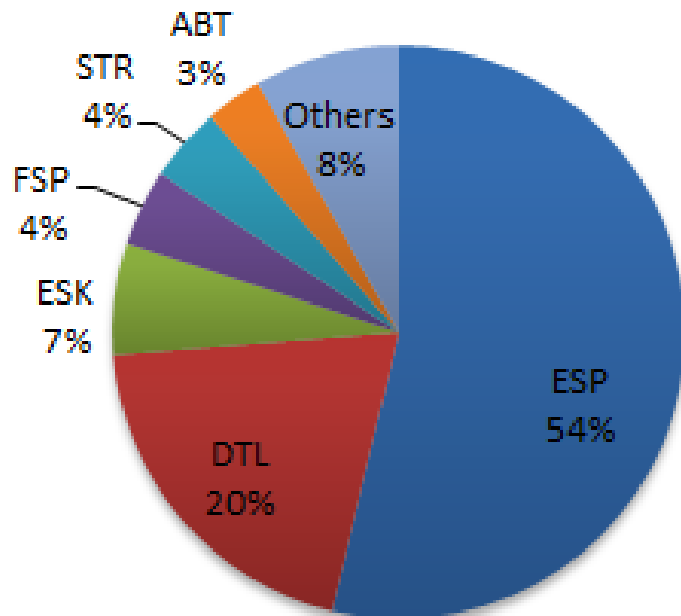

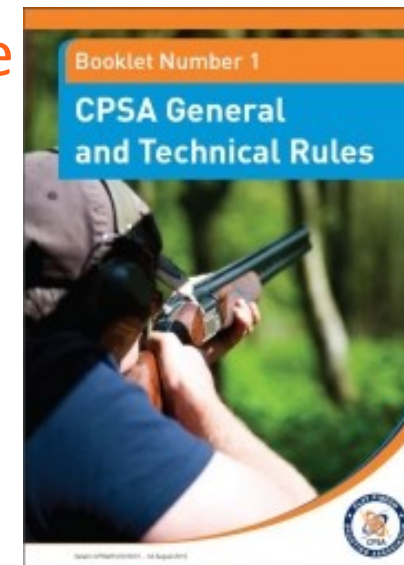

ICTSC team sizes
In 2015 there will be some changes to the teams for the Home Internationals. The ICTSC voted at its meeting in November to introduce a Super Veteran category at all Home International events from 2015. Veteran category will see an age reduction to 55 years and Super Veteran will commence at 65 years, both with age point as January 1. In someone having their 55th birthday on December 30, 2014 will be classed as a Veteran for 2015, whereas someone having their 56th birthday on January 2, 2015, will be classed as a Senior for 2015.

A STAND-OUT YOUNG SHOT

I started shooting when I was 11, but a friend suggested I go to the young shot days at NCS. I wanted to improve my technique and meet other young shooters. David says that my shooting ability stood out from the crowd. "He is an instinctive shot and has a great attitude towards learning new techniques. He is always very composed."

The first time I shot Olympic Skeet I was hooked. It's a very fast discipline, requires full concentration and is an exciting competitive sport. My proudest moment so far has been shooting for the Surrey team and becoming Club Champion at the South East Region let-a-counties in the summer of 2015. Hitting my first 25 ex 25 on this year's Regional Pathway was also a special moment.

I've found that shooting is a very sociable and friendly sport. It has been a great leveler to meet other people of all ages and abilities. I have also found David Dale and Allen Warren have been incredibly friendly and encouraging coaches, and it is a pleasure to spend time working with them.

Training takes a lot of commitment. I am fortunate that my school, Seaford College, releases me every Tuesday after school to train at Bisley and I also practice at the weekend. I work with David as much as possible and I'm starting to increase my competition experience and aim to shoot at the leading grounds around the UK during school holidays. I also plan to compete overseas in 2016 to gain broader experience.

I would like to continue on the England Talent Pathway next year and shoot in more competitions. I think shooting will always be a very important part of my life and it would be an honour to represent GB if I get the opportunity.

Richard Worthington, CPSA National Development Manager, added: "I first met Charles a few years ago at one of our Young Shots Days at NCS and it was obvious at the time that he had the desire and enthusiasm to progress his shooting, so it is really excellent to see that he has made it onto the Talent Pathway. We wish him every success for the future."

World Class Programme athletes announced

The athletes will be working towards success at the Rio 2016 Olympics, as well as Tokyo and beyond

TALENT PATHWAY

BRITISH SHOOTING HAS a vision to be the world leading shooting nation and the focus over the next 10 months will inevitably be on delivering great success in Rio. However, the newly established and evolving GB Academy Programme is also seeing the emergence of talent demonstrating high medal potential for Tokyo 2020 and beyond.

British Shooting's performance group uses set criteria when selecting athletes onto the WCP (funded by UK Sport and the UK National Lottery), using objective evidence and their expert views to compile the group of top performers in the country as well as future potential. The athletes named onto the WCP are separated into three distinct levels: podium, podium potential and GB

Academy Programme. They are Amber Hill, Ed Ling, Elena Allen, Steve Scott and Tim Kneale (podium) and Jen McIntosh (podium potential).

Steven Seligman, Performance Director for British Shooting, said: "I would like to congratulate all the athletes named. They have demonstrated the potential to fulfil their Olympic aspirations at Rio, Tokyo and beyond. We are entering a very exciting stage in the development of the British Shooting World Class Programme as we continue to develop a world leading system that delivers world leading performances."

As well as announcing the athletes selected for podium and podium potential places, British Shooting also revealed the 23 shooters given a place on the world leading GB Academy Programme, who have shown real potential for delivering success on the world stage in the future.

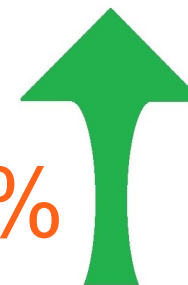

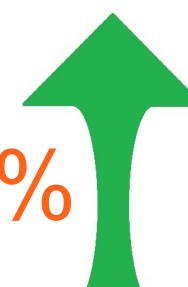
