

BUCS CLAY PIGEON SHOOTING CHAMPIONSHIP 2021

Orston Shooting Ground in Nottingham played host this year to the British Universities and Colleges Sport (BUCS) Championship on 4-5 December 2021. The Overall Men's team winner was Harper Adams on 375 and the Overall Ladies team was Newcastle on 213.

It was a welcome return for BUCS after the event was cancelled in 2020 due to COVID leaving the shooters extra motivated to shoot well. High scores and great competition were the order of both days. The weather threatened to disrupt the proceedings, but a downpour was thankfully avoided and the shooters from 24 different universities, ranging as far as Plymouth and Newcastle, were able to compete unimpeded.

There were some high scores after day one, with a top score of 87 the highlight, but day two is when the competition really livened up with Harper Adams Men's teams delivering scores in the high 90s!

"It was brilliant to see so many different universities and colleges in attendance at this year's BUCS competition at Orston Shooting Ground. It was a very well organised day with a challenging but fair course for the variety of skill levels participating," said William Boxall, President of the Cambridge University Clay Pigeon Shooting Club (CUCPSC).

LETTER OF THE MONTH



I have returned to competitive clay shooting after approximately a 15 year absence and last year I, along with a group from Cornwall, attended the English Open and British Open English Sporting and enjoyed both events.

We are all looking forward to attending again this year, however the release of all major championships at the same time makes it very difficult to finance.

Many club level grassroot shooters will be forced to choose between championships they attend – as opposed to entering multiple events – if the entries were staggered as they were last year. On top of entry fees, many like ourselves have to incur overnight stays as additional expense that usually require a payment to retain the room.

At the end of January most people are trying to re coop their finances after the Christmas period and it is difficult to book and pay for all of this at once.

Please can the CPSA review there position on the release of entry dates and payments so they are staggered, to allow those that want to compete a little leeway on timing and to make booking multiple events more afordable for us all?

CPSA Replies:

Dear Mr Johns,
Last year was very much a tried and tested one for so many reasons – and it was because of COVID and the financial situations that many people found themselves in that we chose to stagger the

booking dates for some of our major championships. We do appreciate that booking onto multiple events at one time can be costly but unfortunately, as the details have already been published

for this years events, we are unable to change this.

However, looking ahead, we will certainly review the booking processes and timings for 2023 and beyond. Thank you for bringing your

concerns to our attention.



UNDER PRESSURE



Sydney Olympic Trap gold medallist **Richard Faulds** talks to **Martin Puddifer** about what it takes to keep shooting perfect rounds.

At the time of writing, Richard Faulds has shot 13 registered 100-straight in Sporting, his first in December 1997, his most recent in September 2021. There has been so much more to achieving this impressive feat than pulling the trigger at the right moment – not least an appreciation of the psychological side of competitive sport – which is as important as the thousands of hours of practice he has chalked up over the years. I caught up with him recently to discuss mindset, mentors, modesty, and more.

Q Practice aside, can you sum up what it takes to shoot 100-straight in Sporting?

It takes mental strength, focus, and determination. You hone those by years of practising and competing. I had done a fair few high 90s, even the odd 99, before I cracked my first 100. Each individual clay is its own separate challenge in my mind, a jigsaw with 100 pieces.

You could shoot a 99 having missed the very first or very last target, missing the first puts pressure on you to get a good score but it's a different kind of pressure when you're on 99 straight. You do need a little bit of luck, too. You don't need a bouncing rabbit or a trap which breaks when you're about to shoot, for example. It could even be a passing comment from someone nearby telling me how another competitor is doing. Those kinds of things can mess up the natural flow of your round.

Q Do you engage in much small talk when you're between stands?

I don't really talk to people when I'm competing because I'm trying to stay focused. Sometimes people will walk past me, say hello, I won't respond, and my wife Tanya will ask me why I'm being so rude! I'll explain that I didn't realise they'd said anything because I had my head down and was trying to concentrate. I'll talk to people all day long after I've finished shooting, it's just the way I am.

Gmissing the first puts pressure on you to get a good score but it's a different kind of pressure when you're on 99 straight.

Q How would you describe your relationship with pressure and how do you cope with it in the run up to/during a competition?

I enjoy the challenge of pressure. Over the years I have learned to enjoy the different situations I have been in and tried to learn things from all of them. The biggest lesson of all is it's not over until it's over. There have been a few instances when I've had a bad stand and have risked taking that with me mentally to the next. I have tried to respond by keeping my head down and keeping going,

because by the end of the shoot I could still be one clay off winning the class or category. It could be a World Championship or a Sunday shoot, I still want to win.

Q What do you focus on to block out the external noise, the presence of spectators, or fellow competitors when you're shooting?

If I told you that I would give away all of my secrets, I'm not ready to share them yet!

Q Who has helped you to develop the mindset to be able to shoot 100-straight, any particular coaches or mentors?

When I was at the height of my Olympic career, I worked very closely with a sports psychologist called Peter Terry. I approached Peter because I felt I was a good shot but I always struggled to concentrate. When you're shooting an Olympic discipline you're on the range for 25 minutes, which is a long

time to remain focused. It's the opposite to Sporting shooting, where it's easier to switch on and off. If you miss a clay because your mind wanders it could be the difference between making the British team or not, which might mean you're ►

going to miss out on shooting in a championship or even at the Olympics.

I still use a lot of what Peter taught me today. He knew nothing about competitive shooting and I knew nothing about sports psychology, so we started on an equal footing. Peter spent a lot of time coming to shoots, watching and understanding how it all worked and he would ask questions, pick holes in things, and over the course of several months he would introduce things to try to maintain my concentration. Some of which worked, others didn't. In the end, it was a few small things that made a huge difference. Most of what he talked through with me was common sense – you can only control the controllables, for example.

Q **What goes through your mind as you're getting to 80, 85 and 90 straight – does it ever enter your head that you're approaching 100, if so, how do you keep your emotions in check?**

As you near the end of the course, it is inevitable to get the feeling that a possible 100 is on the cards. But you

can't let your guard down, even on a simple stand. With the squadded system that's in place at many shoots, you never know what the course has in store, but more often than not, the last couple of stands will be a little more forgiving than some of the tougher ones through the middle of the shoot. I try to stay focused on each target and not do anything stupid.

Q **How does it feel when that 100th clay appears, and then later when it is dusted? Has it been the same for all of the 100-straight you've achieved?**

I've managed to shoot 13 100-straight at Registered events over the years. Each one has felt different, some have felt very easy, some were mentally tough, and others have been tough for other reasons, maybe bad weather or other factors. When the last clay breaks, the feeling of relief is still the same. I have shot 100s at eight different venues, my first being in 1997 at Southern Counties Shooting Ground. Then I had a gap until 2014, but have managed

six since 2019. Are the shoots getting easier? I don't think so – I think as I get older I learn to deal with the pressure better.

Q **Do you have a favourite 100-straight and where do your 100s rank in the successes you've enjoyed in your career?**

I think my favourite 100-straight would have to be my second one last year, at Barbury. I only booked in on the morning of the shoot and I jokingly said to Assistant Manager Josh Brown "Can you book me in please, I fancy shooting another 100-straight." Then at the end of the round I sent him a picture of my scorecard.

Q **How do you feel in the hours/days after shooting 100-straight – is it business as usual or are you on a massive comedown?**

It's business as usual. It should never go to your head because you might go out the following week and shoot 80, which brings you right back down to earth.

Q **Do you think you'll achieve any more 100-straight – will it bother you if you've already achieved your last?**

I'd love to think I've still got the chance to shoot one or two more yet, but if I've shot my last one I won't be unhappy! 🎣

CYBER SECURITY

Patrick J Carolan helps us to understand how businesses can stay safe online, after a recent data breach in July.

You wouldn't leave your gun safe keys in plain view labelled "gun safe", but unfortunately that is how a hacker sees an unprotected website or database. On 1 September 2021, the BBC reported on guntrader's announcement that a data breach affected more than 100,000 customers back in July. It has now become apparent that an animal rights activist blog had published the information and formatted it so that it could be easily imported into mapping software to show individual homes. THE CONCERN OF SENSITIVE DATA

Cyber hacks are becoming more and more frequent and its not just huge corporate companies that are targeted. Hackers can break into unsophisticated sites with ease, meaning that licence holder information could be locked for ransom, deleted, or shared on the dark web for further criminal activity. A typical hacker's favourite method is usually a denial of service attack, which denies the victim access to files, or worse case scenario sharing the files openly to others.

Imagine an organised criminal gang (OCG) who gain access to names and addresses of shotgun and firearm certificate holders via a small breach of member data in a website or an unprotected systems – the consequences are unthinkable.

WHAT DATA IS USUALLY HELD?

Sites will usually hold names, addresses, date of birth, and online licence information.

RISKS TO YOUR BUSINESS

- Reputational damage, loss of trust and ultimately financial implications.
- Possible regulatory sanctions related to the data privacy laws.
- Data breach fines from regulatory authorities.
- Question of when, how, or if you will be hit.

WHAT CAN AN ORGANISATION DO TO PROTECT ITS DATA

How to prevent hacking:

- Back up important data and then store it securely.
 - Treat access to data requests on a needs must basis only.
- Never use admin accounts on PCs for day-to-day administrative work.
- Ensure that your IT security team have an incident response plan in place, then run regular simulations.
- Review port settings for both on-premises and cloud environments.
- Implement secure, robust configuration settings on all devices.
- Keep all systems updated.
- Develop a dedicated training programme, then hold regular sessions for the whole team to partake in refresher training.
- Think about joining the UK Government Cyber Essentials scheme to implement the five essential mitigation strategies.

Cyber Essentials is a government-backed cyber security certification scheme that sets out a good baseline of cyber security suitable for all organisations in all sectors.

The scheme addresses five key controls that, when implemented correctly, can prevent around 80% of cyber attacks. Cyber Essentials certification only is an online self-completing questionnaire, which is certified by a GCHQ Assessor on behalf of

- PROFILE -

PETER CHESTER

We spoke to reemerging shooter **Peter Chester** about returning to the sport after a 16 year break.

Q Can you tell us about how you got into shooting?

I went to watch my grandfather shoot Skeet at Northampton Gun Club in early 1997 with my father Phil. He asked me if I wanted to have a go and that Christmas, when I was ten years old, he brought me a 20 gauge Browning shotgun and we went to Lain's Shooting School in Quarley, Hampshire. I was instantly hooked!

I was taught to shoot by Dave Allen from Durrington in Wiltshire and Peter Bloomfield from Suffolk took over my coaching when Dave could no longer teach me anything else about Skeet. By the age of 11 I was shooting in the Wiltshire county team, going to local shoots, and getting used to shooting competitions and practising every Wednesday and Saturday. Sundays were for competitions at the age of 12.

Q What were some of your achievements as a younger shooter?

I made the England Skeet team four times as a Junior, won the 12 gauge Sub-Junior world Championship and Sub-Junior Skeet Doubles World

Championship, New York in 2001. I also won the 12 gauge Western AA Class at the World Championships in San Antonio, Texas, the same year. I was the second person to ever shoot 100-straight with a .410 gauge in the UK at the age of 13 – only a few weeks after my coach Peter Bloomfield shot the first ever in the UK!



Q Have you always shot Skeet?

Yes, I've always shot English Skeet and American Skeet which is NSSA Skeet. The reason for only shooting Skeet being it was just the discipline I chose after watching my grandfather in early 1997.

Q You had a very long break from shooting starting in 2003, how did you get back into the sport?

My partner Nadina actually surprised me for my 30th birthday and booked a 30 target have-a-go-day at Barbury Shooting School. After shooting 30 out of 30 I was instantly drawn back to clay shooting and was hooked once again!

Q Can you tell us a bit about how your first competition went after getting back into the sport?

My first Skeet competition was the Fareham Christmas shoot in 2019. I didn't think I shot overly well with 95/100 but it was still enough to win the shoot. It was that feeling of still being able to win after such a long break that pushed me to really start concentrating on Skeet again and it was a great feeling.

Q You've had some fantastic results over the last few years, can you name a few of your proudest moments?

Winning the World Skeet Masters in 2020 at Eriswell lodge. That was my first year properly shooting again. I then won the British Open Skeet in 2021 which was a great moment, but winning the Home International at Fauxdeglia Shooting Ground after getting into the England team for the first time as an adult was my greatest moment overall. It was great to be back in the team and winning after all those years!

Q Do you have any goals to focus on over the next few years?

To keep on winning if I'm honest. There are so many big competitions I want to win as an adult and I would love to get back out to San Antonio in Texas to try and win the World Skeet Championship over there. This really is my major goal and after I've achieved this – who knows! Maybe I'll move over to the Olympic disciplines and see how it goes.

- AN INTRODUCTION TO -

ENGLISH SKEET

CPSA Level 3 Senior Coach **Simon Arbuckle** starts off series six with an intro to English Skeet (ESK).



Hello and welcome to the sixth CPSA How to Hit series, sponsored by Browning and filmed at the National Clay Shooting Center at Bisley. In this series we're going to be covering English Skeet, and then Olympic Skeet. But first, in this article, we're looking at

the rules, regulations, and the layout regarding English Skeet.

The dimensions of a Skeet layout are universal around the world. However, depending on which discipline you're shooting, the rules and the sequence in which it's shot will change. You've got a High House

and a Low House, with a trap in each, and with English Skeet, you've got seven shooting stations in a semi-circle. Station one is beneath the High House and Station seven adjacent to the Low House. Normally, competitions are shot over 100 targets in rounds of 25. The 25 targets are shot in a set sequence, and I'll cover them from each station, as we go around the layout.

The sequence we shoot the targets in is a combination of singles and pairs from each stand. The targets themselves are flying between 50 to 52

meters and cross at a central point indicated by the white pole out in front of station four. Skeet is normally shot in squads of six with the same person going first and the rest of the squad in the same order on each station. As mentioned before, competitions tend to be 100 targets shot over four rounds of 25. The sequence that we shoot these targets is as follows.

On station one, we shoot a single high, a single low, then a pair, shot high target first followed by the low.

Station two is the same. Two singles, single high,

single low and the pair is shot again, the high target first followed by the low.

Station three only has two singles, shot high target first then low target.

Station four, we're back to singles and pairs with a single high followed by a single low. But this time, on the pair, you must nominate to the referee which one you want to shoot first. This could depend on weather conditions or whether you're left or right-handed – whichever one you favour shooting first!

On station five again there are two singles, shot single high, single low.

Station six is singles and pairs. Single high, single low, but the pair is shot low target first so it's low then high.

Station seven, singles and pairs. This time it's shot single

low then single high and the pair shot the same way. Low target first and then the high.

Those who have been counting will realise that's 24 shots. If you manage to shoot all the way around the sequence hitting every target, that's 24 targets. Meaning you've got one left. That's the option target, which we will then get the choice of either shooting the single high or the single low on station seven again to complete the sequence of 25.

With Skeet, if you miss a target, the first one you miss, you get again as your repeat target and that then means you don't get an option target on station seven.

In days gone by, the traditional Skeet gun was a 26" barrel shotgun with open chokes.

Nowadays, most people tend to use a normal multi-

choke sporting gun with 30 or 32" barrels. The chokes in it, again, remain open. So, we have got cylinder and improved cylinder in here for close range targets which give a nice spread. The 30" or 32" barrels aid the stability and the swing of the gun, where the shorter barrels can tend to be very quick and whippy.

Cartridges for Skeet tend to be number nine shot. So, a lot more pellets in there, giving a denser pattern at close range. But normal

CSPA rules apply. No larger than number six shot and no more than 28gram loads. But nine shot is the standard for Skeet. As we have mentioned in previous videos, gun fit is essential. With the Browning 725 Sporter I'm using in the accompanying video to this article, I've had to raise the adjustable comb to make it fit me.



YOUNG SHOTS

By John Porter.

I have been shooting since just before I was six years old. The very first time I shot I hit 16/25 with the helping hand of Stuart from Eriswell Lodge and after one lesson I loved it so much my grandad bought me a .410 single barrel for my sixth birthday.

With Eriswell Lodge as my local ground, I met Peter Bloomfield who used to teach me on the Skeet range. On our first lesson he taught me how to load the gun safely by myself, then over the next few years he helped me shoot a 25-straight and then a 50-straight.

I have now been taught by Ben Thorrold for around three years and have gone from shooting scores in the 50's at the beginning to high 80's and 90's.

I am now 11 years old and I have just changed my gun to a Beretta Silver Pigeon 12g. I use Lyalvale Express 21g Super Light cartridge with $\frac{3}{4}$ chokes, which gives virtually no recoil and Marcus at Lyalvale Express is on hand to help me out if I ever need any help.

Philip Webster advised that by going to a 12g it will make a big difference on the score cards. Dad said it won't hardly change, but I can beat him most times we shoot together now so I guess Philip was right!

I have been shooting English Sporting competitions since I was six and my first ever score

JOHN'S TOP TIPS

TIP 1 Try to get your gun fitted properly, it's not expensive and will be worth it in the long run.

TIP 2 From the second the clay is visible, don't take your eyes off it until it has been broken or passed.

TIP 3 Don't worry about constantly changing your shot sizes and chokes, $\frac{1}{4}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ with 7.5 will break almost anything.

TIP 4 If you are struggling with a particular type of target – don't avoid it – practice it as much as possible or book a lesson with a trained coach.

TIP 5 Don't worry if you miss a clay – even the world champions miss sometimes!

was 18/100 in 2016. My best is 92/100 at Northampton Shooting Ground – they always have great targets to shoot.

My greatest shooting moment so far was to win the top Colt of 2021 in English Sporting in the CPSA Top Shots, with an average of nearly 82 which then put me into A class.

As mum and dad pay for most of my shooting, they let me keep any prize money and sell any

prizes. To date I have won around £7,000. To an 11-year-old that's really huge!

Outside of shooting I enjoy playing computer games.

Q When did the ground open and what makes it special?

A: Established 1984, Southdown Gun Club is in its 37th year, situated in the heart of the Southdowns National Park in the beautiful Sussex Downs.

Q What disciplines/facilities/events do you offer around the grounds?



This month, **Mark Brown** reviews the new 687 Silver Pigeon III from Beretta.

I always look forward to testing guns from Beretta, quite simply they never disappoint and so I eagerly opened up the case of the 687 Silver Pigeon III full of excitement.

This variant of the gun was launched last year and whilst the 687 is a well-revered model in the Beretta range, this new version already offers something very different as a dedicated sporter, that easily crosses over for use in the field. The gamescene

engraving and highly figured stock immediately caught my attention – it's really refreshing to see a gun that looks at home both on the clay ground and out in the field in pursuit of game. The left hand side of the action has a beautifully machine

engraved Grey Partridge, the right hand side a pheasant and the Beretta logo is tastefully added to the underside, a rose scroll engraving adorns the top lever to complete the finish.

To ensure sufficient credentials for clay shooting, the 687 Silver Pigeon III comes with ventilated top rib and barrels, extended Optima multi-choke, manual safety catch, adjustable stock (at extra cost) and 32" barrels on the test gun, although 28" and 30" versions are also available, as is a left-handed version too. The Vittoria option for female shooters is available in the 28" and 30" barrel adjustable stock model only.

We took the gun around the sporting layout at Ian Coley's and, as expected, it performed admirably on

all targets. At a shade under 8lbs it's certainly not a light gun, but it's incredibly well balanced and almost too lively when pushing on at pace on long crossers. The hits were clean and showed just how well the Optima chokes pattern. We were

disappointed that it didn't register a hit on the extreme crosser on Stand 12 but that was down to user error rather than any issue with the gun!

As I've said before in reviews of Beretta guns, they just feel so right when shooting, so easy to gel with in no time at all, so comfortable, and this shows almost immediately in your scores. They are also a great investment and unlike many other brands of guns – you will have no concerns with regards to residual value should you wish to trade up in the future.

There are so many positives with this gun that it's hard to find anything bad to say, a few very minor gripes would be that although the stock was beautifully figured and finished, the wood on the forend was not quite so pleasing and didn't really match the stock. I'm also not a massive fan of the rounded forend, I personally prefer a tulip or Schnabel forend but these are very small concerns and certainly wouldn't deter me from buying this gun.

The 687 Silver Pigeon III is a great addition to the Beretta range of over and under shotguns, it is attractive to many buyers and clearly well thought out in its features. At just £2,450 RRP it's very competitively priced and worthy of adding to your list when looking at your next purchase.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

for Year Ended
30 November 2021



CHAMPIONSHIPS

British Open

With COVID restrictions significantly reduced from 2020, the British Open sporting was held, over five days, at E.J. Churchill's new Swinton estate. Sundays Super Final was won by Brody Woollard with a three target lead over Runner-up, Sam Usher. Brodie was, at that time, 20 years old he also won the Junior title. With the Ladies High Gun going to Georgia Moule. Amy Easeman took the Junior Ladies High Gun, and Kevin Jobling the Veteran's title.

English Open Sportrap

The Sportrap championship spanned three days in early August at High Lodge. Richard Bunning took the championship title with George Digweed coming a close second and Sam Green just being pushed into third place. The Ladies trophy went to Pauline Chapman who beat Hannah Gibson by one target, with Georgina Moule finishing third. Will Fenner took the Junior title ahead of Daniel King, with Veteran High Gun going to Stuart Clark ahead of Andy Seaman and Jasper Pearce claiming the Colts trophy ahead of Charlie Faulds.

English Open Sporting

Barbury Shooting Ground hosted the 2021 English open. Some of the worst weather I can remember at any of our championships did not spoil the enjoyment (well not much anyway) nor, for that matter, the scores. After Sunday's Super Final Richard Faulds emerged triumphant as the English open champion beating Richard Bunning by one target, with Julian Freeman shooting one less target to Richard giving him third place overall. Amy Eastman claimed the Ladies title with Cheryl Hall coming second and Emma Stacey third. Junior High Gun went to Will Fenner beating Josh Bennion by one target who beat Dan King by one target to take second place. Amy Easeman also took the Ladies Junior High Gun with Annalise Evans coming second and Lucy Earl third. Veteran trophy was taken by Mickey Rouse with Steve Whitwell taking second place by default as Steve

Brightwell couldn't find a snorkel in order to get back to the ground for a shoot off.

World Sporting

Held over from 2020, Churchill's also hosted the seven day CPSA World Sporting at Buckinghamshire. With the event being pretty well sold out, Mark Winser emerged, after a rainy final, as CPSA World Sporting Champion for 2021, finishing on 210ex225, with Mark Webster being Runner-up with 209ex225, and Martin Myers finishing on 208ex225 to claim Third Overall. Cheryl Hall took the Ladies title with Will Fenner and Amy Easeman winning the Junior and Lady Junior trophies respectively. George Digweed shot his way to the Veterans trophy with Steve Brightwell taking the Super Veterans award. In the team event, England again took the honours, in the Senior, Ladies, and Junior categories as well as claiming the overall winning team with a combined score of 2013ex3400.

British Open DTL

The British Open was held as part of the DTL Home International competition hosted by the WCTSA at Fauxdeglia. The England team, fielding 18 new caps, managed by David Amos and, enthusiastically and energetically captained by Curtis Woolley, took the honours in every category as well as the overall trophy. For good measure, Emma Holden won the Ladies title, Matthew Paley the Colts, and Chris Moule the Veteran's title. The Overall British Open High Gun went to Steve Janes.

British Open Skeet

This championship was held at Doveridge in August and, as you would expect from Skeet, there was very little difference separating the top shooters. Peter Chester took the title with a hundred straight with Joakim Smith also shooting a ton but unavailable for the final. Third place Overall went to Ross Elgie on 99. Ladies Champion was Natalie Bales with Sam Rhodes being the Runner-up. Junior champion was Ben Cummings beating Alex Banning by one point. Veteran High Gun was

Bill Moussalli with Ross Nabney taking second place.

English Open Skeet

The English Open was held at Eriswell Lodge in June with near-perfect conditions over the last two days, resulting in nine 100-straight being shot on the Sunday. Veteran shooter, and all round Gentleman, Bill Moussalli took the Overall Title after a tense shoot off with Stuart Smith and Peter Stanton-Hope. The Ladies title went to, 2020's British Open Champion, Natalie Bales with Julie Havill coming a close second and Rebecca Savins, an even closer, third. Archy Stannard was the Junior champion and Bill Moussalli also took the Veterans High Gun with Ethan Lord taking the Colts trophy on a score of 99.

English Open ABT

The championship was held at Nuthampstead at the end of May with a total of 130 entries highlighting the increasing popularity of this discipline. Amidst a positively carnival atmosphere of camper vans, barbecues, family dogs and electric scooters, the championship title was won by Adam Gutteridge and the runner-up was Kevin Borley. The Ladies title went to Kath bright with Leah Southall a close second. Junior High Gun was Cory Doble, Veteran High Gun Kevin Borley, with Harry Poolman taking the Colts title.

HOME INTERNATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

During 2020 we were forced to cancel all of our England team selection shoots and the home nations of ICTSC agreed that it would be impossible to hold Home International Championships. In 2021 all of the Home International contests went ahead and the England teams certainly made up for the missed opportunities of the year before. We annually contest seven HI Championships: FITASC, DTL, ABT, ESK, OSK, OTR, and ESP. To make up for 2020, the England teams took the overall Championship Trophies in every discipline. To hammer the message home, the ABT, DTL, and OSK teams

also took the winning trophies in every category. The same was true for the Skeet teams with the exception of the Ladies who were just pipped by Scotland and the OTR guys who's Ladies and Super Vets teams were held to second place. Overall, not too shabby after nearly two years out of the game, I think you will agree!

HEAD OFFICE

Once again it falls to me to express our gratitude and admiration, to Iain Parker our CEO and all of the staff at HQ. Without exception they went the extra mile to bring us a successful year despite, all the restrictions. The "Bisley Guys" quite literally kept the organisation going throughout 2021, to deliver a full year of competitions and Home International championships. During the period we had a number of changes. Phoebe Grant, our events manager, left us to work in the city and we wish her every success in her new venture. Nicola Briggs who was in charge of coordinating the England teams has moved on and Suzanne Tubb has joined us in that role. Grant Repshire who worked on media and communications for three years left at the end of September and Adam White has come on board to take over as his replacement. I have assured all the new

staff on your behalf, not to worry and that they will get used to it eventually. In my 2020 report I gave advance warning that Stuart Oldman was planning to retire after being our Operations Manager for longer than anyone can quite remember. Stuart left us in April and has been replaced by Clare Alger who many of you will know from the front desk at our championships. Don't worry though, she has insisted on retaining some of those duties and so will continue to be a familiar face at our major events in 2022.

Finally, we sadly lost our longest serving CPSA Director Tony Heeks in 2021. Tony served as the Northern Region Director for nearly 26 years and will be greatly missed from the board and within the association generally. Sleep well Mr H and thank you for your service.

FINANCIAL

2021 continued to see the effects of COVID restrictions on our membership and therefore our income. However, it was fantastic to see the level of support from all of you in the way that the initial drop in membership slowly climbed back. It still has some way to go to reach early 2020 levels but things are looking positive. We undertook major costs evaluation exercises in 2021 and managed to reduce costs without

restricting services. At the end of the year we had managed to hold all of our planned competitions as well as all of the Home Internationals and still achieve a surplus. Moving into 2022 this surplus will be split, with half going to our reserves, just in case, and the other half being distributed amongst our championships and the financial support we provide to our regional organisations each year.

THE COMING YEAR

There are encouraging signs, and we all hope, that COVID will finally slip away behind its own mask in early 2022. Once again we are planning a full year of competitions and Home International championships. Hopefully, all of these will go ahead pretty much "normally." If there are further restrictions, the learning curve of the last two years has forged the "Bisley Guys" into an emergency response team which will take some stopping. Our intention is very much to deliver everything we are planning. I have a very full calendar and have every intention of attending everything pencilled or pending for 2022. I hope to see you all on the grounds throughout the year. Please come and have a chat about absolutely anything you want and I won't be offended if you say hello to the Lab first, it's normal. Good luck and good shooting in 2022.

2020/21 again proved challenging for us all as we continued to battle the

COVID pandemic, further lockdowns and disruption to business and our lives.

2021 proved to be a busy year on all fronts with a full competition calendar

while restrictions still affected our sport we saw several months of membership increasing month on month. Our income increased from £1,608,515 in 2020 to £2,108,395 in 2021 a blend of being able to run a full Championship calendar and consistent membership numbers year on year.

We continued to manage expenditure while investing in our software systems such as SHOOT which we delivered to grounds and used for the first time at our CPSA Major Championships. This is only the beginning for SHOOT as we will continue to develop and activate its full menu of features during the coming years.

2021 saw our sponsors increase their commitment to the CPSA and our sport. We welcomed SWATCOM hearing protection as a headline sponsor for our CPSA Championships joining Musto and Rizzini.

While 2021 was still a challenging year for the association as we moved in and out of lockdowns and varying restrictions due to COVID we ended the year with a surplus of £72,594 (2020 £80,583) and importantly a growing membership.

We look forward in 2022 to continuing the positive momentum regarding membership and ever improving our sporting and trap initiatives, CPSA Championships and marketing our sport and association.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The surplus for the year, after taxation, amounted to £72,594 (2020 - £80,583).

RESERVES POLICY

The Clay Pigeon Shooting Association aims to keep free cash reserves for four to six months of core activity expenditure, therefore giving a target range of £500,000 to £750,000 of free cash reserves.

Free cash reserves at 30 November 2021 were £703,996 (2020: £612,388). Free cash reserves are made up of general reserves, cash received from deferred membership less fixed assets. We continue to be mindful of the need to improve the free reserves whilst making appropriate investments in the organisation.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 NOVEMBER 2020

1 GENERAL INFORMATION

Clay Pigeon Shooting Association is the national governing body for clay pigeon shooting in England. The company remains committed to promoting excellence in the sport.

The company is a private company limited (registered number: 3146770) limited by guarantee and was incorporated in England and Wales. The company's registered office is Edmonton House, Bisley Camp, Brookwood, Surrey, GU24 0NP.

2 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Section 1A of Financial Reporting Standard 102, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland and the Companies Act 2006. The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

2.2 INCOME

Income is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the income can be reliably measured. Income is measured as the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, excluding discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes. Membership fees are recognised for the period to which they relate. Championships, events and courses income are recognised in respect of goods and services supplied during the year.

2.3 GOING CONCERN

The Directors have reviewed their forecasts and cash flow requirements for the foreseeable future, these include considerations of the impact of Covid-19 on the Company. The Directors consider that the company will have adequate working capital available to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. They believe the going concern basis of accounting is appropriate for these annual financial statements.

2.4 OPERATING LEASES: THE COMPANY AS LESSEE

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the lease term.

2.5 GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Grants are accounted under the accruals model as permitted by FRS 102. Grants relating to expenditure on tangible fixed assets are credited to profit or loss at the same rate as the depreciation on the assets to which the grant relates. The deferred element of grants is included in creditors as deferred income. Government grant income relates to the Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme (CJRS) and is recognised as receivable in line with the period that the expense has been incurred.

2.6 INTEREST INCOME

Interest income is recognised in profit or loss using the effective interest method.

2.7 PENSIONS

Defined contribution pension plan

The Company operates a defined contribution plan for its employees. A defined contribution plan is a pension plan under which the Company pays fixed contributions into a separate entity. Once the contributions have been paid the Company has no further payment obligations. The contributions are recognised as an expense in profit or loss when they fall due. Amounts not paid are shown in accruals as a liability in the Statement of Financial Position. The assets of the plan are held separately from the Company in independently administered funds.

2.8 TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

Tangible fixed assets under the cost model are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management. Depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of assets less their residual value over their estimated useful lives, using the straight-line method. Depreciation is provided on the following basis:

Freehold land – 0% straight line

Property improvements – 10% straight line

Motor vehicles – 25% straight line

Furniture, fittings and equipment – 25 - 33% straight line

IT Development – 20% straight line

The assets' residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted prospectively if appropriate, or if there is an indication of a significant change since the last reporting date. Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing the proceeds with the carrying amount and are recognised in profit or loss.

2.9 STOCKS

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, being the estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost is based on the cost of purchase on a first in, first out basis. Work in progress and finished goods include labour and attributable overheads. At each reporting date, stocks are assessed for impairment. If stock is impaired, the carrying amount is reduced to its selling price less costs to complete and sell. The impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss.

2.10 DEBTORS

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

2.11 CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

2.12 CREDITORS

Short term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.13 FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Company only enters into basic financial instruments transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors.

A Year in the life of Mike Faux

Mike said that 2021 had been a challenging year, to put it mildly. Not only on a personal level, but also on a business level. Determination and hard work prevailed where Mike used the lockdown to build a new Sporttrap and DTL layout at the far end of the ground. Further developments are planned, and recently the entrance has been enhanced with a new stone wall and the road resurfaced. He remembered getting excited about travelling to meet our chairman and receive his first county badge to shoot for Cheshire.

How things can change from being a sporting shooter – already achieving the accolade of shooting DTL for England in the past, Mike set a goal to achieve the same in all Trap disciplines. Olympic Trap was the first in 2018. Then ABT in 2019. But 2021 was his best year ever, achieving an England team place in Olympic Trap, winning the Overall individual Senior gold at the Home Internationals, and the Overall Senior team gold. At the English Open Olympic Trap in July he won Veterans silver, and at the British Open Universal Trap he won Senior gold. The highlight of Mike's year was to be a member of the Great Britain team at the World Universal Trap Championships in Malaga, Spain. He achieved a personal best of five 24s from eight rounds and a Senior team bronze medal. Mike's year has been rounded off by being mentioned in the CPSA top shots list, 19th Overall and second in Veterans for Olympic Trap.

Hello Oxfordshire! This is the first report of 2022, I hope the Clay Shooting has started with a positive bang so far. The Oxfordshire committee have been beavering away for the last few months to provide you with a new Trap Challenge and a Challenge Trophy 2022 and we are pleased to announce that all the rules for the competitions are as follows.

Oxfordshire CPSA Trap Challenge 2022

All Oxfordshire County Championships can be used. You can shoot all of the County Trap Championships but only count your top four results. You can only win this event by only shooting four County Trap Championships. All shooters must be CPSA registered in the county of Oxfordshire. To qualify each shooter must shoot competition – targets only competitors will not count. The scoring of the competition will be no points for the Oxfordshire winner, second will be given three points, and third will be given eight points. The winner of the Oxfordshire Trap Challenge will be the shooter who submits the lowest score from four disciplines. First prize is £300, second £200, and third £100. The prizes will be in the form of vouchers to be spent at Banbury Gunsmiths, they are to be used in the shop on goods only. All prizes will be awarded at the Oxfordshire CPSA Presentation evening with details to be announced.

Oxfordshire CPSA Challenge Trophy 2022

All Oxfordshire County Championship scores will be used to qualify for the final. This will be held at the Oxfordshire's All-Round County Championship. The top five shooters from all the County Championships will qualify for the final. All shooters must be CPSA registered as being in the county of Oxfordshire. To qualify each shooter must shoot competition, targetd only competitors will not count. First prize will be £500, second £400, third £300, fourth £250, fifth £200, sixth £150, and seventh £100. The top Veterans, Ladies, and Juniors shooters will receive £100. If the Veterans, Ladies or Juniors have qualified in the top five, they must nominate what category they are shooting in before the competition commences. They will be unable to ►

TURNER AT THE TOP

We spoke to **Paul Turner** about being named as the Overall DTL Top Shot for 2021, and his top DTL tips!

Q How and when did you get into shooting?

I've always been into shooting but when I was 13 years old a friend, Frank Shaw, asked if I fancied going to a couple of shooting clubs with him, which I gratefully accepted and have enjoyed shooting ever since.

Q How did you pick your preferred discipline of DTL?

I used to shoot Sporting, but one day two other friends, Trevor Tod and John Twigg, asked if I wanted to go and do some Down the Line shooting and took me to Westhoughton – aka A6 Clay Target Club. I did really well and won my Class for the first time. I liked it

Q What did it feel like to be named as the first Overall DTL Top Shot for the whole of 2021?

Words cannot really describe how great it feels to achieve such an amazing position, especially after shooting all of the major and county championships.

Q How has this impacted your plans for the year ahead?

To be honest, it hasn't impacted my plans much as I was already committed to doing the championships for the season/year ahead. It has however, made me confident and more focused.

Q Are you planning on taking part in any major competitions this year?

Yes, actually I have already booked most of the major championships for the year as soon as entries opened.

Q What would you say is your biggest achievement or favourite event?

I actually have two big achievements – one is winning the Dougall Memorial with a 100ex300 and the Clay Shooting Classic in 2017, which I won with a score of 200ex600.

Q What advice would you give to someone getting into shooting DTL?

Never give up! DTL is a mental game and needs a high level of concentration. Go to your local ground and observe some of the squads, also ask people for advice where needed but most importantly, just give it a go as practice makes perfect! 🏹
