with a strong following.

"Probably less well-known will be John's contribution behind the scenes. For as long as anyone can recall he has been Chairman of the Warwickshire CPSA and at the same time has been part of the West Midlands CPSA as a committee member and County representative. He has also been part of the board of the BICTSF.

"Regardless of his role or level of participation he has been a great ambassador for Clay Shooting. He has given his time freely over a sustained period, providing his guidance and advice together with plenty of encouragement to those around him for the benefit of individuals who have known and come into contact with him and also to the benefit and development of the sport over the years."

Rugby and District Trap Club will sadly be coming to a close in 2022 as a result of a change in ownership of the land on which the club operates. John has run the club here for 33 years following an earlier venture near Stoneleigh. A few years ago the Clubhouse suffered a major fire and was destroyed. It was rebuilt and resurrected by John and his team to recover stronger and better than ever. The club has always operated more as a passion and hobby interest for John rather than as a business, his business interests being as a motorcycle dealership in Rugby. He has always encouraged our Junior members, providing free entry for them and his ground has also hosted many have-a-go events for newcomers to try out clay shooting.

His time as Chairman of Warwickshire defeats even the memory of Bob Kibblewhite who cannot recall anyone else in the chair, and as you probably know, Bob was part of the inaugural county committee in the early 70s and has been part of the committee even to this present day."

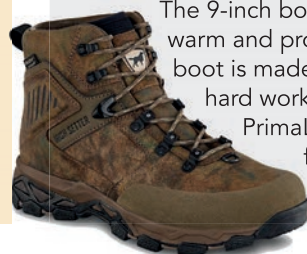

LETTER OF THE MONTH

I think Gray Dudek's letter published in the November/December issue of *Pull!* was very powerful and reflects my experience entirely. I came to shooting in my 50s because my son, then age 12, wanted to shoot. We had a joint lesson as novices and were both hooked. Both of us have been shooting now for the best part of ten years.

My regret is not starting earlier and I have so much pride watching my son shoot so well, even though he regularly beats me with no apparent effort on his part.

My real reason for writing is that I think Gray is clearly describing a proactive strategy that would potentially greatly enhance the reach and appeal of shooting as a sport.

All of our experience is that one introductory event can – and does – spark a very bright fire and desire to progress and get involved in shooting.

So with this in mind the idea of generating a CPSA fund to provide a free first lesson for young people interested in shooting seems a great idea. Could this be something that we could take out to schools, universities and colleges, sports clubs, youth organisations, etc as a specific offering – namely a set number of absolutely free lessons to introduce young people to shooting as a sport?

This may well have the dual effect of showing shooting in a positive light (publicity), creating advocates in those who have experienced the offering and potentially identifying the next British Olympic champion.

I would be more than happy to support a voluntary contribution, or perhaps even as a small additional charge to the subscription, to develop such a program.

We are all worried about the future of the sport and this seems to be a good option to provide a strategy for proactive positive action which increases the sports profile and it's reach.

You are quite right in that it can be as easy as just one have-a-go session to ignite the fire and start a lifetime's passion for shooting

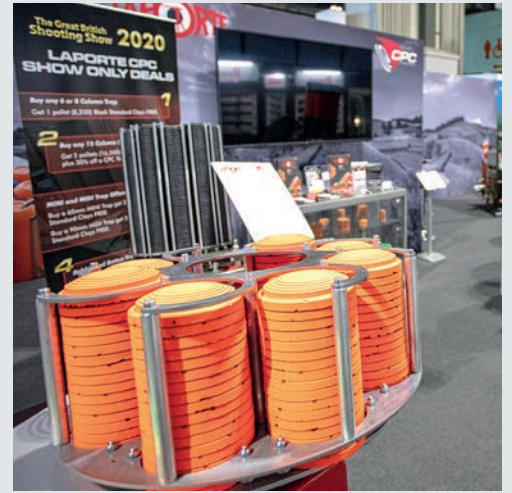

NATIONAL INTER-COUNTIES ENGLISH SKEET

South East Regional Director **Peter Saich** reports back on the event on 16-17 October 2021 at The National Clay Shooting Centre in Bisley.

Twelve teams contested the 2021 National Inter-Counties English Skeet, held over two days at the National Clay Shooting Centre in Bisley. The NCSC is undergoing refurbishment and had just installed a total of 75 new Promatic traps and the whole range had been given an early spring clean and was looking great.

The shooting got off to a rainy start with dark skies on Saturday morning, but the targets remained consistent with very little wind, and there were three 100-straight recorded during the day. David Roling shot 100-straight at Dartford in the morning, then drove across to Surrey and scored another. Joining him at the top of the leader board was Ross Elgie, then on the last squad of the afternoon, Richard King added another perfect ton. Steve Lovell started with a 24, then cleared the rest to record a personal best of 99.

The rain held off on Sunday and the wind remained light, with target quality again consistent, but one by one the serious challengers fell by the wayside.

There were also 99's from Gary Cooke and Jonathan Cain but there were no more 100's.

David Roling and Richard King returned for the shoot-off to decide the High Gun, but Ross elected not to travel down again. Richard missed a target on station three, and uncharacteristically missed the repeat. David dropped a target on station four, then did not miss any more, leaving Richard no chance to catch up. Individual High Gun was David Roling on 100 + 24,

Runner-up was Richard King on 100 S/O, third place Ross Elgie on 100 by default. Steve Leppington scored 98 in the Veteran's class on Saturday, and this was matched by Bill Moussalli on Sunday. Neither were present for the shoot-off, so Steve

was elected Veteran Champion on countback.

Shooting on the Sunday, Megan Jones scored 96 to lead the Ladies ahead of Isabel Cartlidge on 94. Ceyla Ismet was third with 91. Megan was also top Junior, with Kian Maher just one target behind on 95. Third was Sonny Bowman with 93. Top Colt score was Isabel Cartlidge with her 94, second was Barney Eastman on 91, and Oakley Reynolds was third with 89.

Honours in the team event were shared between four counties. The winning Senior team was Yorkshire with 493 / 500, Runners-up were Warwickshire on 482, and third was Essex with 476.

It was a very close finish in the Veteran's Team section, with Cambridgeshire scoring 188, and Warwickshire and Sussex in joint second with 187. The Ladies event was also very close. Cheshire won with 180,

WORLD HELICE CHAMPIONSHIP

Report from the 31st Helice World Championships held in Cairo 13-17 October 2021.

A cohort of 17 British shooters flew to Cairo for the 31st Helice World Championships held from 13-17 October. With a large entry of 321 shooters representing 14 nations, two Britains would emerge as World Champions. Dionne Rogers won the Ladies World Championship, and Cliff Goodwin the Seniors.

The event was held at a brand new, purpose-built shooting complex, part of the new Administrative Capital of Cairo, and the venue is out of this world with every facility taken care of and ten Helice, Trap, and Skeet layouts stretching for over a kilometre.

The week started well for both shooters, with Dionne winning the Ladies Egyptian Grand Prix outright on the Wednesday with a score of 17/20. Cliff had to endure a six-way shoot-off after scoring 16 in the Seniors, but managed to walk away with bronze.

Next up was the African Championship with Dionne again winning outright with 22/30. Cliff did not podium this time but finished joint fourth on 24/30 behind fellow British Seniors Fergy Watson-Hopkinson (silver) and Frank Gammon (bronze) both on 25. Chris Potter took silver in the masters category.

In the World Championships, Dionne shot 12/15 on day one and 13/15 on day

two to win Ladies outright on 25/30. Cliff straightened day one with a 15 and, after a sleepless night, managed a 13 on day two to win the Seniors category outright by a single target.

For Dionne this, her eighth World Championship win, was especially sweet as she has been working hard to recover top form after a difficult year.

For Cliff, this was his first individual world title after taking International team gold three times before, and individual silver on two occasions.

It was a good performance all round from team GB, with many other shooters making it into medal positions, including Howard Batt gold in Egyptian Grand Prix, Fergus Watson Hopkinson, Frank Gammon, Chris Potter, with father-and-son duo Tim and Mason Rickard coming so close, with Tim narrowly missing out after a shoot-off. New Veteran caps Paul Colley and Steven Keyte also took silver in the team

event with Chris Potter.

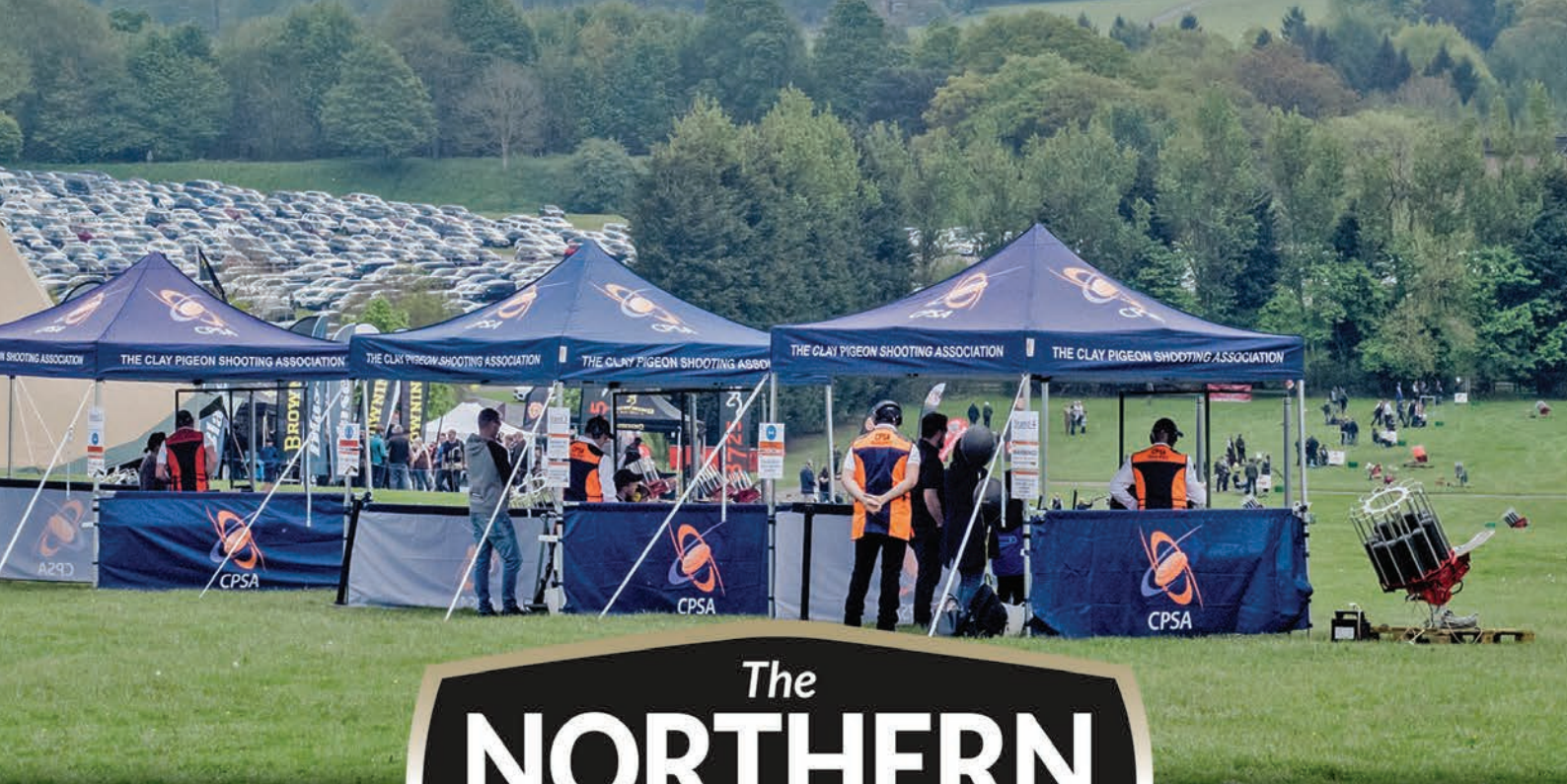

Sarah Daly reports on events around the world.

ISSF PRESIDENT'S CUP (FORMALLY THE WORLD CUP FINAL) CYPRUS 19-24 OCT

Qualification:

The top 12 athletes from the 2021 World Ranking (WR) after the 2020 Tokyo Olympic Games were invited to participate in the President's Cup, with a total prize fund published at \$859,200.

Athletes competed in individual and mixed team events. International mixed teams were formed randomly in accordance with a draw.

Individual winners received the 'golden target' as the Best Athlete of the Year award.

GBR was represented by Matt Coward-Holley (WR 3) and Amber Hill (WR 6). A kicker for Kirsty Hegarty who just missed out on an invitation, being ranked 13th.

The competition ran an experimental format, briefly:

Qualification: 50 targets with the top eight shooters going into the semi finals.

Semi Finals: 25 targets Trap/24 targets Skeet. Two squads of four, the top two from each squad progressed to the gold medal match.

Gold Medal Match: 35 targets Trap/36 targets Skeet.

Amber shot 48ex50 in the qualifying rounds, making the semi-finals but unfortunately did not make the finals.

Along with three other athletes, Matt shot 50ex50 in qualification, finishing second in the shoot off for the semi-finals, he then went on to qualify for the Gold Medal Match with Jiri Liptak (CZE),

David Kostecky (CZE), and Gennadii Mamkin (RUS).

Mamkin was ruled out at the 15 target stage which left the same three athletes from the Olympic finals to battle it out for the President's Cup. Matt shot an absolute blinder, leading the field at the 20 target mark with only one target away, followed by Kostecky and Liptak respectively. But, in the last five targets of the deciding break for the bronze medal,

Matt dropped three targets, including one disputed call which was sadly not upheld.

Matt has achieved a truly phenomenal season – World and European

Champion plus bronze in the Olympic Games and President's Cup, not to mention a couple of medals in the mixed team events and still only 26 years old!

The British Shooting Trap coach, Marco Micheli, commented: “Of course, the standard was very high as the top 12 shooters in the world were competing, but Matt put in a very good performance, he had to shoot 50-straight just to make the semi-finals.

“The tension was very high throughout the event, and we thought just missing one target could have cost Matt the finals but he didn't miss. The results of the President's

Cup confirmed the top-three shooters of the world.”

On the test event finals format, Marco commented: “It's different, I liked the mixed event. A small issue for the individual finals could be, if the semi-finals are not televised at the Olympics, then only the four competitors in the finals would be broadcast to the world, which reduces the visibility of the athletes and the sport, which would be disappointing.

“One thing is for sure; the best athletes will still find a way to break the targets and be on the podium!”

FITASC RULE CHANGES FOR 2022

President FITASC Referees Commission **Hugh Smith** informs us of the FITASC discipline rules changes agreed for 2022 at the 2021 FITASC OGA, held virtually on 1 Oct 2021.

The FITASC governing body routinely holds its Ordinary General Assembly (OGA) prior to the World FITASC Sporting Championships in the country of the host nation for that event.

With the worldwide pandemic continuing to affect travel, the 2021 OGA was again held as a video conference on 1 Oct 2021. However, although reduced in content, there was an allocated agenda place for all the FITASC discipline rules to be reviewed.

The discipline rules review affected Universal Trench, Helice, and Compak Sporting.

UNIVERSAL TRENCH

There were a number of new and amended rules for Universal Trench that include: New 5.15 Withdrawal of a competitor during the event whereby the competitor must inform the event administrator. If they fail to do so FITASC will notify the federation of the competitor leading to possible future penalties.

Chapter 6 Refereeing

has many changes and inclusions throughout; briefly, changes to protests, auxiliary referees required, and the master scoreboard.

Chapter 11.06

has changes dealing with a late competitor – either shooting by squad or by

line – and the associated penalties that will be applied.

HELICE

Chapters 2.8.2.2 and 2.8.2.3 are changes to a Helice shoot-off. Changes to 6.5 and 6.6 Shooting Procedures, clarify the time limits (20sec) a competitor has when shooting manual and sonopull release systems.

COMPAK SPORTING

Chapter 17.4 and 17.5 inform the referees how to start the competition by squad or by line. It is a major change to showing the targets at the beginning of a Compak by Line event and a small change to Compak by Squad. It is intended to reduce the number of 'show' targets and is particularly aimed at simultaneous doubles.

Briefly, the first competitor will be shown all the single targets A-F from shooting position 1. Then they will be shown the complete double(s) if simultaneous, before any shooting takes place. A maximum of two show targets will be allowed.

The position of the referee with the hand release controller will be on the left of position 1 until all shooting positions (5 off) are occupied.

The purpose of the hand controller referee is to show to the next competitor in position 1, the first target of their double(s) in menu

order until all the shooting positions have a competitor; this also applies to report doubles where no doubles are shown.

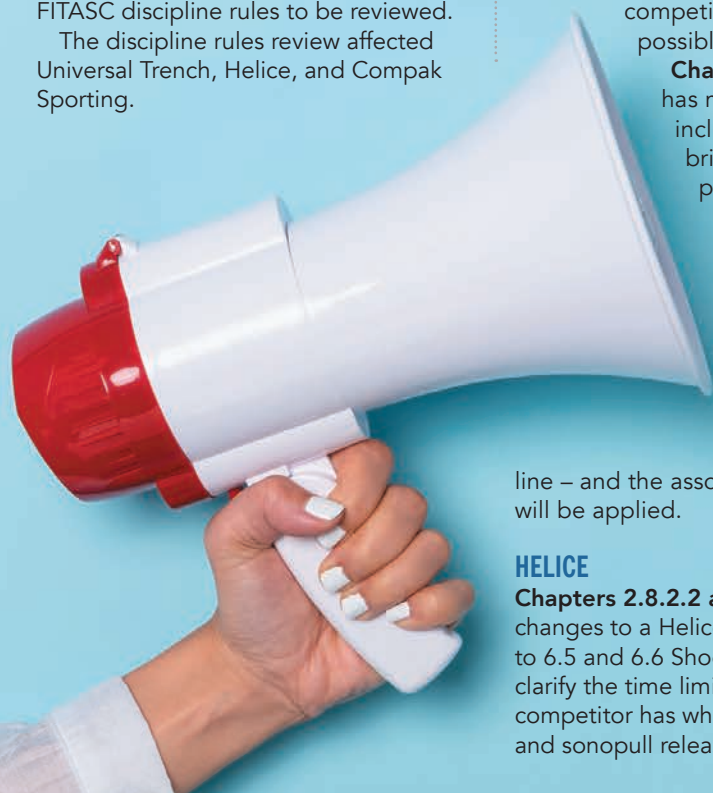
In addition to the rules changes, there was a move by FITASC to close the loophole currently being exploited by suspended competitors from FITASC member federations. Competitors who have been suspended by their home federation have been known to join another federation (another country) and use that membership to enter FITASC governed events.

FITASC will, in the future, require the names of suspended competitors to be passed to FITASC by the relevant member federation. FITASC will then suspend those competitors for a period that reflects the period that the competitor is suspended from by their home federation.

It is the responsibility of the federation concerned to pass to FITASC the above information on suspended members of their federation.

The rules for 2022 will be available in due course on the FITASC website for all the FITASC disciplines.

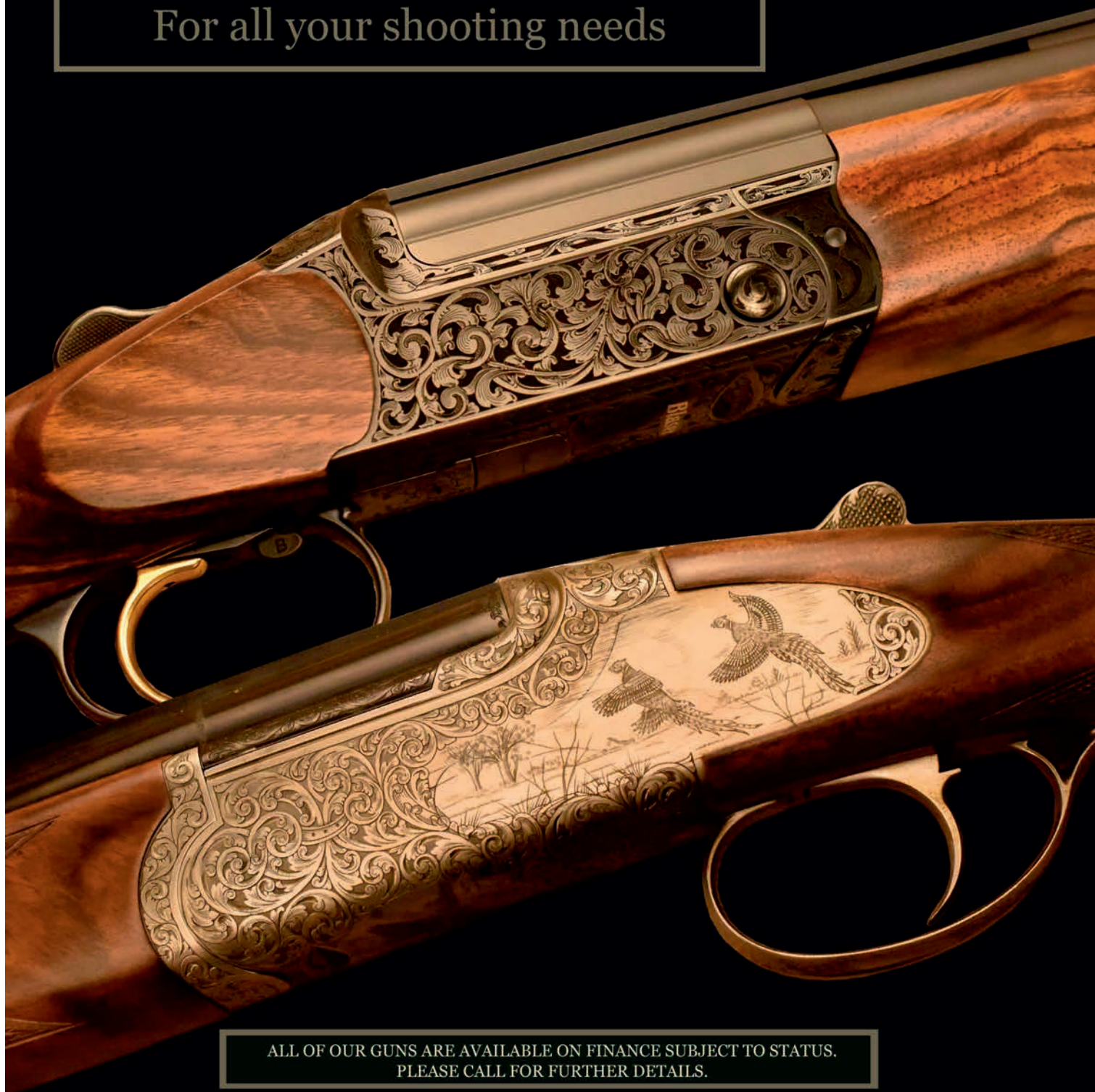

I would definitely like to thank my dad Phil for his mental and financial support – I wouldn't be where I am without him. I would also

like to thank my partner Nadina and our kids for putting up with me being away weekend after weekend, and of course my sponsors Kelly and Scott at Dartford Clay Shooing Club, and Magnus at MCT Sporting – again my shooting wouldn't be possible without

I shoot a Caesar Guerini Black Summit 30". It is a great gun and my shooting has definitely improved since I got it in August last year.

For cartridges, I use Hull's Pro One's. It is a lovely cartridge which is hard hitting and smooth.

ON SOLID GROUND

Running our top shooting grounds has been more challenging than ever over the last two years but, as **Martin Puddifer** discovers, the people at the helm are up to the task.

From trap maintenance and planning staff rotas, to ordering cartridges and cutting the grass, there are many tasks that occupy the daily agendas of shooting ground managers

and their teams. Preparation is always key if things are to run to schedule, especially when hosting a major event, so how do those grounds that are nationally renowned for offering tens of thousands of shooters the best visitor experience keep doing so year in year out? Let's take running competitions as an example.

Having a passionate and professional team around you is a good start. It's something not lost on Daniel Martin, who has run Orston Shooting Ground in Nottinghamshire with his wife Emily since 2016.

Orston hosted the Compak English Open last June and hundreds of hours of planning were required to ensure the ground was prepared: "We have a fantastic team who are meticulous in ensuring all

our equipment is fully maintained and fine tuned for the event ahead – through to the formatting and timings to ensure a seamless and enjoyable experience to all our competitors," says Daniel.

"Communication throughout is also key and we run two radio channels, one solely for our referees/scorers and the other for the event management team, which includes grounds staff and the head office."

THE COURSE SETTING JIGSAW

Rob Fenwick, the Managing Director of E.J. Churchill, which hosted the CPSA World English Sporting and Sportrap Championships last July, holds himself and his staff to the highest standards. Catering and hospitality are key components to the major competitions held in this picturesque corner of Buckinghamshire, creating the 'spectacle' Rob feels they should be, his vision greatly influenced by the late Mike Brunton BEM's Clay Shooting Classics. While he insists expectations often

need to be managed, everything from catering to car parking, greeting hundreds of visitors to getting the course layout right is scrutinised beforehand.

"We have always had this desire and passion to make them great, but you learn so much over time," explains Rob.

"You have to listen to what the shooters want and you will get many opinions, most of whom have no idea what it takes or costs to achieve what they would like. It is your job to work out what is feasible and what can be delivered. When you look at the terrain of West Wycombe Estate you think you can do so much, but you then overlay all the footpaths, the direction of the sun, houses, farms, livestock, crops etc that you have to avoid or not shoot towards and it becomes very difficult. Most people don't even know about these issues and so it makes the job of course setting really hard."

SWEATING THE SMALL STUFF

In Leicestershire, Kibworth Shooting Ground is getting used to holding CPSA registered events again after a short hiatus. Just like at E.J. Churchill and Orston, the staff at Kibworth, including Ruby Smith and Ground Manager Matt Richmond know the value of sweating the small stuff.

"We begin preparations at least a week in advance with the most important being to ensure that all our targets are competition ready," they explained. "Whilst we pride ourselves on changing our targets on a weekly basis for normal practice

it is imperative that there is a wide variety of clays that are challenging for all classes. We are all here first thing on the morning of the competition to do a final check of the targets. We make sure we have

more than enough clays left by every trap for speedy refills so that no shooters are kept waiting. All batteries

are changed before the competition begins in order to minimise the chances of any breakdowns.

We have to register all of our referees well in advance and also enter our competitors onto the system to enable scores to be submitted to the CPSA on the day of the shoot.

Score cards are written out prior to the event, too."

DELEGATION IS THE KEY

No ground manager is an island and Stuart Smith, the Managing Director of Eriswell Lodge in Suffolk, which hosted the last four

World Skeet Masters, trusts in his own abilities as well as those of his staff when competitions come around: "I think that over time we have become more confident with large competitions and events, but at no time have we become complacent," says Stuart who, along with his father Nigel, appreciate the value of a welcoming atmosphere. "We still have a lot of planning sessions amongst the senior staff team, and then each department has its own meetings to plan their specific aspects of the event – as the business has grown this has become the norm, rather than having one meeting to address everything. We have the teams in place with ►

the skill set required to deliver each part of the event, which allows the senior staff to operate in more of a guiding role – which we firmly believe helps us to deliver a higher quality event. I have learned not to stress too much (it solves nothing) and to delegate more.”

FACING DOWN CHALLENGES

While preparation is everything, even the best laid plans are vulnerable to the unexpected. It may be six months since the last lockdown restrictions were lifted but Coronavirus continues to have a hand in the day-to-day running of shooting grounds nationwide. Losing people who are integral to the operation is never ideal, especially if they were a challenge to find in the first place.

“Getting good people who want to work hard and share your vision is really tough,” says Rob Fenwick: “We have a great team, but are constantly looking for more good people to help them. As we are in the service industry they always need to be on good form and really care for the ground and all the clients we see. There is no let up and no excuses, it is hard work and we need to be on our game.”

PUTTING SMILES ON FACES

With change, such as the demographics of clay shooting, becoming more apparent, shooting grounds also need to move with the times, something very close to the hearts of the team at Kibworth Shooting Ground: “We have learnt the importance of creating an inclusive environment which appeals to all shooters of all levels of skill, instead of only to the relatively few AA class shots there are. We really want to encourage people to love shooting as much as we do and not feel as though they have to be a

professional to get the same level of enjoyment from it.”

Despite all of the challenges they have faced and continue to face – cartridge prices, lead shot and plastic wads are currently dominating chatter in the clubhouse but are issues out of their hands – watching experienced and novice shots enjoying their shooting is still hugely rewarding.

“The clearest indication that we must be doing a good job is the number of our customers that we see week in week out; we get to know them as individuals and they get to know us as well,” says Ruby. Stuart Smith from Eriswell Lodge concurs: “We all absolutely love to see people with smiles on their faces, having fun – a lot of our team are shooters too, so they like to hear how people have been getting on.” 🍌

MEET THE JUNIORS OF BERKSHIRE

The Berkshire CPSA committee reformed at the beginning of 2021, signalling a much-needed return to competition success for the County's clay target shooters. Like all counties, Berkshire is keen to build a strong talent pool of Junior shooters. Berkshire CPSA Treasurer **Richard Bodley-Scott** speaks to some of Berkshire's emerging champions of tomorrow.



AMELIA BOWE

Age: 19

Discipline: English Sporting

Q How did you first start clay target shooting? **A:** I first started when I was about 15 with my dad, Steve Bowe, although it was only very occasionally. I've now been shooting regularly for the last two years, but lockdown and education have limited the time I can go shooting. I used to enjoy archery but was fascinated by moving targets, so my

dad suggested I have a go at clay target shooting. I started going to Registered shoots with my dad and his friend Will Hewland, both are really good shots, and they encouraged me to shoot more. Will gave me some coaching to get me started and I quickly gained in confidence.

Q What was your first shotgun?

A: My dad had an old 20 bore Browning Medallist which he let me use. It was a brilliant starter shotgun and it suited me well because I was quite small.

I made good progress with the Browning, but I soon started to outgrow it. We looked at lots of shotguns and I settled on a 12 bore Beretta 686 Silver Pigeon with 28 inch barrels. I just felt really comfortable with it which is so important when choosing a shotgun. Although I've continued to make progress, I now think I'm ready to upgrade to something newer.

Q What is your preferred discipline?

A: I really enjoy English Sporting and consider it to be my main discipline. There are lots of shoots available at

weekends and sometimes during the week too. Because ESP is so readily available, it is easy to find competitions or just go somewhere to practice. My favourite grounds are E.J. Churchill in High Wycombe, College Farm in Aylesbury, Ian Coley in Cheltenham, Barbury Shooting School near Swindon, and Honesberie Shooting School near Rugby. I've been to Redricks Sporting Clays in Hertfordshire a couple of times which can be very challenging but enjoyable. I've just started to study at Cardiff University so my opportunities to go shooting will be limited. I love encouraging other young people to try the sport and so I might end up going into a coaching role in the future.

Q What advice would you give to someone who would like to have a go?

A: Book some starter lessons with a shooting ground. They can supply guns, cartridges, and all the safety equipment, so you don't have to worry about supplying your own. It's a really friendly sport and everyone is helpful and supportive. The registered shoots are fun, and you always meet lots of interesting and talented people.



KATY ESSEX

Age: 12

Discipline: Olympic Skeet

Q How did you first start clay target shooting?

A: When I was nine my dad used to shoot at West London Shooting School and one day I asked if I could go with him. He booked me some lessons with Chris Douneen and Micky Rouse, and I was soon shooting at Sporting targets. Before long I started to hit a few clays. After a couple of lessons I was totally hooked and we started going regularly which I really enjoyed. The instructors were always very friendly and made me feel very confident and safe with a shotgun.

Q What was your first shotgun? **A:** My dad bought me a single barrel 0.410 which suited me very well. It was a good size gun for me and quite light. After a while, I switched to a Beretta 687 20 bore with a short stock. I used this gun for about a year, and it helped me learn a good technique. I now have a multichoke Winchester 12 bore which I'm really happy with and hope to keep for a while.

Q Which discipline do you prefer to shoot?

A: I started shooting Sporting and didn't really know much about other disciplines. We had a go at English Skeet at NCSC once and I thought this was brilliant and I shot it quite well. When we were there, the Berkshire ESK Team Captain asked me if I would like to shoot in an ESK competition. I didn't know it at the time, but the competition was the Berkshire County ESK competition and I won the Colts category. I was really pleased to achieve this after shooting ESK for such a short time. While I was at NCSC, I started watching Olympic Skeet. Katy Poulsom from British Shooting was there, and my dad booked a lesson with her. I now shoot Olympic Skeet regularly and I hope to join the British Shooting development pathway next year. I am only at the beginning of my shooting journey, but I want to progress and shoot bigger competitions in a year or two. One day I would like to be good enough to represent my country.

Q What advice would you give to someone who would like to have a go?

A: Don't be afraid to have a go, book a lesson with an instructor at your local ground and learn the basics. People always want to help young shooters, and everyone is so friendly. ►



HARRY POOLMAN

Age: 15

Discipline: Olympic Trap

Q How did you start shooting?

A: About three years ago I had a football injury which stopped me playing for a while, so I went pigeon shooting with my dad and I really enjoyed it. After a while I wanted to try clay shooting, so he took me to Flightline Sporting Targets in Maidenhead. After several months I entered the annual Purdey Young Shots Sporting competition at Royal Berkshire Shooting School and was surprised to win overall High Gun and top boy! I realised I wanted to shoot at a higher level, so my mum contacted Tony Higham to arrange a lesson at NCSC. Tony helped me try several disciplines but as soon as I tried Olympic Trap I was hooked!

Q What was your first shotgun?

A: My first gun was a 12 bore Miroku 6000 Sporter which I used for everything, but as I got more into Olympic Trap I needed a more suitable gun for trap targets and bought a Miroku MK38 Trap and I started to make good progress. I have recently bought a new Trap gun which is a Caesar Guerini Invictus 1 Ascent which I hope to move to the next level with.

Q What is your preferred discipline?

A: I really enjoy Sporting targets and I continue to shoot Sporting whenever I can. However, Olympic Trap is now my discipline of choice because I enjoy the challenging targets. I have been fortunate enough to be selected to join the British Shooting Advanced Development Academy which enables me to train with other Juniors in the Olympic Trap discipline. I am working with Matt Coward-Holley to develop my competition skills and I hope, with hard work and regular practice, I will achieve my ambition of shooting for the junior GB Team! I now practice regularly at the National Clay Shooting Centre, Bisley, because I live quite close by and they have a good Olympic Trap range. I also shoot occasionally at Owls Lodge Shooting School near Winchester and E.J. Churchill in High Wycombe.

Q What advice would you give to someone who would like to have a go?

A: Go to your local shooting ground and book a lesson with an instructor. Once you have learnt the basics, try some different disciplines to see which you like the most. Don't be afraid to enter competitions, especially if you are a Colt or Junior shooter, you never know, you might just win something!



PHOEBE BODLEY-SCOTT

Age: 16
Discipline: Olympic Skeet

Q How did you first start shooting? A:

A couple of years ago my dad suggested I went clay shooting with him at the National Clay Shooting Centre, Bisley. I was 14 and had never held a gun before so I was a bit nervous but quite excited. My dad arranged a lesson with the Senior Coach, David Dale, and I was amazed when I soon started breaking some clays! I started going regularly with my dad and we entered the 2019 English Skeet Winter Series competition. This was my first competition and I scored 86ex100. The High gun was 96 so I was really pleased with my score!

In 2020 I signed up for one of the British Shooting Talent Identification Days which was held at the NCSC. I had a go at Olympic Skeet which was really fast, but I did ok. I joined the British Shooting Development Pathway which has been a brilliant experience and I have already made

some good friends. The Pathway has enabled me to train with other Juniors and to have the confidence to enter some bigger competitions. Recently, I was selected to move on to the Olympic Skeet Talent Academy programme where I hope to develop my skills further.

Q What was your first shotgun? A:

My first shotgun was a 20 bore Franchi Alcione with multi-chokes and a short stock, it was a great gun but I soon outgrew it. I was still quite small, and I needed something light and easy to handle so I bought a second hand Browning Liberty Light with an adjustable comb. As I grew and became stronger, I switched to a Beretta DT10 which is what I use today. My DT10 has an Ergosign adjustable stock which can easily be adjusted for correct gun fit.

Q Which discipline do you prefer to shoot? A:

I started shooting English Skeet which I still really enjoy. When I joined the Development Pathway, I switched to Olympic Skeet because the Pathways are trying to develop shooters in the international disciplines. This is now

my main discipline and I practice regularly with my coach, Katy Poulson. There are fewer Olympic Skeet ranges compared with most other disciplines, so I travel a lot for competitions. This year I have been to East Yorkshire Shooting Ground, Doveridge Shooting Ground, Gloucester Shooting Club, and Dartford Clay Shooting Club. I am now focussing on my winter training with my coach which will include physical fitness and technical aspects of shooting Olympic Skeet targets. If I keep making progress, I would like to shoot for my country and be selected for the Junior GB team!

Q What advice would you give to someone who would like to try the sport? A:

Go to a local shooting ground and book some lessons with an instructor. It's important to get the basics right and get advice on suitable guns and gun fit. Most off-the-shelf shotguns are designed for the average male, and most female shooters might need a different stock length and comb height. The first competition is always a bit scary, but everyone is so friendly and you'll get lots of support from other shooters.

Age: 14
Discipline: Olympic Trap

Q How did you first start clay target shooting? A:

My first experience of shooting was when my grandad took me to a pheasant shoot when I was nine years old, and I really enjoyed the day. The dogs were brilliant, and it was great to see them working. My grandad showed me how to hold the gun properly and taught me basic gun safety and then, on the last drive, he let me have a go. I was really keen to shoot some more so he booked me a lesson with John Heagren at Long Siberia shooting range, Bisley. Soon after, I entered my first DTL competition and I scored 70/100!

Q What was your first shotgun? A:

My first shotgun was a Browning 20 bore Medallist, it was a good first gun which I used for Sporting targets. I tried a few different guns then got a Fausti XF4 Sporter which I liked and

it helped me become more consistent with Trap targets. I then moved onto a Miruko MK38 for a while and I now shoot a Beretta DT11 Trap gun.

Q Which discipline do you prefer to shoot? A:

I like to shoot all Trap disciplines, but I like to shoot Olympic Trap most of all. I like the speed of the targets which are the fastest of all the shotgun disciplines. Last year, I joined the British

Shooting Development Pathway and started to learn more about Olympic trap. It's a good programme because I get to train with other Juniors and people of a similar age and ability. I have entered several competitions as part of the 2020 shotgun series, and I am pleased with my progress. I practice mainly at NCSC, Bisley but sometimes go to E.J. Churchill in High Wycombe. My coach is Rod Gould, and he is keen for me to stick with the same gun and get used to it. We are working hard on all aspects of my shooting especially the mental aspects as well as the physical. My ambition is to qualify for the Junior GB team!

Q What advice would you give to someone who would like to have a go? A:

Go out and have a go, don't worry about your scores, just get started and you'll learn along the way. Find a local shooting ground and book lessons with an instructor. It's important to learn about gun safety and handling so it becomes natural. 🦋

YOUNG SHOTS

HOW I GOT INTO SHOOTING

I have been exposed to shooting all my life, but first went beating at the age of 3 and it has grown from there. I can remember my grandma buying me a 410 at the age of seven and going down the fields to have ago at some clays, and from there I was hooked. At the time we started to build our own shooting ground, two years later I decided to try a 12 gauge with some soft cartridges and didn't want to shoot any other discipline other than DTL.

MY FAVOURITE SHOOTING MOMENT

My favourite moment so far would have to be shooting for England and then being High Gun of the Junior team at the Home International, as well as being Junior Runner-up out of the whole event. My biggest achievement would be getting on the England team at the age of 15 and being High Gun of the Junior team at the Home International.

TOBY'S TOP TIPS

- TIP 1** Enjoy yourself, no matter what your score is.
- TIP 2** Practice as regularly as you can and try the harder stands, pegs, and targets so you don't feel uncomfortable in competition.
- TIP 3** Focus on the target and yourself, ignore what happens around you and if your day is going good or bad.
- TIP 4** Get a good coach who understands you, and you in return respect, and have confidence in your own abilities.
- TIP 5** Be committed, but also take small breaks after big competitions as you need time to recuperate.



BRITISH OPEN AND ENGLISH OPEN DOUBLE RISE, AND THE ENGLISH OPEN AND BRITISH OPEN SINGLE BARREL

The English open came first for both disciplines and I have to say I was nervous, having never shot Double Rise before it was my first discipline of the day and I didn't know what to expect. But after the first targets had gone I felt much better, shooting a 38 and 42 to finish with 80/100. I was pleased with my score and didn't know if it was good or bad but I managed to win the Colts.

THREE WORDS TO DESCRIBE MYSELF

Competitive, polite, respectful.



I shot the single barrel in the afternoon and I thought I hadn't shot well but then realised one clay away only meant one point away and not three, so my score was 91/100.

I was extremely pleased that I had won Colts again as I thought it would be an easy score for someone else to beat.

The next day was the British Open and again I started with Double Rise, where I shot 44 and 44 to finish with 88/100. After I shot the Single Barrel my first round was alright with a 23, then my second round was 25. I went onto my third feeling sick and let two targets slip away doing another 23. Going into my last round I wasn't nervous at all, but as I moved to my last peg without dropping a target, I felt sick once again but managed to hold onto the 25 finishing with a 96/100. After this I thought it was all over but then I was asked to go to a layout for a shoot-off for first in B Class. I was incredibly nervous as it was my first shoot-off but I managed to shoot another 25-straight to win. I was unbelievably happy with the results of the weekend – especially as I had also won colts for the Single Barrel and Double Rise again.

Q When did the ground open and what makes Barbury shooting special?

wonderful corporate room for companies and the general public to use alongside our shooting facilities. We also have a fully stocked gunroom.

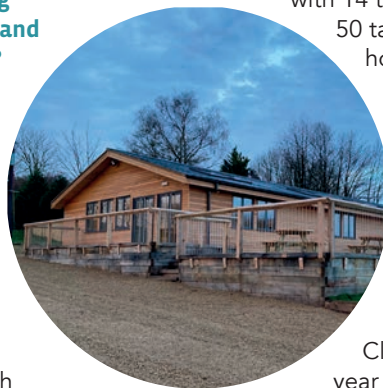
Q How did you find hosting your first English Open Sporting competition, and other events?

Lastly, check the weather regularly, as it is very prone to change over here.

Q Are you planning any events for 2022?

A: We are currently looking at our 2022 diary, but yes we have lots of exciting plans! As well as competitions, we also try and offer a good range of fun shoots for our members and club shooters in general. We host a large number of simulated days in the local area as well.

Q Is there anything else our readers should know about?

A: Thank you to all the shooters who have visited over the last 12 months, we appreciate it so much. It was a tricky start to the year but since reopening we have had a brilliant few months! 🍷

31 Oct: Cheshire County SKD Championship, Doveridge Clay Sports

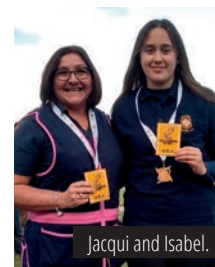
Kevin O'Reilly took the early lead with an amazing 94, and this could not be beaten. He was High Gun and Cheshire Champion.

17 Nov: Staffs CPSA on the Radio

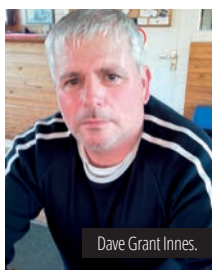
Following his success, Martin was interviewed by Phil Bowers on BBC Radio Stoke about securing the win and on how he got into the sport he loves.

MIKE FARQUHAR

Sportsmen up and down the Country will be saddened to hear the demise of Mike – a sporting countryman in every way – Shooting Instructor, Organiser of Loaders at top Game shoots around the Cotswolds, Fly Fisherman, International FITASC and Sporting Referee, Deer Stalker and general 'good egg' with the ability to get on with and be liked and remembered by everyone who met him – even serious clay shots when he called targets lost.

From a Naval upbringing in Scotland, educated at Cheltenham College, he abandoned working in the city in the mid 1970's, to work in the Oxford wine trade and part-time Gamekeeping on a shoot on the Bucks/Oxon borders.

At this time, I was establishing the Shooting Clinic and developing my team of specially retrained Shooting Instructors to give short duration sponsored shooting lessons to the general public at major Game and Country Fairs around the country, and Mike rapidly became my right-hand man. We tapped into a big opportunity and the tail wagged the dog to the extent our Show Circuit

expanded and we introduced some 4,000 individuals to shooting annually for over 30 years.

We were also asked to teach shooting and etiquette at Stowe and Cheltenham Independent Schools, taking teams to the National Independent Schools Championship annually and we produced both Male and Female individual National Champions.

Through the 1980's corporate clay pigeon shoots became big business and the Clinic's team of instructors were in demand all over the Country, with Mike and I travelling with the materials and equipment in a caravan and trailer, often involving evening journeys from one venue to the next, early morning setting up the shoot layout, and then running the day with assistance from our local Instructors. Through the 80's we were doing some 30 days at Country Fairs and 70 corporate days annually and we continued through the inflation mad 90's on a smaller scale.

Mike was a good shot with both shotguns and rifles, we went deer stalking locally together regularly – when we could fit it in with our other activities – and we made a point of heading to Scotland annually on 2 February for the final two weeks of the hind stalking season. We shot a lot of hinds, helping the estates to reach their cull targets, enjoyed a wee dram or two and the peaty bath water at the end of each day out on the hill.

More recently, Mike spent his summers refereeing clay shoots nationally and internationally and his winters loading for gentlemen on the major Cotswold Game shoots.

The shooting world is a poorer place without him, he leaves his wife Sue running the Farm in Herefordshire, his son Robert running the Gunshop in Ross-on-Wye, and his daughter Jo and six grandchildren. **Terry Fricker**

Mine was travelling the breadth and length of the Country to competitions, eventually joining CPSA as Executive Director, whilst Alan was the great organiser and thinking Committee man. He would spare no effort to administer, plan, and work tirelessly to make a success of

whatever event he became involved with. Alan became Chairman of the CPSA Devon County Committee, then later Chairman of the South West Regional Committee, and eventually joined CPSA's Management committee. In time, Alan was elected as National Vice-Chairman under the leadership of that other great CPSA man, Geoff Taylor."

England team member, Peter Cole, had known Alan for around

35 years and remembers

that although Alan wasn't the best of shots, he more than made up for it with his ability to manage committees or any other similar role as he was very affirmative and capable of managing any team or a committee.

Peter says: "My fondest memories of Alan were when

he was the England ABT Home International team manager back in the 90's. Myself and Roger Westaway travelled to many Home Internationals with Alan and one of the most memorable was when we went to the Scottish Home International. We always had a great weekend as Alan's managerial role ran like clockwork. On the day of our flight home we had a few hours spare and Alan took us on a trip up around the Lochs and showed myself and Roger some stunning scenery which is embedded in my mind forever. It was a perfect end to a

perfect weekend. He was a great guy for 'first timers' and new caps to have as their guardian, especially at a Home International because he always made you feel at ease and welcomed.

"He was a very positive thinking man who revelled in life. I will miss him and his very own unique and warming personality".

Alan was the best CPSA England team manager. He knew exactly what he wanted and how to get it organised to suit everyone in the team. SPORTING STACEY

We spoke to **Emma Stacey** about her successes in 2021 and her goals for the year ahead.

Q How did you get into shooting?

I've been around shooting since I was really young. I used to watch my dad shoot and I was keen to start shooting when I was around 12, but this coincided with him taking a break so it wasn't until I was in my late teens that I got into it. Even then, 2016 was the first year I shot consistently and did a full year of shooting, rather than just the odd shoot.

Q What are your preferred disciplines?

All the Sporting disciplines! English Sporting has been my main focus over the last few years, but I've also shot FITASC and Compak on the side. The plan currently is to focus on FITASC over the next couple of years, alongside ESP. I also shoot a bit of All Round for fun.

Q Can you tell us about some of your successes in 2021?

My biggest success in 2021

was the consistency I found at major events. I finished third in Ladies at the English Open Sporting, second in Ladies at the World Sporting, and third in Ladies at the British Open Sporting. I've been really chasing consistency the last few years and so I was pleased to make the podium at every Sporting major, of course highlighted by finishing second at the Worlds. I was third at the 2019 World Sporting in the US so I was proud to make the podium again. The England Ladies team also won gold at the World Sporting which was another highlight.

Q What has been your overall greatest shooting achievement?

Winning bronze at the 2019 World Sporting in the US is probably what

incredible, and the targets at that competition were seriously tough. To come through that and finish third and make my first World's podium, I'd say was my greatest achievement so far.

Q Can you tell us a bit about your role in the Somerset CPSCA Committee?

This is my first year on the Somerset Committee, and I split the Secretary role with Karen Brown. To be fair, she does most of the organising of everything and I write the Pull! reports!

Q Who are your sponsors?

I'm very lucky to have some fantastic sponsors with me from very early on in my career. I'm sponsored

by Kriehoff and I shoot a 32" K80 Parcours. I've been sponsored by them for over six years now – they took a chance on me when I was still pretty new to shooting and I'm exceptionally grateful for that. For cartridges, I'm sponsored by Hull Cartridge, and I shoot Sovereigns and Sovereign Parcours. I signed with Hull four years ago, and I have never looked back! I'm also sponsored by

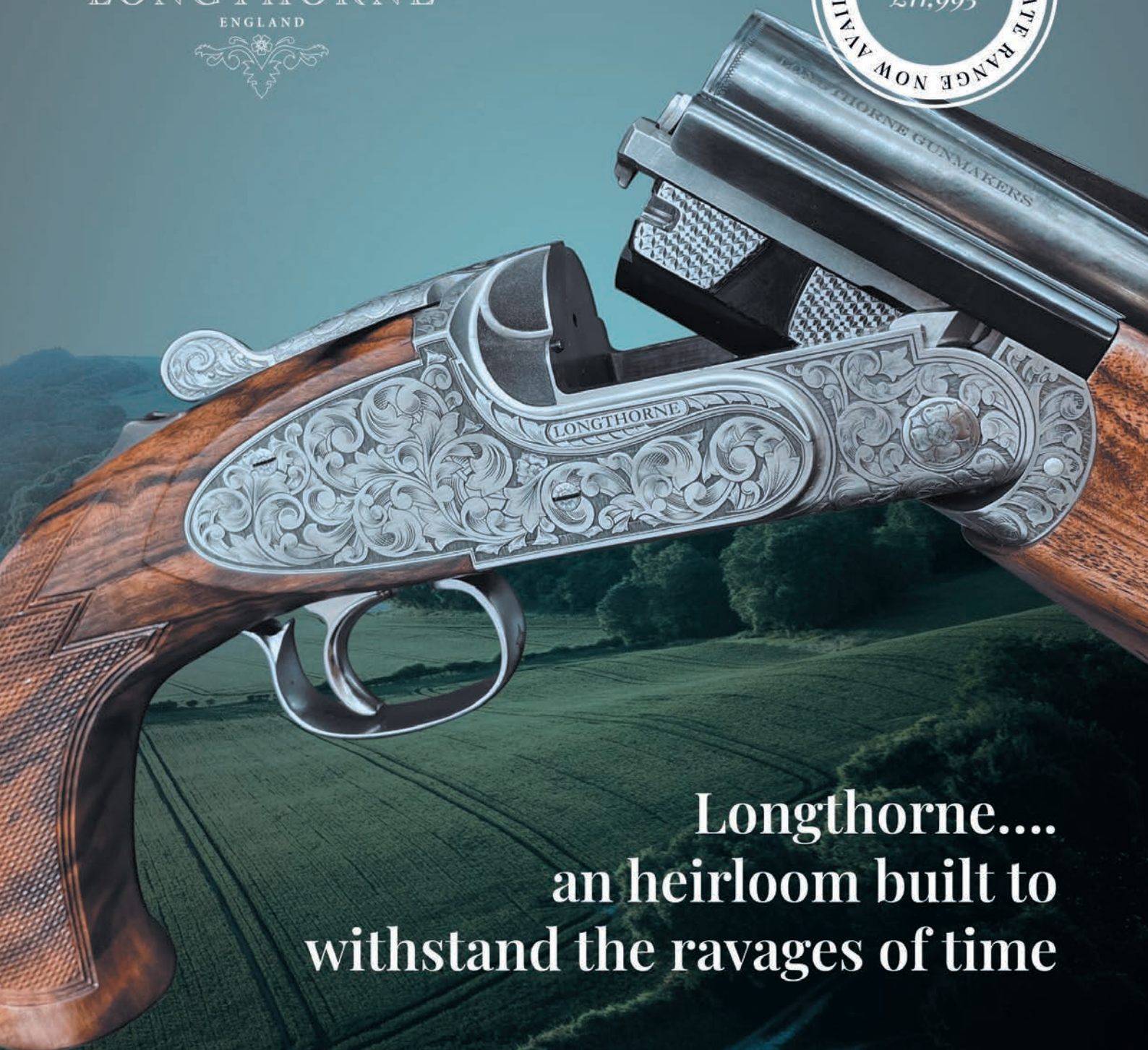
I'd consider my greatest achievement. Even though I finished second this year, competing in America was a totally different challenge. The depth of their shooters is

Laporte CPC, who provide me with traps and clays to support my practice and training. I've been with Laporte for five years now as well, and it helps me to get the traps out at home and work on any problems I'm having. West Country Guns help me out with glasses and other bits that I need. Loyalty is important to me and I'm grateful to have used this combination for nearly all my shooting career. In terms of support, my family are everything to me and have always supported my shooting wholeheartedly. Everyone knows me and my dad are always together, and my whole family are always there to celebrate or commiserate with!

Q Do you have any specific goals you would like to achieve for 2022?

I think my major goal now is to win a major Sporting title. It's the only discipline I haven't won one in yet, and I want to build on the podium consistency from this year. We're going to the US for the World Sporting in April, so I'm looking for a good team result there as well. I love shooting in the international teams, so my goal for any year is always to make the England Sporting and maybe the GB FITASC team as well if I can fit in all the selection shoots!
