HSE EXTENDS LEAD IN AMMUNITION RESTRICTION PROCESS BY SIX MONTHS

Following the end of the HSE consultation period in November, the HSE have confirmed a further six-month extension to the process due to the overwhelming response since it launched!

The use of lead ammunition for outdoor shooting over wetlands is already subject to regulation in Great Britain. HSE is establishing whether

additional controls are needed for outdoor shooting.

The agency has received 2,759 responses including many detailed and technical submissions that need to be worked through. This was nine times that of a similar exercise across the EU, which also saw a six-month extension.

We are working closely with the HSE on what is clearly a complex issue

HSE confirmed the extension on Thursday 5 January 2023, as the agency that operates UK REACH, a system of ensuring that chemical substances used in Britain are safe.

To help HSE understand how to provide the most effective, proportionate and practical approach to manage risks to health and the environment, a public consultation was opened for six months. It was published on 6 May 2022, alongside the restriction dossier, to gather information from different groups affected.

CPSA CEO Iain Parker, who sits on the board of the British Shooting Sports Council (BSSC), commented: "We are working very closely with the HSE on what is clearly a complex issue, hence the six-month extension to the process. From our perspective, our position remains the same, that lead in ammunition be allowed to continue in our sport and we will actively work with the HSE to protect our sport."



Level 1 Instructor Training Course (ITC)

This four-day course teaches you how to check eye dominance and gun fit. It shows you how to teach the CPSA Method, how to recognise shooting errors and how to correct them. It consists of classroom time, off-and on-range workshops and a final day of assessments. For this course, the criteria for qualification is that the

candidate can get a novice to hit a moving target safely using the CPSA Method. Candidates must have attended an IDW within the previous two years.

Great to see GBR's shotgun representation on some of the ISSF Committees, especially Elena Allen on the ISSF Executive Committee and Christian Schofield on the Coaches Committee.

Many congratulations to both.

EUROPEAN GAMES

In 2022 GBR qualified seven athletes at the European Championships for the EUG, to be held in June this year, just one place needed in Skeet men for a full house.

The final places will be allocated based on the ISSF World Ranking system, with three World Cups being the qualifying events being held in January, March, and April. The qualifying period ends 22 April 2023, when the NOCs will be informed of their allocated quota places. So may the targets fly fair for our Skeet men.

PARIS 2024 QUALIFICATION

2023: This is an important year for Paris 2024 qualification, with a total of six quota places available in each discipline, one each for the European Championships and the European Games, with another four at the World Championships.

2024: Two quota places can be won in each discipline, one each at the European Championships and Final ISSF Olympic Qualification Championship. There is an additional opportunity for a quota place via the ISSF Qualification Ranking for the Olympic Games which will be allocated from the ranking list to be produced on 9th June 2024. A place in each discipline will be offered to the highest ranked athlete whose nation has not won two quota places.

LUCY HALL

I caught up with Lucy before Christmas:

"2022 was my first year transitioning from Juniors to Seniors and there's been some hard moments but also some absolutely fantastic moments as well! The highlight of the year for me was winning a Silver medal at the European Championships and an Olympic quota place, it shows that all the hard work I've been putting in is paying off."

"For this year I want to keep learning but also win more medals and titles!"

was hosted by Morocco, with approximately 220 competitors from 41 countries.

Skeet Women: Jessica Burgess (RPO), Sophie Herrmann (RPO).

Skeet Men: Ben Llewellyn, Arran Eccleston, Freddie Killander (RPO), Mitchell Brooker-Smith (RPO).

Trap Women: Lucy Hall, Georgina Roberts.

Trap Men: Matt Coward-Holley, Steve Scott.

There were only two GRB representatives in the women's event, Jessica Burgess and Sophie Herrmann, both shooting for Ranking Points Only (RPO). RPO is an effective introduction to gaining experience in the Senior competitions, as Lucy Hall has commented. The scores were close between the two, finishing on 108ex125 and 106 respectively.

Ben Llewellyn was our

highest scoring athlete in the Skeet men, finishing on 123ex125 which ranked him third post qualifying rounds. The ranking match saw Ben maintain his position up to the 20 target mark, dropping three targets in total, Ben straighted the next ten targets, but it was not enough to progress to the Medal Match being just one target off the pace.

Ben's result has moved him up from ninth to fifth in the world rankings and second in the Qualification Ranking for the Olympic Games.

Ben Llewellyn shoots a sponsored combination of Perazzi High Tech/Clever Mirage, is also sponsored by Promatic and supported by British Shooting and UK Sport.

I spoke to Ben post event: "I was pleasantly surprised by my score in Rabat! I had a short break after the World Cup Final in December, then

one cold weather training camp at the beginning of January before travelling out to Rabat for the World Cup.

"I feel like it is a very good benchmark to the start of my season, so I am going to spend some time in February working on some solid training leading up to the following five World Cups, European Games, European Championships, and World Championships."

"Three days competition is tough, there are only two rounds on the first two days, then one round and the finals on day three. Even though you are not shooting for long on each day, your mental preparation requires the same level of attention on each day, be it a two or three day competition."

Georgina Roberts shot solidly in the trap women to finish 12th.

But Matt Coward-Holley really upped his game to win gold. At the end of day one he was equal eighth, the end of the second day saw him drop two spots to equal tenth, but a straight on the last day bumped him up to equal fourth on 119ex125. Following the shoot-off he was ranked

sixth, enough to put him third in his ranking match.

Matt won his ranking match on 23ex25, his nearest rivals being last year's World Champion, Derrick Mein (USA) and Daniele Resca (USA), putting Matt ranked three in the medal match, potentially a vulnerable position to be ruled out of the medals. Dropping the second target was not helpful, but he then proceeded to straight the next 23 targets, by the eighteenth target he was leading the field, with David Kostelecky (CZE) just in second. The final score was Matt posting 32ex35, David Kostelecky just one target behind – a good match to watch.

This match not only put Matt at the top of the podium, it has also moved him up from sixth to the top of the World Rankings and third in the Qualification Ranking for the Olympic Games.

An encouraging start to the 2023 ISSF competition season, with four more world cups over the next three months with more competitions to follow. So, a fairly relentless season ahead.

Annoyingly though, my desk calendar stands at me smugly and Windows joins in, every time I switch on my PC so it must be true. It just sort of shows how busy last year really was but, as we move into 2023, trust me, you ain't seen nothing yet.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

British Open Sporting and Sportrap

For the first time, the British Open Sporting was held at the Barbury Shooting School. It proved so popular we had to add extra days. In addition to a fantastic course, Josh Brown also rewarded our expectations by presenting us with a castle.

A strong turnout produced strong scores with Sam Usher winning the Overall title, Chris Childerhouse coming second and Nathan Skinner third. Ladies High Gun was taken by Hanna Gibson with Georgie Moule becoming Runner-up after a shoot-off with Charlotte Hollands. William Page took the Juniors title, Ruben Colton the Colts, and Martin Doughty the Veterans. The British Open Sportrap, held at the same event, was won by George Digweed beating John Lee by one clay, who in turn beat Sam Green by a single clay. Ladies High Gun went to Emma Stacey with Cheryl Hall taking second place, and Hannah Gibson third lady Overall. William Page repeated his success in the Juniors ESP by also winning the Juniors Sportrap title. Lucy Earle took the lady Juniors High Gun and Steve Brightwell the Veterans.

English Open Sporting

That leafy lair of John Bidwell and Andy Coppen, which is High Lodge, hosted the English Open. Paul Batchelor took the Overall title with Phil Gray coming a close second and George Digweed an even closer third. Ladies High Gun went

to Cheryl Hall with Emma Stacey taking second place after a shoot-off with Hannah Gibson. The Junior High Gun was taken by Jacob O'Loughlin and the Veterans by Philip Thorrold.

English Open Sportrap

Eriswell Lodge hosted this Championship.

Stuart Smith set an impressive course of 150 targets with three days of competition. The weather was some of the hottest of the year making everyone grateful for the complimentary iced water, which was ferried around the ground by the Eriswell staff. Goody Bags added to the event and Kenji also got one even though he wasn't shooting.

James Atwood took the English Open title having scored 141 with Richard Faulds coming a close second on 140, and Henry Collins third on 138. The Ladies title was taken by Cheryl Hall who held Charlotte Hollands to second place by one clay, with Georgie Moule awarded third Lady Overall. Tristan Hockey claimed the Junior title with Will Page coming second, and Daniel King third. The Colts Champion trophy went to John Porter and the Veterans title to Steve Brightwell.

British Open Skeet

In weather far less scorching than the Sportrap, Eriswell Lodge also held the British Open Skeet. On day two, Ethan

Lord shot 100-straight as did his dad Marcus. They then went off to Cornwall for a holiday saying that they wouldn't be back for shoot-offs. By mid-Sunday it was obvious only another two 100-straight would be put in. Ethan and Marcus decided to take the long road back, which was rewarded with Junior Ethan taking second place Overall after a shoot-off with eventual winner Tom Clifford. Ethan's dad Marcus came third Overall. Now that was a journey worth making!

Megan Jones took the Ladies title on 99 with Hannah Gibson clinching second place by holding Ali Coupe at bay by one clay. Second Overall,

Ethan Lord, also took the Junior title outright, with Megan Jones one point behind on 99 and Sonny Bowman on 96. The Colts title was won by George Billington, with Isabel Cartlidge second, and Matthew Huxtable third. Philip Thorrold was the Veterans High Gun with the second and third place being fought out over a 25 target shoot-off followed by a nail-biting 24 targets of sudden-death. Stephen Leppington finally prevailed over Peter Stanton-Hope to take second place.

HEAD OFFICE

As always, I must pay tribute to Iain Parker and all his staff at HQ for an excellent year of Major Championships as well as managing the day-to-day running of the firm. During 2022 we



were joined, for the third time, by Paula Watkins taking on the role of Events Executive. Paula left us about six years ago to go back to South Africa and has made a seamless return slotting back in as though she's never been away. Morgan Evans joined us in the role of Marketing, Communications, and PR executive and has greatly enhanced our social media and newsletter profile. Finally, in December I presented Richard Worthington, our National Development Manager, with a ten year long service award however, as he has pointed out to me, in a couple of weeks it would have been 11 years. Better late than never Richard.

THE YEAR AHEAD

We all know the problems the sport has faced over the years of COVID restrictions. 2022 saw membership rise again but peaking in July when the cost of living crisis started to have an effect and numbers began to drop. Thankfully, this trend was brief and we have reached a plateau of about 22,500 members which is holding steady. With a revised budget we are still forecasting a surplus for this year and the company remains financially sound with strong prospects for the future. But prices are rising everywhere and grounds are facing serious problems – as are all businesses. You, our members, have increasing costs, mortgage hikes, soaring food and fuel prices, as well as eye watering charges for accommodation when travelling to Championships. We have responded to these pressures by trying, where possible, to locate as many of our major championships in a central band across the country to reduce the distances our members have to travel, who live in the far south or north of the country, saving on fuel and, perhaps hotel costs.

In addition, we have recognised that, this year, we need to help bear some of the additional costs which grounds are facing when running a major championships. This will have a cost to the company but we are confident we can do it without lowering the standards of our Championships or the experiences of our members competing. In fact, it's not only a belief it's a guarantee which I happily and confidently give you now.

That said, we are planning an astoundingly busy year for 2023, with the jewel in the crown being the World Sporting at E.J. Churchill's. Selling out

on day two, we had to open some extra slots on the proceeding weekend. We're running two Sporting and a Prelim course as well as the World Open Sportrap. Instead of a FITASC championship we will be running our first ever major Super Sporting Championship. The final day has also been changed to the Saturday, ensuring we can make best advantage of the main ground facilities and allowing

last year, after five terms as England's ESP team manager, Richard Hunter stood down and was succeeded by Phil Easeman who took the team to success at the Home International on Jersey. Dorothy Bird, the much loved and very successful Olympic Skeet manager, moved north, very close to the ice wall, to direct her energies into a new farming venture. After managing the Olympic

Sunday for everyone to recoup before going back to work on the Monday. Sounds like a plan to me.

Steve Lovatt will be hosting the British Open Sporting and Sportrap at Garlands Shooting Ground and, after the success of the English Open Sportrap last year, Eriswell Lodge will be taking on the English Open Sporting for the first time. The English Open Sportrap is going to Barbury who should find it a fairly pedestrian affair after the success of last year's British Open.

Carl Smith will be overseeing the English Open Skeet at Nottingham and Rob Hall will be taking on the British Open Skeet at East Yorkshire. It will come as no surprise, as it sort of says it on the tin that the Bywell DTL Weekend, comprising the Sponsors Day, the Dougal Memorial, and the English Open, will be at Bywell, courtesy of the Henry family. Finally, the English Open ABT Championship is in the very capable hands of Oli Jones, David Dale, and quite possibly Duke, down at the National Clay Shooting Centre at Bisley.

In addition to our major championship, England will also be hosting two ICTSC Home International Championships. Andrew Clifton will be welcoming the five nations to Sporting Targets for the Home International English Sporting while Ed Barker will be doing pretty much the same for the Home International Olympic Trap at Nuthampstead. Whilst on the subject,

Skeet teams for six years, herding sheep should prove a walk in the park (only half kidding guys). Dot is succeeded by Paul Tudge starting a three year term. Paul Chapman stood down as ABT manager and is succeeded by Dr Rebecca Wockenforth whilst Julia Havill was overwhelmingly reselected by her very successful English Skeet team to manage them for a further three years to provide advice, support, and above all, cake.

TRUE GRIT

Earning GB a quota place for the Paris Olympics was just one highlight of a sparkling 2022 for **Lucy Hall** – **Anita North** finds out about what drives her.

In 2014, 11-year-old Lucy Hall had her first go at clay shooting. The same year she wrote down that her ambition was to win an Olympic Gold Medal... in clay shooting. Fast forward to the present day and 19-year-old Lucy has made great strides towards making that goal a reality. At the 2022 European Championships she won a Silver medal and with this also earned GB a quota place for the Paris Olympics and finished the year ranked 12th in the world for Olympic Trap (OT).

And you don't have to look too far to discover where she got her inspiration from, because Lucy's father is Rob Hall, who won the English Open DTL in 2022 after a few years of not shooting. Rob is a farmer who also owns The Gun Room, Yorkshire, and runs East Yorkshire Clay Shooting Ground, so shooting really is in her blood. Indeed, clay shooting is Lucy's passion, but her success thus far has been built on very solid foundations.

OLYMPIC TRAP AND COMPETING FOR GB

In 2015 Lucy started on her journey in Olympic Trap. Having tried OT a couple of times at Beverley Clay Target Centre (now East Yorkshire Clay Shooting Ground), late in 2015 Lucy went to a British Shooting Talent ID day, a follow-up assessment day, and was subsequently invited to join the Talent Pathway group for OT. In 2016 OT training days were combined with competing in DTL, ABT and UT. Then in 2017, Lucy competed for GB in UT and in August 2017 got her first GB cap for OT and competed

at the Junior World Cup in Porpetto, Italy. Since then, training and competing have continued, with Rob taking on the role of personal coach as they worked with British Shooting and built a support team around Lucy as she focused on her Olympic aspirations. Fast forward to 2021 and Lucy took Gold at the Junior Women's event as well as a team Bronze in the team event at the European Championship. The same year she gained her first England cap, competing in the OT Home International. And then in 2022 the great leap was taken and, while still eligible for the Junior

Women's category, Lucy opted to compete as a Senior woman. She collected a World Cup Bronze and two European Championships medals as well as that GB quota place for the Paris Olympics.

So it was fascinating to be able to ask her a few questions about the journey so far and the next steps.

Q IS SHOOTING YOUR ONLY JOB?

No, I finished an Extended Diploma in Sport this summer and now work in The Gun Room. It's a job I love, as it is all about helping customers and it's great to also help them find their perfect gun.

Q HOW DID YOU FIND IT WHEN YOU STARTED TRAINING AND COMPETING IN OLYMPIC TRAP?

Being part of the Pathway was key to starting to hone my skills in Olympic Trap. I learned lots along the way. I remember my first GB outing. I was so nervous, but I wasn't alone and there were a number of other new caps in the team. I had a great experience, and it couldn't have been a better introduction to the international OT scene.

Q WHAT HAS IT TAKEN TO GET THIS FAR?

It has taken a lot of work, a LOT of work. I am very driven and focused on my ultimate goal. There are no shortcuts and it takes work, blood sweat and tears. It is a persistent effort, each and every day. No one can prepare you for the leap from Junior to Senior competition, but I ▶

have relished the challenge as I focus on my goals. It's been a team effort – I've always worked with a coach, sometimes in the plural.

Q HOW OFTEN DO YOU TRAIN?

Depending on the time of year, I train three or four times a week on the shooting range. I also do gym and fitness work, and it all contributes to ensuring I am fully prepared for competing.

Q YOUR BIGGEST SUPPORT?

There are so many people who have supported me along the way, but my greatest support comes from my family. Without them I wouldn't be able to do my sport. They have all given up so much. My sister, Georgina, deserves so much credit for what she has done and continues to do. Mum is the brains and keeps everything together and Dad spends so much time with me on the range. It is my dream but they are such a part of it – it's a shared dream that we

are all working on becoming a reality. With dad we work as a team. We are both perfectionists and it's all about getting every aspect of the technique right and being well organised.

Q FAVOURITE SHOOTING MEMORY?

Shooting DTL on a squad with dad and granddad at a local ground when dad shot 100/300. I am very lucky to have dad and grandad as role models in life as well as in shooting. Grandad is gone now but continues to inspire me.

Q FAVOURITE GB MEMORY?

Winning the quota place at the 2022 European Championships. It was a great trip, one that I will always remember.

Q HOW DID IT FEEL TO REPRESENT ENGLAND AT THE OT HOME INTERNATIONAL?

It's an honour to shoot for England. I felt very proud to wear the badge.

Q ADVICE TO ANYONE WITH SIMILAR ASPIRATIONS IN SHOOTING OR OTHER SPORTS?

You can't do it alone. You need a team. Your team might be big or small, but you need someone to work with, to help guide you. Also there's no substitute for hard work. The main thing is to keep moving forward – keep learning and working. Things come to those who work hard.

Q SPORTING HERO?

Apart from my dad (obviously), Serena Williams is awesome – I admire her determination and pure grit.

Q IF YOU WEREN'T INTO CLAY SHOOTING?

I would be a schoolteacher.

Q WHAT'S IN STORE FOR THE NEXT WEEKS/MONTHS/YEARS?

I'm currently making plans for competitions on the road to Paris. Further ahead I want to compete for years to come and even after competing I envisage I will always be involved in the sport in some way.

Q IS THERE ANYONE TO THANK?

I would really like to thank my sponsors – Beretta, GMK, Eley Hawk, Manuel Ricardo, Pilla, Tagami, Promatic Traps and Corsivia. I also want to give a massive thank you to British Shooting, UK Sport, and the National Lottery.

HOW I STARTED SHOOTING

I have been surrounded by shooting from a very young age and I used to travel around Registered competitions watching my dad shoot. After a few years, I wanted to try it for myself and hit my first clay with a single barrel .410 at the age of 9. I really enjoyed it, so after a few months of shooting I went to see Phillip Thorrolf for some lessons. I loved it and always came away with a huge grin on my face. I soon started competing in Registered Sporting competitions and have not looked back since.

I only shot the discipline of English Sporting when I first started so since then, I have kept this as my main discipline but also enjoy Sportrap and Compak competitions. I take part in ESK competitions but mainly do it as practice as it gets you to focus on the target and keep your concentration throughout the layout.

I am 15 now and have one final year left in the Colts category – this year I plan to shoot many new competitions like the World English Sporting Championship in July. ▶

EMILY'S TOP TIPS

TIP 1 Always focus on your own shooting and not on others around you.

TIP 2 Keep your set up simple – find a gun and cartridge you like and stick with it.

TIP 3 Don't get annoyed when you miss a target and just focus on the next clay.

TIP 4 Find a coach who you get along with and work well with to help you improve your shooting.

TIP 5 Shoot at hard targets in practice so when you go to competition, you are never phased by any targets.

EQUIPMENT


My coat would be my favourite piece of equipment as I generally shoot through the winter periods that can have terrible weather patterns. I always carry it with me so I can be prepared for changes in weather on the day of competing.

Over the last few years, the hardest piece equipment to get right would be the gun itself. Since I started, I have grown a lot taller, and my results have suffered in the past when I had padded foam on my gun stock. My coach Phillip had to constantly adjust it every school holiday when I went and had lessons with him.

SUPPORT AND SPONSORSHIP

I am lucky to have the support of my family, and of my coach Philip Thorrold who has coached me in his academy since 2017. Barrow Sporting Clays have also helped me out massively by sponsoring my entries whenever I shoot there. I would also like to thank the Essex Shooting Ground for sponsoring clays whenever I practice there. Without their support I wouldn't have achieved what I have in the few years I've been shooting. There are also many people who have helped me along the way. Those people know who they are so I would like to thank you!

GUN AND AMMUNITION

Currently I am shooting a 12G Nikko skeet gun with a left-handed adjustable stock and 28-inch barrels. The gun came with Teague chokes which I generally keep as $\frac{1}{4}$ $\frac{1}{4}$, unless there is a monster target that needs a tighter pattern. Since I moved from a 28G to a 12G, in 2020, I've always shot 21g Eley Select cartridges through my gun as they have little recoil and work well for me. I plan to move onto 24g Eley Select this year.

BIGGEST ACHIEVEMENTS

My favourite shooting moment was when I shot my personal best of 83/100 at a Registered competition. I was so happy with the result as I also won my class and couldn't stop talking on the car ride home!

My biggest achievement would be that I managed to retain winning the English Open Sporting Ladies Colts category in 2022 at High Lodge. Last year was also a year I decided to expand into doing more Sporttrap and went on to win the Ladies Colts category at the English and British Open Sporttrap.

The British Open Sporting at Barbury was also such a cool experience last year, as I qualified in my class for the Sunday and came in second in the Ladies Colts category behind Fern Lancaster. We have competed against each other in most major Sporting championships and have become good friends since we first competed in the British Open in 2021.

The 34-year-old from Suffolk achieved her CPSA Level 3 Senior Coach qualification in September, making her one of the first female Coaches to hold that title, adding it to the long list of other coaching, refereeing, and loading credentials she has achieved in recent years.

The former competitive freestyle skier grew up in a shooting family – her parents are both keen clay shots – and she made the most of her experience and abilities during her time in further education. Ali was a member of The Royal Agricultural College shooting team between 2009- 2011 and was even named a BUCS National Champion during her first year.

A SMILE ON THEIR FACES

After graduating with a degree in Agriculture and Farm Management, Ali worked in marketing and set up her own lifestyle brand, Young & Country, before joining Fennes Shooting School in 2016. It was there, under the mentorship of Tracey Riddington, that her coaching journey began. "Tracey

encouraged me to become a coach from day one," says Ali. "I started taking novices out on lessons and everyone left with a smile on their face; I was hooked on coaching from that moment on."

Ali describes her coaching style as 'very relaxed' and talks with great enthusiasm about putting people at ease – no easy task given the broad level of experience she encounters within her client base. "I learned a lot about the client's experience during a lesson while I was at Fennes," explains Ali. "With novices, it's about making sure that they get the bug and want to come back. With the more experienced shots, it's about showing them how to take the next step and, if they have them, making their dreams of entering competitions a reality."

Ali became the manager at Fennes following Tracey's retirement, remaining in post until the summer of 2020. The enforced closure of the shooting school during the pandemic gave her a chance to reflect on what she had achieved and her ambitions for the future. Ali had always wanted to run her own business and decided to become a coach to clients across East Anglia.



FINDING THE RIGHT WORDS

Adamant she would "be the best possible coach she could be" she asserts that good communication between coach and client is a key part of achieving that aim. For Ali, it's important to have a good relationship with clients, not least to make them comfortable about expressing how they are feeling when they are in the stand. It's not necessarily what you say, but how you say it, that matters. "Every individual should be coached in an individual manner. Part of a coach's role is to understand the rate at which the client can develop, but also, the language they respond to best. There are 100 ways to say the same thing and you've got to be adaptable. As clients become more experienced, their shooting becomes more psychological and that can throw up new barriers. So much of shooting is about the right mindset."

For Ali, there is so much more to a lesson than just pulling the trigger. Hers is not a results-based approach where the hour is judged purely on the number of clays dusted. Of course, there has to be progress, a new marker laid down for the next lesson, but not at the expense of the client feeling like they are being ushered away from their comfort zone too soon. "I have a list of things I want to find out about my clients, a kind

of internal questionnaire," explains Ali. "I like to go out on the ground and sit down for ten minutes just talking about what we're going to be doing during the lesson, finding out what the client wants to achieve – their short, medium, and long-term goals – and for them to know that those goals are flexible, especially if things aren't going according to plan.

"I want to make sure that when we've finished the lesson the client really understands what changes we've made to their technique. Not just where they've missed but understanding the fundamentals as to why they have missed, so that when they miss a clay when we aren't together, they better understand the cause and know how to put it right."

A FRESH APPROACH

Seeing how her clients have developed under her tutelage continues to give Ali great satisfaction, especially when she can see her advice has been taken on board and used as a building block. Getting clients to feel comfortable in their own skin, to own mistakes and take charge of their development is quite intentional. "It's important that a coach doesn't try to make their client shoot the same way they would," explains Ali. "Everyone learns in different ways and there are no rules to how ▶

off them, get them to step outside the stand, turn around in a circle, touch their toes, then get back into the stand and carry on – that simple exercise can really help to clear someone’s mind.”

EXCITING TIMES AHEAD

As well as coaching clients at schools across East Anglia, Ali coaches Olympic disciplines with the Cambridge University shooting team, working with Richard Wilson and Colin Burrows to develop

fast you should progress or the technique you should be using. Many techniques can be used to teach someone how to shoot, and it’s about encouraging the client to use the correct technique for them. The coach has to be encouraging, even when their client misses an easy clay, because everyone misses the easy ones and it’s down to a simple lapse in concentration.”

Ali’s solution to getting a series of misses out of her clients’ heads is a novel one. “An important part of being a coach is knowing when a client is struggling and taking them out of that environment. The easiest thing to do is to take the gun

a pathway into competitive shooting which has already seen hundreds of students sign up. Ali also has ambitions to work with British Shooting and hopes to one day be a CPSA coaches’ tutor.

While rightly proud of her achievements, Ali admits she doesn’t want to be one of very few female CPSA Level 3 Senior Coaches for very long. In her view, women’s shooting, like women’s sport in general, is in really good health at the moment, but she hints that there is no time for complacency. Individuals including Cheryl Hall and Amber Hill show what female shots can do on and off the stand, while organisations such as The Shotgun & Chelsea Bun Club and the Smoking Barrels Girls Club are key to making nervous newcomers feel welcome. Ali sees great benefit in those supportive environments, even offering lessons at her home farm, where clients are free to learn, laugh, and even cry without feeling judged. She also wants to use her position to encourage other women to start their coaching journey and is looking forward to welcoming more female Level 3 coaches in the near future.

“It would be great to have a community of female Level 3 coaches,” explains Ali. “I am really hopeful about the future. Just think about what we could do together. I want to make Level 3 more desirable, to get more women to start their journey and feel like nothing can stop them: because nothing can.”

We spoke to **John Hartog** of Sporting Targets to discover more about the ground's evolution, since opening in 1989.



Q When did the ground open and what makes it special?

A: Sporting Targets offers a large volume of targets (170 traps) including three towers at 120', 110' and 60. The ground was opened in 1989 and was an evolution of a smaller Clay Shoot, operated by the Clifton family. It was father and son team, Ian and Andrew, who set the Sporting Targets ground up as we see it today. Andrew became Managing Director

of Sporting Targets Limited in December 1995 and continues to play a major role in leading his team and the ground.

Q What disciplines/facilities/events do you offer around the grounds?

Q Have you won any awards and accreditations over the years?

A: Sporting Targets has the CPSA Grounds Premier Plus Status, and has featured many times in the 'Ground of the Year' awards. We have

Q How has the ground developed over the years?



PAUL CHAPMAN PAST ABT ENGLAND TEAM MANAGER

I hugely enjoyed my time as England ABT Team Manager and was grateful to receive significant support from the shooters themselves – as I had been away from clay shooting for some time prior to taking up the position their initial reaction was, quite understandably, ‘who the heck is this guy?’ but to a person they were friendly and welcoming, something which the ABT fraternity is particularly known for.

RIZZINI BR460 EL

GUN - REVIEW -

Mark Brown reviews the flagship competition gun from the Italian manufacturer Rizzini, the BR460 EL Sporting

RIZZINI BR460 EL

£7,700 | a-s-i.co.uk

The EL in the BR460 EL Sporting from Rizzini stands for Extra Lusso or "Extra Luxury" but what we want to know is does this gun really deliver that?

Initial impressions are very good, there is no bog-standard ABS case here but a very stylish and unique looking motor case trimmed with leather on the outside and plush velvet on the inside. I don't think I have seen such a well presented (supplied as standard) case in all of the guns that I have reviewed for the magazine. Opening the case things just keep getting better. The stock is a wonderfully figured piece of Turkish walnut and classed as Grade 3 but was beautiful to look at and treated with a luxurious traditional oil finish. I always find the grading of wood

by gun makers a bit of an enigma, to my mind grade 3 would be mediocre but the wood on this gun was very far from that. If you do find that this woodwork isn't pretty enough for you then you can opt to upgrade to grade 4 woodwork and choose your wood from a selection of blanks. The fine figuring also ran through to the fore-end it was nice to see that quality throughout the gun.

The engraving on the BR460 EL is an acanthus style scroll engraving that has quite a deep relief. That is because although it is lasered at the beginning of the process it is then finished by hand. This makes all the difference to how it looks and is reflected in the price of the gun. It is very prominent on both sides of the action and on the underside along with the model number of the gun and a crest style design. Another notable feature on



smooth and considered and shooting was effortless, and I just could not seem to miss which is highly unusual!

One interesting feature on the gun was the barrel selector which did take a few moments to find as it sits just behind the trigger at the rear of the trigger guard. Once found it was easy to use and is actually in a very logical position. As is typical on competition guns the stock features a pistol grip design with palm swell and was very comfortable in use. The checkering was crisp and well cut as you would expect from a gun at this price point.

In conclusion, we didn't like the BR460 EL we absolutely loved it. It's been

a long time since a gun has ticked so many boxes. It's a beautiful gun and a dream to shoot and I'm convinced that my scores would increase dramatically if I owned one. Given where it sits in the market it is well priced and worthy of strong consideration when making your next purchase. My advice is buy it now. 🎉

the gun is the action which is based on a Boss style action and locking mechanism and I loved the way that it operates and feels in the hand – a very nice feature and one that will also ensure longevity of the gun too.

So, on to shooting. The test gun was the 30" barrel version with 1" extended colour coded multi chokes, detachable and adjustable trigger unit, ventilated barrels and rib and 3" chambers. On handling the gun for the first time the most apparent feature is just how well balanced it is, perfectly pointable and instantly comfortable. The 12 mm wide rib at the breech gives a perfect view of any target and the narrowing to 8mm

at the muzzle end ensures easy target acquisition. There are some guns you do just naturally click with, the BR460 EL is one of those and not only for me. I can't think of many occasions where Guy (our trusty photographer)

and I have ever unanimously agreed that we loved a gun and then both shot perfectly with it.

The gun weighs in at 9lbs and I think this is what makes it so good to shoot, normally I would find a 30" barrel gun too light and flashy but the BR460 EL is weighted so well that it does not have that issue. On low crossers it moved quickly enough even on the speediest of targets yet on high driven targets it was

MEDICALS MATTER

CEO of MedCert Ltd **Daryn Hufton-Rees** clears up some confusion about the medical check for your firearms licence.

There is an awful lot of confusion about the medical requirements for licensing at the moment. There are any number of scary tales on forums and “my mate knows this chap” stories being told wherein the individual, through absolutely no fault of their own, has had their guns removed and their licence revoked. Sadly these tales can often provide misleading lessons for those looking to preserve their own licences, and has given rise to a number of myths about medical verification reports.

The first myth to put to bed is that this process is new. The physical piece of paper, the proforma, is new and the timings are different, but the questions remain the same and the requirement for the individual to declare any relevant medical conditions is as important as ever. The main timing change is that whereas in previous years the individual would make application and the firearms licensing unit would then approach the GP for a confirmation of the information

that the person had placed on their application, this confirmation must now be submitted with the rest of the applicant's paperwork.

As stated, this is nothing particularly new, and certainly not a system designed to remove guns from the individual or to specifically create income for the GPs. That said, a number of GPs have seen this as an opportunity to charge preposterous fees for the work done.

Completing a medical proforma falls into the category of private medicine, and because of this the individual surgery or GP may choose not to do the work, or to charge whatever fee they wish. Based on anecdotal evidence we estimate the average surgery fee to be £250, although the highest fee that we are aware of is £795 – more than the price of many new guns! I should however point out that there are still a number of surgeries who do this work efficiently and at a reasonable price.

The second myth revolves around revocations. Revocations are certainly taking place across the country, but contrary to many rumours the vast majority of these are due to the individuals themselves failing to report notifiable conditions on their original grants or subsequent renewals.

One of the most common questions we're asked is 'which conditions will stop an applicant being granted a licence?'. The short answer is: none. The medical proforma is an objective, opinion-free summary of an applicant's medical history and firearms licensing use this as one of the many pieces of information they review when assessing an applicant's suitability. Everyone goes through hard times in life and past

episodes, or current conditions which are well managed, are not a barrier to being granted a licence. What is a barrier to being granted a licence, however, is being found to have omitted details of relevant medical conditions on previous application forms or during the term of the licence.

There are, of course, nuances to this – in all the many thousands of proformas we have done we are not aware that the police have revoked for minor discrepancies. On occasion, a patient may have been diagnosed with low mood and not been informed, had a note placed on their record as an aside or been prescribed a drug without knowing it is an antidepressant and therefore do not tick the relevant boxes on their licence application in all good faith. We have, however, come across a number of very serious health issues which have been hidden from the FLUs, and I, for one, would hate to think that any of those individuals were standing on a peg next to me.

I cannot stress enough how much honesty is the best policy. Not only is it a requirement for all licence holders to be of good character, but trying to circumvent the system by omitting medical information or attempting to forge either your medical records or your proforma will result in serious consequences for both you and the shooting community as a whole. You might be surprised by how quickly forgery can be detected.

Most importantly, if you are suffering with a condition that needs treatment then you should never defer, avoid or cease treatment because you believe it will affect your licence.

The last point of confusion is around the appropriate point to request and submit a medical proforma. The requirement is that you submit your completed proforma along with the rest of your application paperwork, and that this should be at least eight weeks prior to your expiry date. As such, please be aware that you should start the process of getting the proforma approximately

five months before the ticket runs out. This is to give you plenty of time to check to see if your surgery actually do the necessary medical checks, to check the cost of those checks and to find a third-party, such as Medcert, if your surgery cannot fulfil your request or charge too much. Some FLUs are changing their 16 week reminder letter to be 24 weeks or longer, to give applicants time to get their paperwork together.

Whilst the new timings of the medical proforma may be causing some issues, by the very nature of the cycle of licensing these will lessen. Some of the early FLU adopters of the proforma are well over halfway through the five-year cycle and even the latest are approaching their first anniversary.



I thought I'd begin this year with a round up of 2022. The county worked to enable the widest possible range of competitions to take place and only the OT competition was not held. Dave Grant-Innes, Mick Russell, and Penny Spademan were Supreme Champions in their categories. There was a total of 189 entries and 74 competitors in the county championships – an increase on 2021. Welcome to all the new competitors, I hope that you enjoyed the experience and continue to compete in 2023.

In 2022 the county introduced an incentive to those who do not usually enter competitions to give it a go. Prizes were offered in Sporting, Sportrap, Skeet, and All Round. The prize was awarded to the shooter whose score was the nearest to a random score anywhere between one and 100. Three of the four prize winners were new to county discipline competition. This was very popular as it favoured the B and C Class shooters. The county also offered all Junior and Colt shooters free entry into county championship competitions. Two Junior shooters entered competitions but



there were no Colt shooters this year.

The county repeated the Christmas Draw and £600 was raised. This was shared between Northamptonshire Wildlife Trust and Animals in Need based in Irchester.

In the Regional Inter-County competition, the county fielded teams for Skeet and Sporting, and accrued a total score of 11 coming second to last. The county fielded teams for four disciplines in the National Inter-County competitions, Skeet Sporting, All Round, and DTL. In DTL the Ladies were Runners-up and the Senior team won the All Round competition. Thank you to all shooters who represented Northamptonshire in 2021.

County shooters took part in regional individual competitions. Kirstin Vogel won the Ladies category in the All Round. Karl Taylor and Laurie Cookson were Runner-up in Senior and Veteran categories, and Dave Morgan and Penny Spademan were third Overall in Senior and Lady categories. Jo Smith was third Overall in the FITASC competition, and Sonny Bowman was Runner-up in the Skeet and Skeet Doubles competition.

At national level, county shooters won the following competitions – Dave Morgan Senior EO All Round, Henry Collins third Overall BO All Round, Neil Faulkner Veteran High Gun EO Skeet Doubles, Sonny Bowman third Junior Skeet Doubles and Junior High Gun in the EO Skeet, and Sue Bate third in the Ladies EO ABT.

Andrew Lea Olympic Skeet, and Sue Bate ABT, won medals in home International competitions.

Congratulations to all county shooters for their success in 2022.

At the county AGM this year, John Martin reported that Northants has 389 members – 152 Full, 127 Veteran, seven Junior, and one Colt. I make it that there are then 102 clubman members. He described that nationally there is a three-year turnover mainly in the clubman category and about 30% of members enter competitive shooting. He outlined that there has been no decision about changes in legislation the lead/steel in discussions held by DEFRA. He also said that CPSA HQ is mindful of the increase in costs and wherever possible major championships will be held in the East and West Midlands to cut down on travel. He also said that increased costs would not be passed on to members.

The 2023 fixtures have been arranged and published on the website and Facebook. If You're In: You May Win is being repeated this year so there will be more reason to enter the competitions. I may have a go myself! Happy Shooting!



In the last few years, the club has purchased more land and now has a new full size road in. 



OBITUARIES



FREDERICK DAVID THORNLEY 1950 – 2023

Fred was born to dairy farmers Fred and Joan Thornley in Bolton on 28 June 1950. Brother to Phyllis and Chris, he was known as Freddie for most of his childhood. In his teens Fred moved to Smiths Green Farm in Lower Withington. As a child Fred kept busy driving the tractor, fetching the cows for milking and hay making from an early age. His shooting life started when he was aged 8 and he started systematically pestering his mother for an air rifle. She finally gave in when Fred was 10 (and she was no pushover!). When Fred was 18 he went off to college but he came home

regularly to go clay pigeon shooting and was a very regular winner. In 1969 when he was 19, he won the Lower Withington Cup (for the third time), the Rotary Club Cup, and both classes at another local shoot. Then aged 21 he found a good job in the computer world and became known as 'David' to his work colleagues and friends. Shortly after this he launched his own computer installation business, which he ran successfully for over 40 years. David did a lot of shooting in the 1970s winning a Rolex watch in Sealand at the famous Rolex Cup, and several guns over the years. In 1979 he met his wife, Dawn, whilst she was working at her Father Bill Pedley's, shooting ground called Cloudford.

They married the following year and Dawn moved to live with David in Sedgley where he was currently working. He would still often travel to Cloudford SG, Sealand SG and East Yorkshire SG. Their first son, Dan, was born in May 1972, followed by Josh in April 1989.

David enjoyed family holidays, especially Cyprus and on a couple of occasions David entered the Cyprus Grand Prix, which resulted in him winning large cups. David's shooting took a back seat whilst bringing up young children, but in 2010 he took up shooting seriously again.

David shot several times in the GB Universal Trench Team with great success. He won the 2010 World Championship Veterans Gold Medal and title, in Rome, with a score of 186/200. In 2016 at the UT European Championship in Hungary he was a part of the Bronze winning GB team.

He also shot for England in the Olympic Trap team. Over the years he shot many times for both the England Team and the Cheshire County Team. In 2019 he had the honour of Captaining the winning England OT Team in the Home International Championships, and the following weekend he was also the winning captain of Cheshire County Team.

Being a committed OT shooter David gained his ISSF coaching license and took a few very promising young shooters under his wing. David was exceptionally proud of his two sons and his world changed with the arrival of his three granddaughters Daisy, Georgia and Molly, he was often seen transporting one or more of them in a wheelbarrow across his fields followed by a Springer Spaniel and two cats.

He passed away peacefully following a short illness aged 72. He will be very much missed by all who knew him. He left home for the very last time accompanied by a shotgun salute all along the lane, from his friends and family.

Eric Dusty Miller passed away at the age of 94 on 7 January 2023. Eric represented Suffolk and England, winning many CPSA titles during his lifetime, and competed most weekends on the circuit during his earlier years.

It is with great sadness I have to pass on the news of the passing of Arthur Charles Poulton on 12 Dec following a heart operation.

A Devon shooter who served on both the Devon and South West committees and with a passion for FITASC, he will be missed by his many friends. Arthur had many interests in his life, as well as being a keen shot he was also, in his younger days, a competent Greco Roman wrestler, and a sidecar passenger in the Isle of Man TT races with many an entertaining story to tell in his own manner. Our thoughts go out to his wife Pat who was also a shooter and to Tracey his daughter. Rest in peace, mate.



COMMITTEE CHAMPION



We spoke to South East Secretary **Jo Watson-Hopkinson** about her role within the committee and shooting life.

Q How did you get into shooting?

I've only been shooting for about nine years. My husband used to shoot with his father as a teenager then about 12 years ago his father had to give up his shotguns due to ill health. My husband got his license so he could keep the guns – mostly for sentimental reasons – and a couple of years later he convinced me to go with him on a game shoot. I had such a good time we decided to go to our local ground, Bisley Shooting Ground, and I now use his father's Beretta which is nearly as old as me!

Q What are your preferred disciplines?

When I volunteered to join the Surrey CPSA committee with a few friends in 2017, we decided to try all the disciplines as up until then I had only tried ESP and ESK. I am lucky to be only 20 minutes from the National Clay Shooting Centre and the team, headed up by Oli Jones, are always very helpful and have great facilities for Trap and Skeet.

I don't shoot FITASC and OSK as both are shot gun down and I don't seem to be able to do so without smashing myself in the face!

My favourite discipline is Helice. One of the other Surrey committee members is a keen Helice shooter and has shot for the GB team numerous times. Steve Cole explained what it was all about and off we went to Invicta to try it out. Helice is a bit different, a sort of mix between Sporting

and Trap, but is brilliant and all the people who shoot Helice are lovely. There is only one main ground left in England now so we are limited to how much we can shoot, but Chris Potter and the team at Invicta are great hosts and run fantastic competitions.

Q Can you tell us about your greatest success?

The greatest success I have had is in Helice, where I have made the GB team several

times. 2022 was a great year in which I achieved an individual Silver in the European Championship, as well as a team Bronze. I then represented GB in the World Championship alongside

Dionne Rogers and Liz

Mulliner. We won the team Gold which was amazing. Dionne is a great inspiration, having won a significant number of medals in both European and World Helice Championships.

I was elected as Secretary and have now been doing this for nearly two years.

Q What is your role within the CPSA South East Region Committee and how did you come to be involved?

Having been on the Surrey Committee for several years and getting to know Sandie Buckler, who was the Secretary on the South-East Regional Committee for 38 years, when she decided it was "time to hang up my spurs" she asked if I would put myself forward for election. I was elected as

Secretary and have now been doing this for nearly two years.

Q What sort of work does this include?

We have 23 competitions to organise at a county level which doesn't sound like much, but along with the 15 Surrey County shoots, National and International competitions, English and GB Selection shoots it takes a lot of effort to minimise conflicts. We are really lucky to have some great clubs in the region who go above and beyond in helping with the scheduling. I keep the website up-to-date as well as posting events and results on Facebook and organising our quarterly meetings and the AGM. The events then need to be organised – badges, making sure trophies are available and capturing the results. For the Inter-County events all the teams need to be entered and score sheets created. I am lucky that the other committee members help with the events – Dominic Cherry, as well as being a great Treasurer is also keen on Trap so usually covers those, and Richard Weller helps with the Sporting events, so it really is a team effort.

Q What would you say to somebody who is interested in getting involved with their local committee?

Just do it – find out who is part of the committee in your county and raise your hand – most of the committees I know are always looking for people to get involved and bring new ideas and support. In some counties they have really struggled to find enough people to form a committee and there is quite a lot to do with organising events, keeping people informed and organising teams so any help is always appreciated.

Q Is there anything else you would like to add?

I would just like to thank all the clubs for supporting the South East Region events and to all the people who attend our competitions.


